Business expectations over the next three months

expect to keep the same 80.4% number of employees

expect rising inflation to 60.0% be an obstacle

expect profitability to remain 50.0% relatively unchanged

expect meeting an increase in demand to be a major or moderate challenge

expect the rising cost of 47.1% inputs to be an obstacle

expect transportation **38.4**% costs to be an obstacle

expect rising interest rates and **37.0**% debt costs to be an obstacle

expect to raise the prices of goods and services

expect the demand for products and services to increase



Labour

expect recruiting skilled 38.7% employees to be an obstacle

expect the labour force **37.1%** shortage to be an obstacle

expect retaining skilled 30.9% employees to be an obstacle

Of businesses that expect labour-related obstacles, 61.8% find recruiting and retaining staff more challenging than 12 months earlier



Supply chain

of businesses purchase materials, 71.5% parts, components, or goods for sale from a domestic supplier

of businesses purchase materials, 82.8% parts, components, or goods for sale from a **foreign supplier**

Over the next three months...

26.8% of businesses expect difficulty acquiring inputs, products or supplies from within Canada

14.4% of businesses expect difficulty acquiring inputs, products or supplies from abroad

14.2% of businesses expect maintaining inventory levels to be an obstacle

Supply chain challenges

Of businesses that expect supply chain challenges over the next three months...



reported that supply chain challenges have worsened **58.2**% over the last three months

reported that they plan to partner with new 30.6% suppliers over the next 12 months

reported that they plan to substitute inputs, products or supplies **29.6**% with alternate inputs, products or supplies over the next 12 months

reported that they plan to work with suppliers to **29.2**% improve timeliness over the next 12 months

Interprovincial trade

21.4% of businesses traded goods or services interprovincially over the last 12 months

Of these businesses that conducted interprovincial trade activities over the last 12 months...

57.0% directly exported or imported goods or services to or from **Ontario**

48.1% directly exported or imported goods or services to or from British Columbia

directly exported or imported goods or services to or from Alberta

directly exported or imported goods or services to or from Quebec

45.1% did not experience any obstacles importing or exporting goods or services interprovincially
