

KEEP YOUR BOXWOODS HEALTHY

From May to September, check your boxwoods for chewed leaves, larvae, webbing and sawdust-like debris (frass).

As a popular and versatile shrub, boxwoods are an important and essential part of Canada's landscape.

Prevent the spread of box tree moth (*Cydalima perspectalis*), an invasive pest that damages boxwoods (*Buxus*).
