



A BORIGINAL BUSINESS CANADA provides business services and support to Canadian Aboriginal peoples. This pamphlet describes how we work with you, what we look for and how we can help your tourism business succeed in developing new opportunities.

Many Aboriginal firms operate successful tourism businesses across the country that contribute to our economy.

More than ever, Canadians and visitors from other countries are interested in visiting Aboriginal communities and experiencing authentic Aboriginal culture. In recognition of this niche market, **Aboriginal Business Canada** supports individuals and communities in their efforts to develop distinctive Aboriginal cultural tourism and ecotourism products that are commercially viable yet remain sensitive to Aboriginal traditions and values. The following information describes how we can work with you in such activities.

WHAT ARE ABORIGINAL CULTURAL TOURISM AND ECOTOURISM?

These terms refer to travel or tourism experiences that:

- Create an understanding of Aboriginal cultural and natural history.
- · Safeguard ecosystems.
- Produce economic benefits that, in part, encourage conservation.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR SUPPORT?

Canadian status and non-status Indians, Inuit and Métis individuals, associations, partnerships or other legal entities that are wholly or partly owned or controlled by Aboriginal people, on or off reserve, are eligible.

WHAT KIND OF SUPPORT DOES *Aboriginal business Canada* provide for tourism businesses?

Financial support can be made available to:

- Establish new businesses that offer Aboriginal cultural tourism or ecotourism experiences.
- Add an Aboriginal cultural tourism or ecotourism component to an existing tourism business.

Examples of businesses that would be eligible for support include those that make it possible for a tourist to:

- · Experience Aboriginal community-based tourism.
- · Participate in re-creations of historical Aboriginal lifestyles,
- · Spend a night on a trapline.
- · View the northern lights.
- · Experience whale watching.
- · Learn about Aboriginal values and teachings.

IF I AM ELIGIBLE FOR FINANCIAL SUPPORT, WHAT IS EXPECTED OF ME AS THE CLIENT?

You need to have a minimum of 15 percent cash equity in the eligible costs of the proposed venture. This may increase depending on your financial capacity to bear more of the costs.

You must be actively involved in running the business and the business must demonstrate that it can support an appropriate salary.

WHAT FINANCING CAN *Aboriginal business Canada* offer?

Each proposal is assessed on its own commercial viability and merits, and the decision about our investment takes into account the overall financial package you have assembled. You should discuss this in detail with an **Aboriginal Business Canada** development officer.

The maximum contribution for tourism activities is 60 percent of eligible capital and operating costs; in most cases, the contribution will be significantly lower.

Up to 75 percent of the eligible costs of business planning and business support requirements is also available.

IS THERE A MAXIMUM CONTRIBUTION?

Contributions are tailored to the requirements of the business. You should talk to your development officer to determine the level of support that may be available for your venture.

DO I HAVE TO REPAY THIS FUNDING?

Contributions to commercial enterprises exceeding \$75 000 must be repaid in full. (Exceptions may be made for Aboriginal community-owned businesses.)

IF I HAVE A BUSINESS PROPOSAL FOR Consideration, what is the next step?

Call the Aboriginal Business Canada or External Delivery Office nearest you and ask to speak to a development officer who will provide further information and discuss your plans with you. If the idea appears to fit our criteria, we will provide you with a "Statement of Intent" form. Submission of this form begins the application process.
