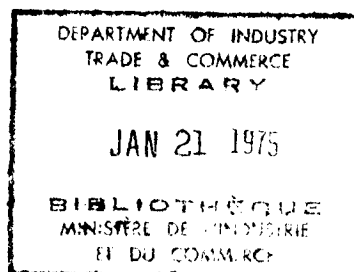

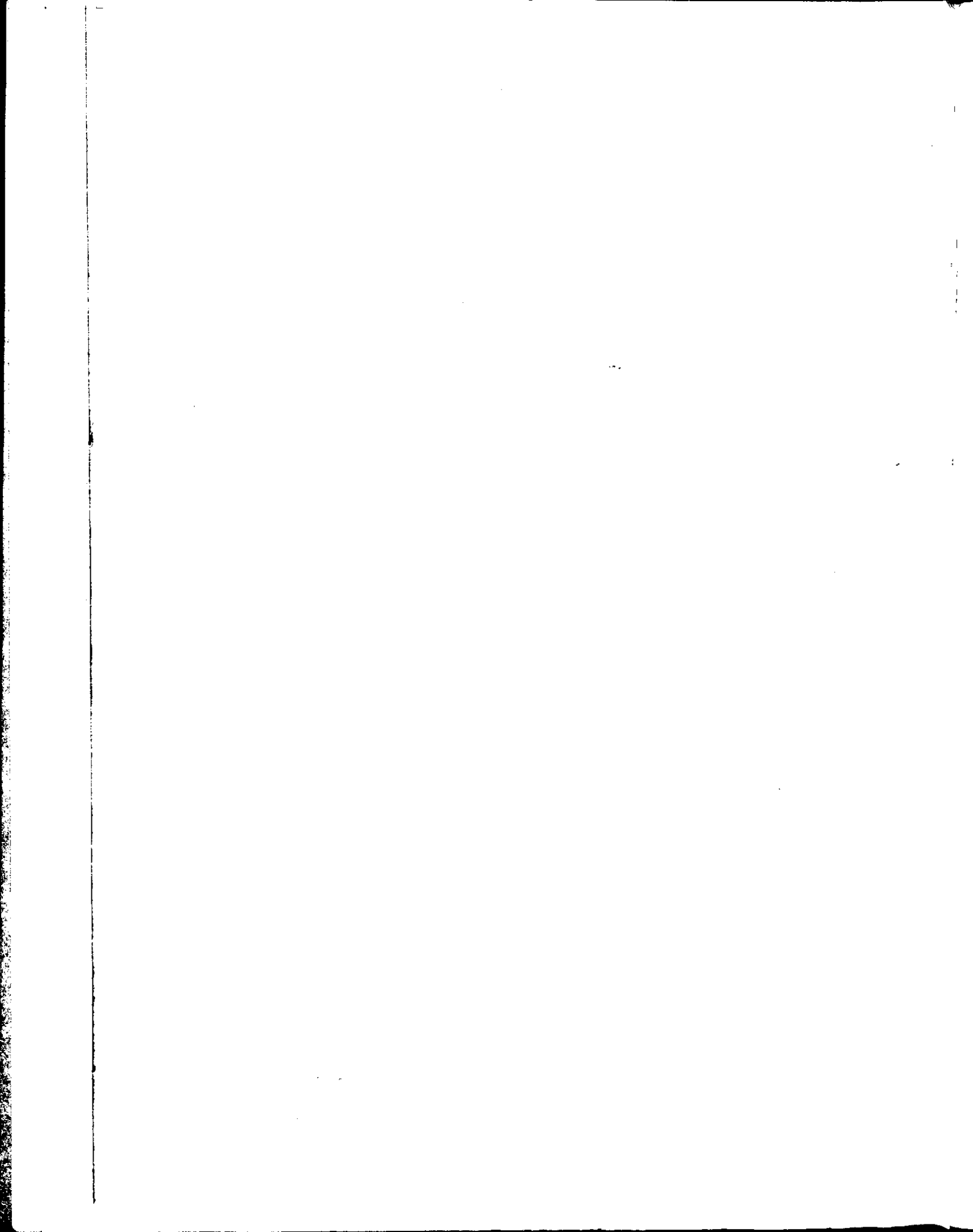

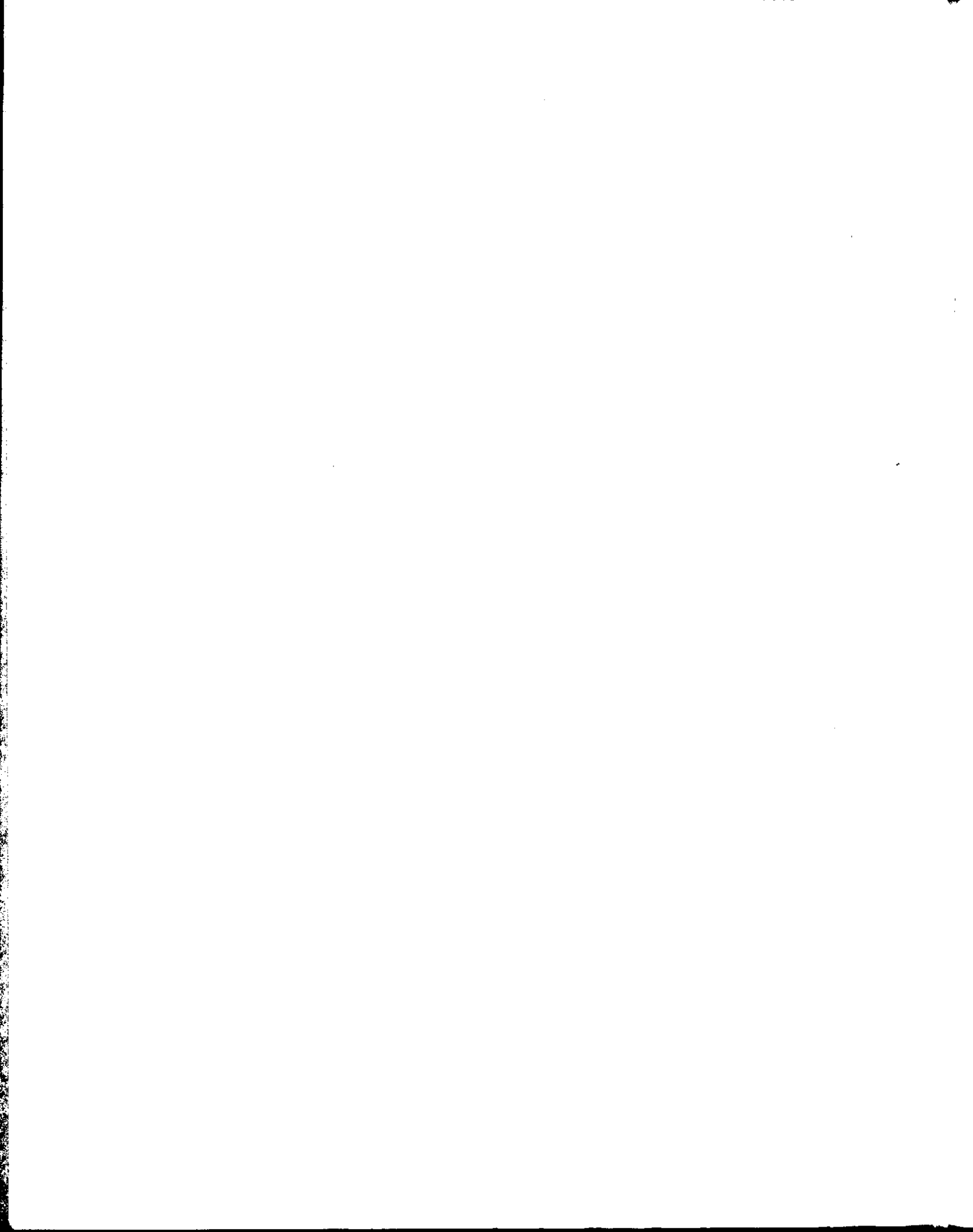

INTRODUCTION

Chemical Import Trends - 1973 continues the series of chemical import analyses published to further identify opportunities for additional manufacturing operations in Canada. The 1973 edition lists chemicals and chemically related products imported during the months of January, April, July and October.

During 1973, imports of chemical, petroleum, plastic and rubber products reached a total of \$2,713.0 million. Chemicals and chemical products accounted for \$1,104.0 of which \$197.3 million were reported in twenty-two selected "not elsewhere specified" (n.e.s.) import classes. These classes were surveyed and the individual items are listed in Part II of this report.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

This report is in two parts. Part I lists those chemical, petroleum, plastic and rubber commodities and other materials by class as they are reported by Statistics Canada, "Imports by Commodities", December, 1973. Part II is a breakdown of twenty-two selected n.e.s. classes for the months of January, April, July and October 1973.

Part I lists the class number as well as the most common tariff item, while Part II specifies the most common class number with the corresponding Brussels tariff number. Persons wishing official rulings on the tariff status of particular commodities should consult the Customs and Excise Division of Revenue Canada, Ottawa.

Where duplications appear between Part I and Part II, the data of Part II is additional to that of Part I. These duplications among classes occur because of description variations and trade names.
