

CALL FOR PAPERS

The Scientific Committee invites all professionals and researchers working in the field of toxicology to present a paper relating to one of the themes of the Symposium. Let others know about your work through an oral or poster presentation. To be considered, send an abstract of your project no later than **May 22, 2001** to the Symposium Organizing Committee.

The objective, methods, results and conclusions of the work in question must be clearly explained within the body of a 250-word text written in English. Recommended font is 12-point Helvetica or Times. The abstract should conform to a 15-cm-×-15-cm format, and include: 1) the title in capital letters, 2) the initials and family names of authors, 3) affiliation, and 4) body of the abstract. The presenting author's name should be underlined and his/her address, phone and fax numbers and e-mail address indicated at the bottom of the abstract. Also indicate presentation type (poster or oral). Abstracts

should be submitted on diskette (airmail) or as an MS Word file via electronic mail.



Oral presentations are limited to 20 minutes including a 5-minute question/discussion period. The equipment necessary for electronic presentations, slides or transparencies will be available on site.

Maximum **poster** size is $1 \text{ m} \times 1.5 \text{ m}$. Posters will be displayed for the duration of the Symposium in the hall adjacent to the conference room.

In keeping with a Symposium tradition and in a bid to foster friendly discussions and interaction, the event is limited to 200 people. It is thus essential to notify the Organizing Committee before May 22, 2001 of your interest in presenting a paper. Translation services (English and French) will be available on site.

PRACTICAL PRE-SYMPOSIUM WORKSHOPS

The ideal opportunity to share your know-how! These workshops are intended to promote new small-scale methods for assessing environmentrelated effects. Aspiring presenters should note that the workshops will take place in a conference room at the Loews Le Concorde Hotel, and no laboratory materials will be available. As such, methods will necessarily



have to be explained by means of lectures, video or slide presentations, transparencies or discussion groups.

Sessions are limited to 45 minutes each. Workshop proposals should reach the Symposium Organizing Committee (**ista-siet.csl@ec.gc.ca**) no later than **June 15, 2001**. The Symposium web site (http://www.qc.ec.gc.ca/csl/ista10) will have more details on the topics selected for the workshops after this

date.

Topics or workshop proposals should correspond to one of the themes of the Symposium. To ensure a certain coherence to the presentations, the Scientific Committee reserves the right to suggest themes other than those proposed by submitting authors, where appropriate.

The main themes of the Symposium are as follows:

- New techniques for measuring the effects of contaminants
- Miniaturized online monitoring tools

- Commercial bioanalytical kits for assessing contaminant toxicity
- Biomarkers for measuring the effects of contaminants related to topical environmental problems (e.g. endocrine disruption, immunocompetence, genotoxicity)
- Detection systems for algal and fungal toxins
- Biodegradation and biorestoration studies
- Microbioassays for aquatic and terrestrial application
- Ecotoxicological hazard and risk assessment
- Use of toxicity assays for regulatory purposes and water quality standards
- Biological contaminants: microtechniques for detection of GMOs and transgenes
- Interactions of biological and chemical contaminants
- Special session on the international WATERTOX program co-ordinated by the Canadian International Development Research Centre (IDRC).

SELECTED SUBMISSIONS

The Scientific Committee will assess and judge the relevance, originality and validity of submitted proposals. The Scientific Committee will do one of three things:

- accept the proposal
- suggest a different format (e.g. poster) or modifications
- reject the submission altogether.

Decisions will be communicated by June 15, 2001, at the latest. Proposals will not be accepted definitively until aspiring presenters have paid their Symposium registration fees.

AWARDS OF EXCELLENCE

Awards of Excellence will be handed out for the best oral presentation, best poster presentation, and best oral presentation by a young scientist during the closing ceremonies.

PUBLICATIONS

The Symposium Proceedings will appear in two special issues of Environmental Toxicology, published by John Wiley & Sons. The first will focus exclusively on themes associated with endocrine disruption, immunocompetence and genotoxicity, whereas the second will include work related to the other themes of the Symposium. Authors wishing to have their article considered for publication in either of these special issues must submit the final text of their manuscript to the Scientific Committee upon arrival at the Symposium. All submitted manuscripts will then be approved by a peer review process.
