In 2021, New Brunswick (36.0\%), Quebec (18.1\%), Yukon (14.1\%) and Ontario ( $12.6 \%$ ) had the highest proportions of children under 18 years who are eligible for instruction in the minority official language.


In 2021 in Canada, more than 215,000 eligible children were preschoolers and 682,000 eligible children were school-aged.
