

#### Summary and Conclusions

Recent hiring patterns at Canadian universities during the three academic years 1973-74 to 1975-76 were analysed based on data from the University and College Academic Staff System (UCASS) data base at Statistics Canada. The analysis produced the following findings:

- 1. In total, approximately 2,500 new appointments were made per year. About 27 per cent of these appointments represented inter-university transfers of existing staff within Canada. On balance, net new staffing amounted to 1,600 to 1,900 persons per year.
- 2. In 1975-76, a typical year, net new staffing was
  1,796 of which 1,201 were Canadians or Canadian residents,
  340 were foreign nationals and 255 did not report nationality.
  Of the Canadians recruited, 277 were students in Canada, 405
  were in non-teaching jobs in Canada, 222 were recruited
  from abroad, and 297 did not report previous occupation.
- 3. Most of the appointments (80 per cent) are made at the junior level (assistant professor level or below) which is the typical entry level to the profession.
- 4. A review of net staffing by junior level appointments indicated that French and bilingual universities hired a substantially larger proportion of Canadians compared to English language universities (85.0 per cent versus 64.9 per cent). Conversely, Western universities hired a lower

proportion of Canadians than other regions (61.5 per cent compared to 70 to 75 per cent in other regions). By field of study, the health sciences staffed nearly 80 per cent of the new positions with Canadians compared to approximately 70 per cent Canadians in natural and human sciences.

- 5. This study raises a number of questions related to the employment opportunities for Canadian graduates in the university system. Excluding inter-university mobility in Canada and country not reported, an approximately equal number of staff are hired from abroad as are hired in Canada (about 700 to 800 per year). Many of the foreign hirings are Canadians returning from jobs and studies abroad.

  Approximately 280 Canadian graduates were hired from Canada per year. This raises these questions:
- i) What are the reasons for the substantial international flows of foreign trained personnel to Canada?
- ii) Is it possible to increase the number of Canadian graduates hired by the Canadian universities?
- iii) Can the level and quality of research training and academic experience of Canadian students be improved so that they might be on a better competitive footing with foreign training and experience?
- 6. The HQM model projections to 1985-86 indicate declining net new staffing opportunities at Canadian universities ranging from about 2,100 to 2,500 in 1977-78 to about 300 to 700 in 1985-86.

#### 1. Introduction

This report examines recent hiring patterns at Canadian universities during the three academic years 1973-74 to 1975-76. Preliminary data for the academic year 1976-77 have also been examined, but because of their incomplete status have not been included here. They conform, however, very closely to the pattern of the earlier data.

The analysis focusses on the citizenship and country of previous employment of new appointees to full-time university teaching. In addition, such factors as the level of appointment, geographic area, age of university, size of university, principal language of instruction and field of teaching speciality are considered.

The data originate from the "University and College Academic Staff System" (UCASS) data base which is maintained by the Education Division of Statistics Canada.

#### 2. Background

This study originated from consideration at MOSST of a number of issues raised by the academic and scientific community and others involving the following topics:

- 1. The relationship between actual university staffing levels and the estimates of attrition and staff growth indicated by the HQM Model of MOSST
- 2. Concerns expressed by the Science Council and the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada, and other observers, regarding the prospect of declining enrolment trends, future reduced requirements for young teachers and research scientists at universities, and the consequent lack of employment opportunities in university teaching and research for new doctoral graduates
- 3. Nationalistic concerns that have been expressed regarding the level of non-Canadian appointments to university faculties

This is a quantitative analysis of recent patterns of hiring designed to put these policy issues into clearer focus.

### 3. Overview of Recent Trends

#### Level of Appointment

Table 1 shows the number of new appointments by academic rank. In total, approximately 2,500 appointments were made each year of which about 80 per cent are at the junior level, that is, at the assistant professor level and below. Full details on recent appointments are tabulated in the Appendix Tables A-1 through A-17.

### Occupational Mobility

A substantial proportion of the new appointments represent intra-occupational mobility, that is, the movement of university staff between universities in Canada. In 1975-76, inter-university transfers accounted for 27 per cent of the total staffing activity. Excluding this mobility, staffing activity ranged between 1,600 and 1,900 appointments per year, as shown in Table 2.

#### New Appointments by Previous Occupation

Table 3 shows the previous occupation of new appointees, excluding the inter-university mobility noted previously. In 1975-76, about 1,800 appointments were made, of which 1,200 were Canadians or residents of Canada and 340 were foreign nationals. In that year, 277 Canadian students in Canada were hired. This represents 15.4 per cent of the total appointments made in 1975-76. In comparison, 291 Canadian students and faculty were recruited from abroad and 436 Canadians in non-teaching jobs were hired in Canada. As Table 3 indicates, there has been little change in the staffing pattern over the three-year period.

#### 4. Junior Level Appointments

A more detailed analysis of appointments was carried out at the junior level, because it can be argued that there is more scope for engaging newly-trained Canadian scholars at this level rather than at the senior levels. A number of possible sources of variation in hiring patterns, such as size of university, language of instruction, geographic region, age of university and teaching field are examined. Data for the three academic years 1973-74 to 1975-76 are combined in the summary Tables below, but the annual tabulations are shown in detail in Appendix Tables A-3 to A~17.

It was found that staffing patterns by university size and by age of institution did not reveal noteworthy differences. As a result, these tabulations are not discussed below, but the original data are shown in the Appendix for completeness.

#### Language of Instruction

Table 4 shows the three-year total staffing activity, excluding inter-university transfers, for English language universities and French and bilingual universities. Of particular interest in this Table is the substantially larger proportion of Canadians hired in French and bilingual universities (85.0 per cent of the total) compared to English universities (64.9 per cent of the total).

#### Geographic Region

The three-year total staffing at the junior level, excluding university transfers of staff in Canada, by geographic region is shown in Table 5.

Of particular note is the relatively lower proportion of Canadians hired by the Western universities (61.5 per cent of the total) compared to the other regions which range from 71.2 to 76.2 per cent. Also of interest is the observation that Ontario and the Atlantic regions have hired proportionately more from the category "Students in Canada" (22.0 and 23.0 per cent of the total) than the other regions (about 14 per cent of the total).

#### Teaching Field

Junior level appointments, by teaching field, are shown in Table 6. The health sciences have hired Canadians at a substantially higher level (78.4 per cent) than the other disciplines. This difference is due largely to the large proportion of appointees drawn from other occupations in Canada. (The proportion of students hired in the health sciences is lower than in the other disciplines).

## 5. Reconciliation of New Appointments with HQM Model Estimates

A reconciliation is provided in Table 7 which shows the relationship between the new appointments data from the UCASS file, as used in this report, and the estimates of new entrants to university teaching provided by the MOSST HQM simulation model . The HQM model calculates the number of new entrants based on replacement requirements due to attrition (death, retirement and emigration) and on the net change in the total number of university teachers required each year. In effect, the total number of new appointments from the UCASS file less staffing due to occupational mobility within Canada should equal the number of new entrants as estimated by the HQM model. When this adjustment is made to the UCASS file, the HQM model estimates of net university teachers demand are close to the actual hirings, but a definitive test cannot be made because some appointees do not report whether their previous occupation was with a Canadian university or elsewhere.

### 6. Employment of Canadian Graduates

This analysis shows that out of a net annual staffing activity of 1,600 to 1,900 per year (excluding inter-university mobility in Canada), graduates of Canadian universities have secured about 280 positions per year. In comparison, Canadian universities have hired approximately this same number of foreign nationals (faculty and students) directly from other countries. Moreover, there is a substantial flow of Canadian faculty and students returning from abroad each year to teach in Canada (about 200 per year). In total, excluding inter-university mobility in Canada, and setting aside the issue of nationality, hirings from abroad are almost identical to hirings in Canada in each year (see Table 8).

This raises a number of issues of interest to the academic and scientific community and to MOSST in connection with research manpower capability and the national science effort.

- 1. What are the reasons for the substantial international flow of foreign trained university staff to Canada?
- 2. Is it possible to increase the number of Canadian graduates hired by the Canadian universities?
- 3. Can the level and quality of research training and academic experience of Canadian students be improved, so that they might be on a better competitive footing with foreign training and experience?

### 7. Projection of Staffing Trends

There is reasonably close correspondence between the UCASS staffing files and the MOSST simulations of net employment opportunities in university teaching for the years analyzed here. The model projections to 1985 provide a view of the staffing opportunities emerging in the Canadian university system over the next 8 years. Table 9 shows two projections of the number of new entrants required each year to 1985-86, needed to replace existing staff and to meet the net change in total stock requirements. Projection A is a relatively optimistic projection, assuming constant

enrolment participation rates and student-teacher ratios, while projection B takes a somewhat less optimistic view assuming declining participation rates (and also constant student-teacher ratios). These estimates indicate that net staffing activity, excluding occupational mobility in Canada, will decline over the period from about 1,200 to 1,400 per year to about 200 to 400 per year in 1985-86.

Occupational mobility (as shown in Table 7 above) has been at a level of approximately 75 to 85 per cent of the HQM new entrants estimates. This would suggest that total new staffing might be in the range of 1.75 to 1.85 times the HQM new entrants estimates, or declining from the range of 2,100 to 2,500 per year in 1977-78 to 300 to 700 per year in 1985-86.
