# Statement outlining results, risks and significant changes in operations, personnel and program

#### Introduction

This quarterly report has been prepared by management as required by section 65.1 of the *Financial Administration Act* and in the form and manner prescribed by the Treasury Board. This quarterly report should be read in conjonction with the Main Estimates. It has not been subject to an external audit or review.

A summary description of the Registry of the Competition Tribunal's program activities can be found in Part II of the Main Estimates.

#### **Basis of Presentation**

This quarterly report has been prepared by management using an expenditure basis of accounting. The accompanying Statement of Authorities includes the department's spending authorities granted by Parliament and those used by the department consistent with the Main Estimates for the 2011-2012 fiscal year. This quarterly report has been prepared using a special purpose financial reporting framework designed to meet financial information needs with respect to the use of spending authorities.

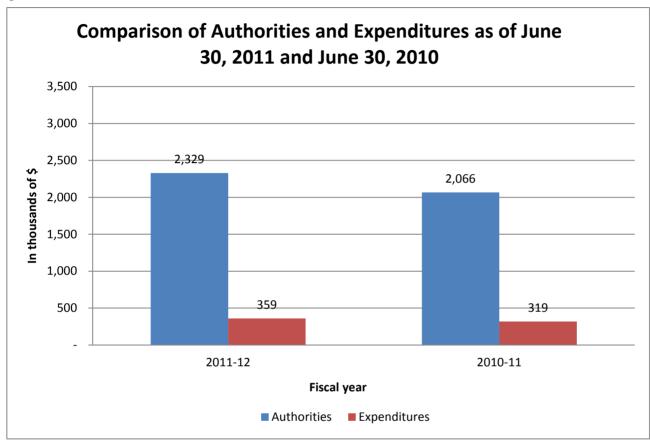
The authority of Parliament is required before moneys can be spent by the Government. Approvals are given in the form of annually approved limits through appropriation acts or through legislation in the form of statutory spending authority for specific purposes.

When Parliament is dissolved for the purposes of a general election, section 30 of the *Financial Administration Act* authorizes the Governor General, under certain conditions, to issue a special warrant authorizing the Government to withdraw funds from the Consolidated Revenue Fund. A special warrant is deemed to be an appropriation for the fiscal year in which it is issued.

The Registry of the Competition Tribunal uses the full accrual method of accounting to prepare and present its annual departmental financial statements that are part of the departmental performance reporting process. However, the spending authorities voted by Parliament remain on an expenditure basis.

#### Highlights of fiscal quarter and fiscal year to date (YTD) results

Figure 1 outlines the budgetary authorities which represent the resources available for use for the year as of June 30 as well as the expenditures recorded against these authorities. The Registry's year-to-date spending are in line with the previous year.



Total authorities available for the year have increased from \$2,164 thousand to \$2,329 thousand. This increase is mainly the result of a change in Budgetary statutory authorities due to an adjustment in the rate calculation of the Employee Benefit Plan.

Compared to the previous year, the expenditures recorded in the first quarter, ending June 30, 2011 increased by \$40 thousand, from \$319 thousand to \$359 thousand. This slight difference is primarily explained by the completion of an information technology project during the first quarter.

The Registry spent less than 25% of its authorities in the first quarter due to the limited number of hearings that took place duirng that period. A number of hearing days are already scheduled to take place in the next quarters. The percentage of expenses will increase when expenses related to those hearings materialize.

#### **Risks and Uncertainties**

This Departmental Quarterly Financial Report (QFR) reflects the results of the current fiscal period in relation to the Main Estimates for which full supply was released on June 27, 2011. Budget 2010 announced that the operating budgets of departments would be frozen at their 2010-11 levels for the fiscal years 2011-12 and 2012-13.

The Registry is funded through voted parliamentary spending authorities and statutory authorities for program expenditures. As a result, its operations are impacted by any changes in funding approved by Parliament. The Registry has no control over the number of applications filed at the Tribunal it can only react to external demands. The number of applications brought before the Tribunal depends on the enforcement policy adopted by the Competion Bureau and the number of applications filed by individuals or companies under the private access provisions of the Act.

#### Significant changes in relation to operations, personnel and programs

There have been no significant changes in relation to operations and personnel over the last year.
