Recommendation 1: Relevance  ISED's Science and Research Sector should work with adMare BioInnovations to increase understanding within the academic community of its refined focus, role and objectives in regards to advancing drug R&D projects.	ISED Position ISED SRS agrees with the recommendation. It is important for adMare to ensure that stakeholders in the health innovation ecosystem understand its objectives, direction and priorities. In particular, its greater focus on commercialization should be clearly communicated to academia.  ISED Management Response ISED SRS will support adMare's ongoing multi-pronged approach to increase understanding and alignment with the academic community, which includes:  1.
