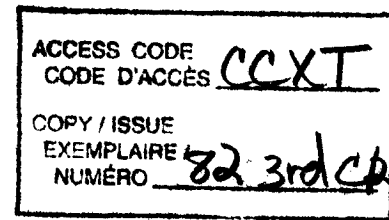
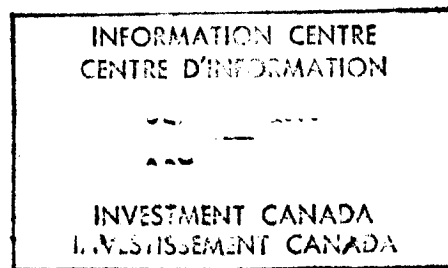

POLICY AND OTHER DEVELOPMENTS

The measures announced in June to streamline the administration of the Foreign Investment Review Act have already had a measurable effect. In the three months July to September, 310 cases were resolved, compared with just 133 cases resolved over the same period a year ago. In addition, the backlog of pending cases was halved, from 403 carried over at the end of September 1981 to 204 at the end of September 1982. These results suggest that the average time required per case has also been reduced.

Effective September 30, 1982, the Honourable Edward C. Lumley was appointed Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce and of Regional Economic Expansion, and therefore Minister responsible for the administration of the Foreign Investment Review Act. Mr. Lumley replaces the Honourable Herb Gray, who was named President of the Treasury Board. Mr. Lumley, who had been Minister of State (International Trade), has extensive experience in industry and in international consultations.

Also announced during the quarter was the appointment of a new Commissioner of the Agency. Robert L. Richardson replaced J.E. Gorse Howarth effective October 15, 1982. Mr. Howarth, who had been Commissioner for six of his eight years with the Agency, was named President of the Canadian Commercial Corporation. Mr. Richardson, a career public servant, was previously Deputy Secretary of the Programs Branch, Treasury Board Secretariat, where he most recently was on a special assignment related to administered prices under the Government's economic renewal program. Mr. Richardson spent 11 years in Canada's foreign service with the Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce and has served with the Public Service Commission and the Department of Finance.

REVIEW ACTIVITIES

Applications

The Agency received 235 applications during the third quarter of 1982, compared to 198 in the second quarter. The number of acquisition applications increased from 97 in the second quarter to 107 in the third, while new business applications increased from 101 to 128.

Acquisitions

Of the 107 acquisition applications received, 59 percent were from the United States and 32 percent were from Western Europe. More than half of the applications involved businesses in Ontario (56 percent), and the others involved principally Quebec (21 percent) and British Columbia (11 percent).

Services was the industrial sector most frequently involved in acquisition applications (55 percent), followed by manufacturing (42 percent). The total value of assets involved in the applications received in the third quarter was almost \$1.5 billion. Sixty-nine percent of the applications involved businesses with gross assets of less than \$5 million, and 86 percent involved businesses with fewer than 200 employees.

New businesses

Of the 128 new-business applications received in the third quarter, 55 percent were from the United States and 36 percent from Western Europe. Ontario drew 51 percent of the applications, Quebec 21 percent, and the western provinces 22 percent. Almost three quarters of the applications were in the services sector (74 percent), and 24 percent were in manufacturing. The total value of planned investment involved in the applications was more than \$675 million. Ninety-five percent of the applications involved new businesses with projected gross assets of less than \$5 million and 98 percent involved fewer than 200 employees.

Resolved cases

In the third quarter of 1982 the number of cases decided increased significantly to 310 from 194 in the previous quarter. The increase is even more remarkable when compared to the 133 cases decided in the third quarter of 1981 and 105 in the third quarter of 1980. This increase is largely attributable to the administrative changes in the review process that were announced in the June 28 budget and reported in the last issue of the Quarterly Report. Of the 310 cases decided during the quarter, 94 percent were allowed and 6 percent were disallowed.

Acquisitions

The number of acquisition cases decided rose to 163 in the third quarter from 91 in the second. This was over 2-1/2 times more than the 64 cases decided in the corresponding quarter of 1981. During the third quarter, 7 cases were withdrawn by the applicants before a decision was reached by Governor in Council. Of the cases decided, 97 percent were allowed and 3 percent were disallowed.

A July news release described in some detail an allowed proposal by The British Petroleum Company Limited of London, England, to acquire control of Selco Inc. of Toronto, Ontario, a subsidiary of Selection Trust Limited of the United Kingdom engaged in the exploration for and the production of minerals and the provision of exploration services and equipment to the mining industry. The acquisition is expected to be of significant benefit to Canada in terms of increased employment, new investment, exports, Canadian participation and technological development.

In support of its proposal The British Petroleum Company Limited undertook, among other things, to cause Selco to increase its exploration program from an annual average of \$3,235,000 to about \$7,000,000 per year in 1981 and 1982, and to maintain that level of expenditure through at least 1986, subject to normal competitive and commercial considerations. It also undertook to seek to have Selco's technical services and systems used in mining exploration ventures in which the BP group is engaged and to place no restraints on Selco with respect to exports. The British Petroleum Company Limited also undertook to achieve substantially increased Canadian ownership in the businesses and activities of Selco through a combination of increased equity and direct participation in projects.

Another allowed proposal, described in a September news release, was by The Prudential Insurance Company of America of Newark, New Jersey, U.S.A., to acquire control of Bache Halsey Stuart Canada Limited (Bache Canada) and Halsey Stuart Corporate Services Limited (Halsey), both of Toronto and both wholly owned subsidiaries of Bache Group Inc. of New York, New York, U.S.A. Bache Canada is engaged in financial activities including securities brokerage, trading, underwriting and distribution; customer financing; commodities futures and so on. Halsey is a business which owns the premises and equipment used by Bache Canada. The proposal is expected to bring a number of benefits to Canada. Bache Canada is to establish three new branch offices in Canada and create 30 jobs. In addition, Bache Canada will continue to provide to Canadian investors comprehensive services related to foreign securities, which are not substantially available from other sources, as found by the Ontario Securities Commission in its 1981 hearing into the continued registration of Bache Canada under the Ontario Securities Act. The change of control will also give Bache Canada greater autonomy in its management, provide greater Canadian participation in its direction, and permit new Canadian participation in the ownership.

New businesses

In the third quarter of 1982, the number of new business cases decided rose to 147 from 103 in the second quarter and more than double the 69 cases decided in the third quarter of 1981. Twenty-five new business cases were withdrawn by the applicants before a decision was reached by Governor in Council. Of the decided new business cases, 90 percent were allowed and 10 percent disallowed.

An August news release described in some detail an allowed proposal by Stewart Marine Limited (Stewart) of Dartmouth, Nova Scotia, which is owned 41 percent by three Canadian citizens, 19 percent by Continental Offshore Ltd., of Halifax, Nova Scotia, 22 percent by Ventures Group Limited of Halifax, Nova Scotia, and 18 percent by Belmar Engineering Services (Canada) Ltd., which is a wholly owned subsidiary of Belmar Engineering Services Ltd. of Aberdeen, United Kingdom, to establish a fully integrated, computer-controlled, heavy fabrications machining and assembly facility at Dartmouth, Nova Scotia.

The plan is to create a world-class production centre to produce heavy fabrications and equipment modules, pressure vessels and process piping. Computer-aided design and manufacturing (CAD/CAM) is expected to be used, with an extension of this capability to computer-integrated manufacturing (CIM). The proposal will result in new investment, increased employment and new exports.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

Opinions

During the third quarter the Minister renewed two opinions to the effect that Asamera Inc. and Ranger Oil (Canada) Limited are considered to be eligible persons within the meaning of the Act. The Minister also gave one relatedness opinion.

Surveillance

During the third quarter, surveillance activity led to the initiation of 39 detailed investigations to determine whether the transactions in question were or were not reviewable. As a result 14 notices were filed under the Act, 5 of which might not have been filed without surveillance action.

Enforcement

In accordance with established procedures for monitoring the implementation of plans and undertakings provided by investors whose applications have been allowed, 283 cases were monitored during the third quarter. In addition, 15 disallowed cases were monitored to ensure that the decision of the Governor in Council to disallow the investment was respected.

Legal proceedings

On June 7, 1981, an Originating Notice was filed in the Federal Court of Canada, Trial Division, by the Attorney General of Canada on behalf of the Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce, seeking an order pursuant to section 20 of the FIR Act, rendering nugatory the investment in Canada of KSC Limited (formerly Kero-Sun Canada Inc.). The company's investment proposal had been disallowed by the Governor in Council. The motion was heard on August 26 and 27 in Toronto, but judgment was reserved and has not yet been pronounced.

In the proceedings (reported in the first quarter of 1982) against Trio-Kenwood Canada Inc. and Trio-Kenwood Corporation in the Federal Court of Canada, Trial Division, for such order as may be required that their investment in Canada shall be rendered nugatory, service of the Notice of Motion has now been effected on Trio-Kenwood Corporation and the parties are discussing dates for discoveries and a hearing.

* On November 15, 1982, Trio-Kenwood Corporation, through its counsel, filed notice of its establishment of a new business in Canada.
