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Introduction

The *Privacy Act* (Revised Statutes of Canada, Chapter A–1, 1985) was proclaimed on July 1, 1983. The *Privacy Act* (the "*Act*") extends to individuals the right of access to information about themselves held by federal institutions, subject to specific and limited exceptions. The law also protects the individual's privacy by preventing others from having access to personal information and gives individuals substantial control over its collection and use.

Canada GEN Investment Corporation became subject to the *Privacy Act* on May 20, 2009.

This Annual Report to Parliament on the administration of the *Privacy Act* is prepared and tabled in Parliament in accordance with section 72 of the Act and covers the period from April 1, 2017 to March 31, 2018.

Mandate of the Institution

Canada GEN Investment Corporation ("GEN" or the "Corporation") is incorporated under the *Canada Business Corporations Act*, and is a wholly- owned subsidiary of Canada Development Investment Corporation ("CDEV"). The Corporation was incorporated on May 20, 2009 as 7176384 Canada Inc. to acquire and hold an equity interest in General Motors Company ("GM"). On December 16, 2009 the Articles of Incorporation were amended to reflect the change of the Corporation's name to Canada GEN Investment Corporation.

The Corporation reports to Parliament through its parent company and the Minister of Finance.

GEN does not engage with the general public in the normal course of business.

During the period April 1, 2017 to March 31, 2018, the Corporation did not borrow from the Government nor did it receive any appropriations.

GEN sold all of its remaining investments in GM in 2015 and had minimal activity in the reporting period.

Organizational Structure and Delegation Order

GEN does not have any employees and its operations are managed by CDEV employees. CDEV is based in Toronto and operates with a small team of six employees. The Access to Information and Privacy ("ATIP") Coordinator is a full- time employee of CDEV, dedicated part-time to GEN's ATIP activities. The ATIP office consists of the Coordinator and an ATIP analyst with no other regional offices or employees. CDEV also retains advice from an independent consultant as needed.

The ATIP Coordinator is the point of contact on issues involving the collection of personal information and privacy.

The Corporation has never conveyed personal information to federal investigative agencies pursuant to the provisions of the *Privacy Act*.

The Delegation of Authority Order (Appendix A) that was approved on September 11, 2015 remained in effect throughout the reporting period. The order was renewed on May 24, 2018. The authority to approve or deny the release of information under the *Act* is shared by the Executive Vice President and the ATIP Coordinator. The ATIP Coordinator normally performs the function, with the exception of disclosures pursuant to paragraphs 8(2)(e) and 8(2)(m) of the *Act*, which are handled by the Executive Vice President.

Highlights of the 2017-18 Statistical Report

Appendix B provides a summarized statistical report on the requests for personal information received under the *Privacy Act* from April 1, 2017 to March 31, 2018.

The Corporation received no requests during the reporting period. Since becoming subject to the *Act*, GEN has not received any requests or consultations from other institutions.

The Corporation has never conveyed personal information to federal investigative agencies pursuant to the provisions of the *Privacy Act*.

Privacy Impact Assessments

No Privacy Impact Assessments were conducted during the reporting period.

Information Holdings

The ATIP Coordinator is responsible for providing a full accounting of the Corporation's information holdings to the Treasury Board Secretariat and ensures that updates are provided on a timely basis for inclusion in the Info Source publications.

The Info Source publications contain a description of the classes of corporate records held by GEN. The Corporation does not have any exempt banks. The Corporation's Info Source chapter is published on CDEV's website at <u>www.cdev.gc.ca</u>.

Website

GEN does not maintain a public website however CDEV has a website at www.cdev.gc.ca. The website provides information on ATIP matters for CDEV and its subsidiaries.

Reading Room

GEN does not maintain a formal reading room as it occupies only minimal office space. However, in accordance with the *Privacy Act*, the Corporation will make arrangements to provide facilities for viewing material on an as required basis.

Training and Awareness

In April 2017, an independent consultant provided a one day information session on the Access to Information and Privacy Acts to all 6 CDEV employees, including the two ATIP

staff.

Policies, Guidelines, Procedures and Initiatives

CDEV's privacy policy, which applies to GEN, is reviewed by the board of directors on an annual basis and amended as required. The privacy policy was last reviewed in June 2017.

There were no new and/or revised institution-specific privacy-related policies, guidelines, procedures or initiatives implemented in the institution during the reporting period.

Monitoring Compliance

There were no requests to monitor during the reporting period.

Material Privacy Breaches

There were no material privacy breaches during the reporting period.

Costs

Total costs associated with activities related to the administration of the *Privacy Act* for this reporting period are nil.

Summary of Key Issues and Actions Taken on Complaints or Audits

There were no complaints received and no audits or investigations conducted during this reporting period.

Public Interest Disclosures

GEN has never received any requests nor disclosed information pursuant to paragraph 8(2)(m) of the *Act*.

Use and Disclosure

The intent and requirements of the *Privacy Act* and Treasury Board guidelines regarding the collection, use, disclosure, retention and disposal of personal information are strictly adhered to by the Corporation. Individuals sharing responsibility for the management of the Corporation are aware of their responsibilities for the proper management of personal information holdings and the Corporation respects the Use and Disclosure Code.

Furthermore, the Access to Information and Privacy Coordinator must be notified where personal information in a personal information bank is used or disclosed for a use consistent with the purpose for which the information was obtained or compiled, but was not identified in the statement of consistent uses published in Info Source.
