Council Meeting—January 10th, 2023

The amendment to the Canadian Chicken Marketing Quota Regulation for the revised allocation for control period A-181 and the amendment to the Canadian Chicken Marketing Levies Order which extends the expiry date to March 31st, 2024, and maintains the national levy at \$0.57/kg (live weight).






