REVIEW ACTIVITIES

Applications

The Agency received 195 applications in the fourth quarter of 1981, an increase from 181 in the third quarter. The increase occurred in both acquisition and new business applications, and mainly in the manufacturing sector.

Acquisitions

After a decrease to 80 in the third quarter, the number of acquisition applications returned to the second quarter level of 88. Despite the increase in the number of applications, however, the total asset value declined to \$583.3 million during the quarter, the lowest level reported in 1981. Fifty-seven percent of the applications involved assets of less than \$2 million, and 78 percent involved firms with fewer than 100 employees. The service sector attracted 56 percent of the applications, and the manufacturing sector 38 percent. Fifty-three percent of the proposals came from U.S. investors and 52 percent involved investments in Ontario.

New Businesses

The number of new business proposals increased to 107 in the fourth quarter from 101 in the third. The manufacturing sector attracted 32 percent of the applications, the primary sector 4 percent, and services 64 percent. Of the new business applications, 94 percent involved fewer than 100 employees, and 93 percent involved assets of less than \$2 million. As with acquisitions, most proposals (60 percent) came from U.S. investors and most (55 percent) involved investments in Ontario.

Resolved Cases

In the fourth quarter the number of cases resolved rose to 216 from 160 in the previous quarter. Of the 216 cases resolved, 162 were allowed, 24 were disallowed, and 30 were withdrawn by the applicant before a decision was reached.

Acquisitions

The number of resolved acquisition cases increased from 75 in the third quarter to 99 in the fourth quarter. During the quarter 81 cases were allowed, 7 were disallowed, and 11 were withdrawn, for one reason or another, by the applicant before a decision was reached.

Among those allowed by the Government during the fourth quarter was the proposal by Alsthom-Atlantique of Paris, France, a French limited company which is controlled by the Compagnie générale d'Electricité, also of Paris, France, to acquire 35 percent of the common stock of Marine Industrie Limitée (MIL), of Sorel-Tracy, Quebec, a business which was previously wholly owned by the Société Générale de Financement, a Quebec Crown corporation. MIL is engaged mainly in the repair and construction of ships, the manufacture of railway freight cars and the production and installation of heavy-duty hydro power equipment. There will be a massive technological input from the minority shareholder, especially in the fields of electromechanics and power installations. The minority shareholder will also contribute proportionately to the financing of future projects of MIL. The technical and financial input from Alsthom should ensure the implementation of MIL's strategic plan which will require investments of more than \$80 million. As a result, several hundred persons will continue to be employed or will be newly hired in Canada. Planned expenditures include about \$6 million for the opening of a hydraulic laboratory and \$0.5 million for the upgrading of facilities of the existing soldering laboratory. The research and development program for 1982-86 will require annual operating expenditures of about \$1.6 million. This transaction consummates an association of nearly 15 years during which Alsthom-Atlantique has provided MIL with technology related to the manufacturing of specific water turbines, alternators and synchronous compensators.

New businesses

The number of new business cases resolved increased from 85 in the third to 117 in the fourth quarter. Of these, 81 were allowed, 17 were disallowed, and 19 were withdrawn by the applicant before a decision was reached.

One of the larger new business proposals allowed by the Government during the quarter was that of Fording Coal Limited of Calgary, Alberta, and Idemitsu Kosan Co. Ltd. of Tokyo, Japan, to establish a new joint venture in southern Alberta to be engaged in the exploration for, and the development and mining of, thermal coal. Fording is a Canadian company owned 60 percent by Canadian Pacific Enterprises Limited and 40 percent by Cominco Ltd., which is in turn largely owned by Canadian Pacific Enterprises. Idemitsu is one of Japan's principal refiners and distributors of oil. Fording will have an 80 percent interest in the new business and Idemitsu will have 20 percent. Fording and Idemitsu have undertaken to construct a mine capable of producing 900,000 short tons of clean coal per year, near Lethbridge in southern Alberta. In addition to bringing new investment to Canada, the project will contribute in a major way to employment, to Canada's merchandise exports, to increased resource processing and to the use of Canadian goods and services.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

Opinions

During the fourth quarter of 1981, the Minister renewed three eligibility opinions to the effect that Inco Limited, Waltec Enterprises Ltd., and Placer Development Limited continue to be eligible persons within the meaning of the Act.

<u>Surveillance</u>

During the fourth quarter of 1981, surveillance activity led to the initiation of 64 investigations of transactions which, on the face of it, appeared as if they might be reviewable. As a result, three notices were filed under the Act.

Enforcement

In accordance with established procedures for the regular monitoring of the implementation of plans and undertakings provided by investors whose applications have been allowed, 344 such cases were monitored during the quarter. In addition, 22 disallowed cases were monitored.

Legal proceedings

British Columbia Forest Products Limited (BCFP) and Western Forest Products Limited (Western) on November 2, 1981, made applications to the Federal Court of Canada, Trial Division, for declarations as to their status under the Act. whether eligible or non-eligible. The companies also sought, and on November 10, 1981 obtained, interim orders enjoining the Minister and the Commissioner from taking any action or steps pursuant to the Act against these companies in respect of certain investments made by them until such time as their status is determined by the court. These applications followed demands made pursuant to subsection 8(3) of the Foreign Investment Review Act requiring BCFP and Western to file notices of certain investments for review under the Act. The Government is defending the applications and has appealed the order granting interim injunctive relief to the Federal Court of Canada, Appeal Division. No date has been set for a hearing of either the applications or the appeal. On November 2, 1981 BCFP and Western also made applications to the Federal Court of Canada, Appeal Division, seeking a review of the decision of the Minister and the Commissioner to issue demands pursuant to the Act. No date has been fixed for the hearing of these applications.

As reported in the second quarter of 1981, criminal proceedings have been commenced by the Attorney General of Canada against Trio-Kenwood Canada Inc. for failure to file notice pursuant to a demand of the Minister. The

trial of this proceeding, originally scheduled for November 3, 1981, has been rescheduled to take place in the Provincial Court (Criminal Division) in Ottawa in March 1982.

Proceedings were commenced December 24, 1981 against Trio-Kenwood Canada Inc. and Trio-Kenwood Corporation in the Federal Court of Canada, Trial Division, on behalf of the Minister for such order as may be required in the circumstances to the end that their investment in Canada shall be rendered nugatory. This application is scheduled to be heard March 31, 1982.
