1. Introduction to the Departmental Sustainable Development Strategy

The 2016 to 2019 Federal Sustainable Development Strategy (FSDS) presents the Government of Canada's sustainable development goals and targets, as required by the Federal Sustainable Development Act. The Canadian Grain Commission adheres to the principles of the FSDS, and while not bound formally by the Act, supports reporting on the implementation of the Departmental Sustainable Development Strategy

2. Sustainable development at the Canadian Grain Commission

The Canadian Grain Commission's Departmental Sustainable Development Strategy for 2017 to 2020 describes the department's actions in support of achieving a low-carbon government. This supplementary information table presents available results for the departmental actions pertinent to this goal. Environmental performance considerations are integrated into the procurement decision-making process. All Canadian Grain Commission procurement and materiel management specialists have completed the Canada School of Public Service Green Procurement course or equivalent. The performance evaluation of the manager of the Procurement, Contracting and Materiel Management group includes support and contribution toward green procurement. The Canadian Grain Commission leverages common-use procurement instruments where available and feasible, trains acquisition cardholders on green procurement and has increased awareness of the Policy on Green Procurement among managers. The Canadian Grain Commission also strives to reduce the number of printers in its offices as well as replace older less efficient printers with more environmentally friendly equipment.

Context: Low-Carbon Government

Although the Canadian Grain Commission is not bound by the Federal Sustainable Development Act and is not required to develop a full Departmental Sustainable Development Strategy, the Canadian Grain Commission adheres to the principles of the FSDS by implementing the Policy on Green Procurement.

The Policy on Green Procurement supports the Government of Canada's effort to promote environmental stewardship.
