





# THE LIST OF SPECIES ELIGIBLE FOR AN AMENDMENT TO SCHEDULE 1

## Status of the recently assessed species and consultation paths

On October 18, 2023, COSEWIC submitted nine assessments of species at risk to the Minister of Environment and Climate Change for species that are eligible to be added to Schedule 1 of SARA. Seven of these are terrestrial species, and two are aquatic species. COSEWIC also reviewed the classification of species already on Schedule 1, in some cases changing their status. One terrestrial species is being considered for a higher risk status on SARA, and four terrestrial species are being considered for a lower risk status on SARA. One species is being considered to be removed from SARA. In all, 13 terrestrial species that are eligible to be added to Schedule 1, or to have their current status on Schedule 1 changed are included in this consultation (Table 1).

COSEWIC also submitted the reviews of species already on Schedule 1, confirming their classification. Twenty-one of these reviews were for terrestrial species. These species are not included in the consultations because there is no regulatory change being proposed (Table 2).
