#### ANNUAL REPORT on the ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT

#### Reporting period: April 1, 2015 to March 31, 2016

#### 1. Purpose of the Law

The purpose of the Access to Information Act (the "Act") is to extend the present laws of Canada to provide a right of access to information in records under the control of a government institution in accordance with the principles that government information should be available to the public, that necessary exceptions to the right of access should be limited and specific and that decisions on the disclosure of government information should be reviewed independently of government.

#### 2. Preparation and submission

This report is prepared and tabled in Parliament in accordance with section 72 of the Act.

#### 3. Mandate

BDC's mandate, as set out in the *Business Development Bank of Canada Act*, is to support Canadian entrepreneurs by providing financial, consulting and venture capital services. BDC's investments may be held in the name of BDC Capital, a wholly-owned subsidiary of BDC. All administration of such investments is performed by BDC employees, using BDC resources and facilities. All relevant records relating to BDC Capital are under the control of BDC.

#### 4. Organization of Access to Information activities, policies and procedures

Procedures are in place for directing formal access requests to the Access to Information Coordinator who ensures that they are processed in accordance with the provisions of the *Act*. The Coordinator is normally occupied part-time at BDC's Montreal Head Office in carrying out her responsibilities pursuant to the *Act*, although she is available at all times together with other administrative support, to process requests as the volume of activity may warrant. Delegated by the President & CEO, the Director, Corporate Compliance (who is the Coordinator), the Assistant Vice President, Legal Affairs, the Counsel and Assistant Corporate Secretary and the Senior Vice President, Legal Affairs and Corporate Secretary are currently exercising the powers, duties and functions under the *Act* and report to BDC's President & CEO on access to information matters.

BDC receives requests from various sources and for all types of information throughout the year. BDC's approach in determining whether to deal with such requests informally or whether to require the requestor to make a formal request under the *Act* depends on the complexity of the investigation and whether any exemptions apply. Decisions on waiving application and processing fees permitted under the *Act* are made on a case-by-case basis.

#### 5. <u>Delegation</u>

A copy of the Delegation Order is attached.

#### 6. Statistical Report

As outlined in the attached statistical report, BDC received three new formal requests in this reporting period. In relation to the three formal requests that were completed, the relevant records were partially disclosed in one instance and no relevant records were found in another instance. In the case of the third request, we neither confirmed nor denied the existence of records. In addition, there were thirteen formal consultations received from other departments and agencies concerning requests they treated in which some BDC-related records were involved. Twelve consultations were completed during the reporting period and one consultation was carried over to the next reporting period.

It should be noted that the number of requests remains constant throughout the years while number of pages processed varies greatly depending on the subject matter. Exemptions applied by BDC are mainly limited to sections 18, 19, 20, 21(1) and 23 of the Act and no exclusions were claimed. All formal requests and consultations were completed in the prescribed timeframe.

The percentage breakdown for the source of the formal requests received during this reporting period is as follows:

Media: 67% Business: 0% Public: 33%

#### 7. Training

During the reporting period, 3 training activities were performed and took the form of information sessions provided to members of different business units for a total of 37 participants.

#### 8. Policies, Guidelines and Procedures

During the reporting period, BDC did not implement any new or revised access to information policies, guidelines or procedures.

#### 9. Complaints and Investigations

One complaint was received this year and no investigation was concluded during the reporting period. One complaint reported last fiscal year was discontinued. Two complaints, filed in 2011-2012, in relation to two requests in which BDC claimed exemptions for records it considered to have proprietary and strategic value are still active and are assigned to an investigator. The new complaint, received this fiscal year, has not yet been assigned to an investigator by the Information Commissioner.

# 10. Monitoring of the time to process access to information requests

As BDC does not receive a large number of Access to Information requests, no formal monitoring of time is conducted.
