 THE COMMUNICATIONS AREA

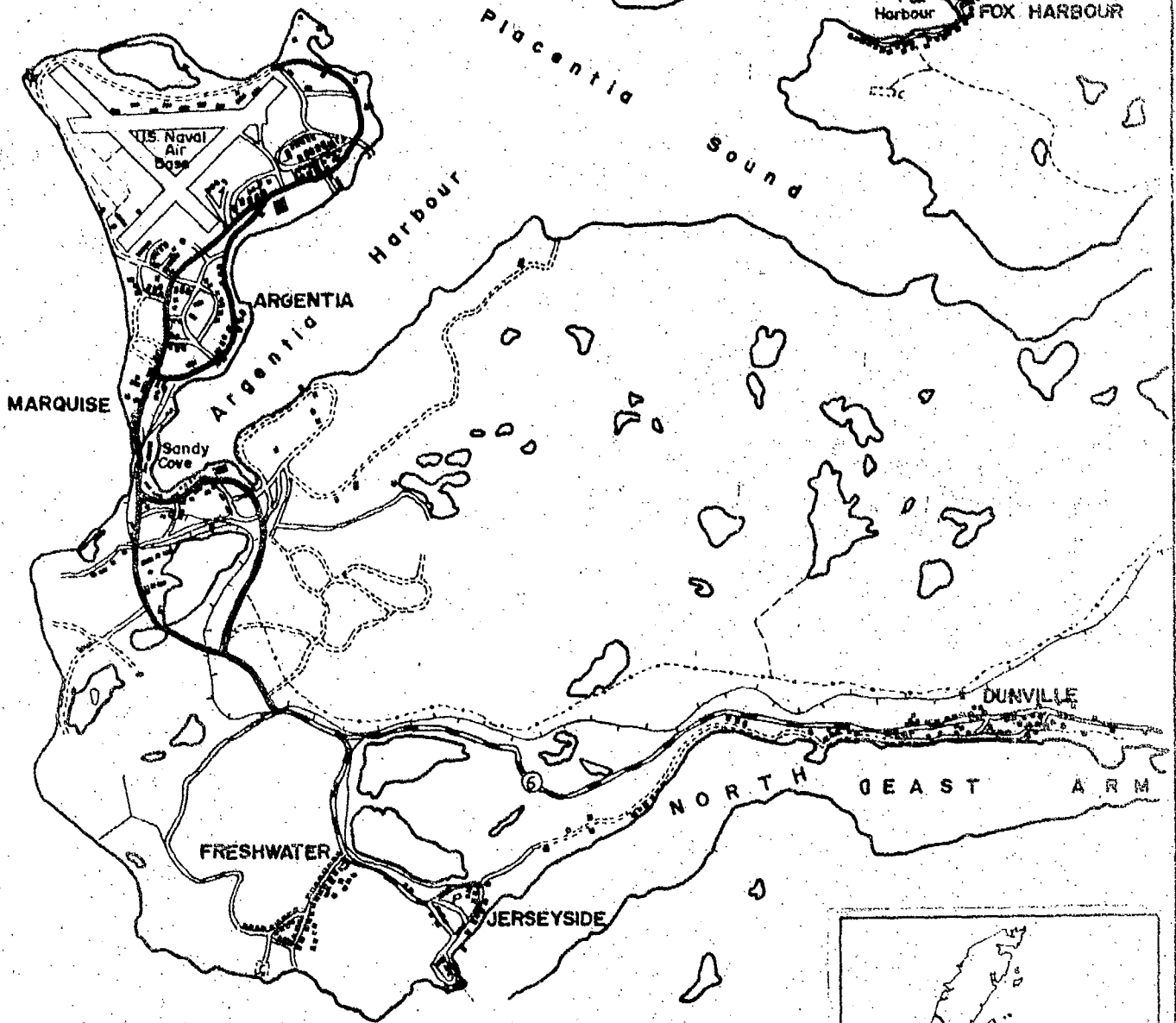

Summary of Population Data

During the period 1951 - 1966, of the nineteen Communities in the Placentia Bay Area four Communities showed a decrease in population while the remaining fifteen Communities showed increases ranging from 11% to 127%.

The population of seven pertinent Communities is shown in Graph form for the period 1935 - 1966 with a Straight Line Projection to 1970 based on Average Change 1945 - 1966.

The Communities of Dunville, Jersey side, Freshwater and Placentia showed a marked numerical increase in Population during this period. Of the remaining three Communities, Arnold's Cove and Admiral's Beach showed a steady increase while Southern Harbour showed no appreciable change.

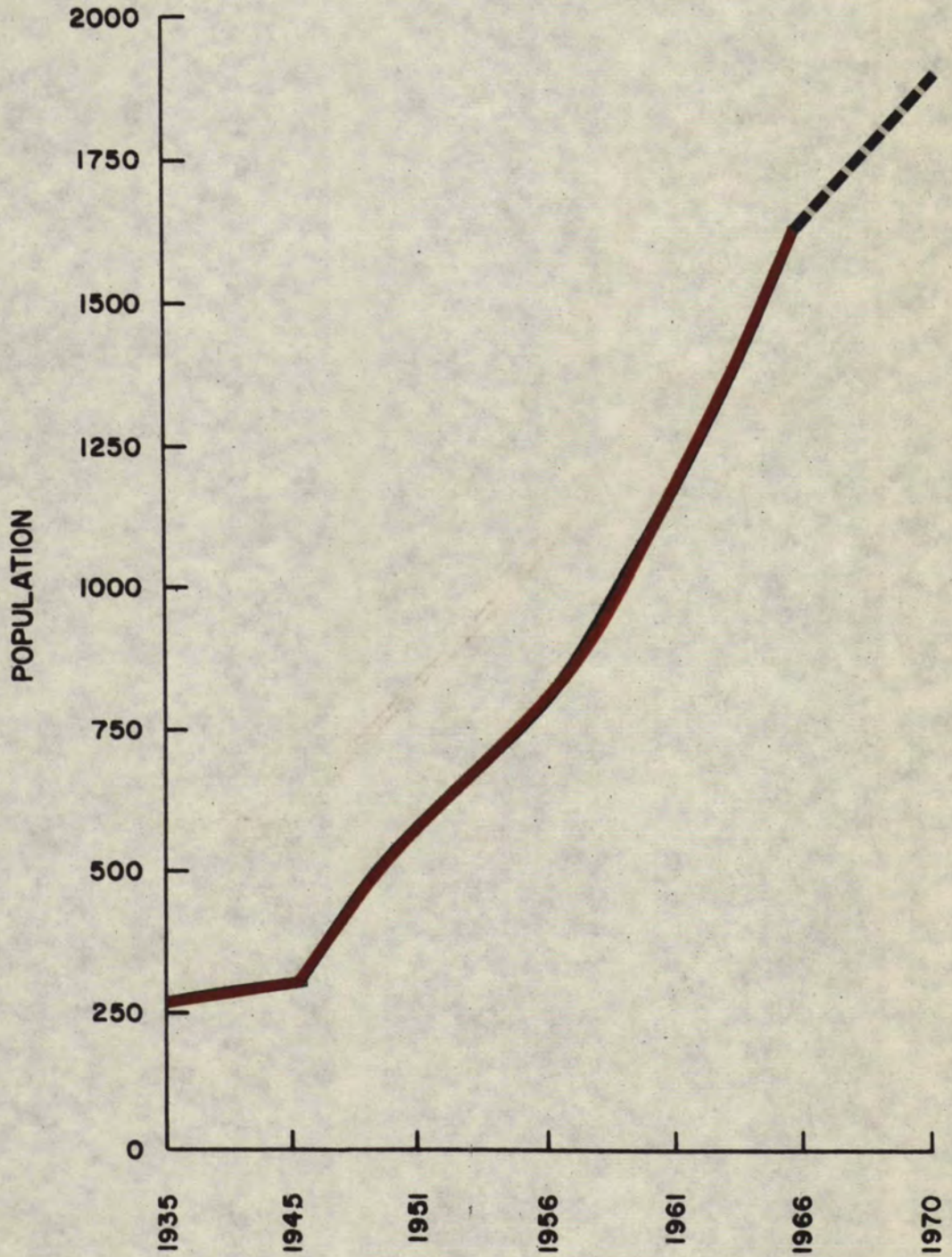

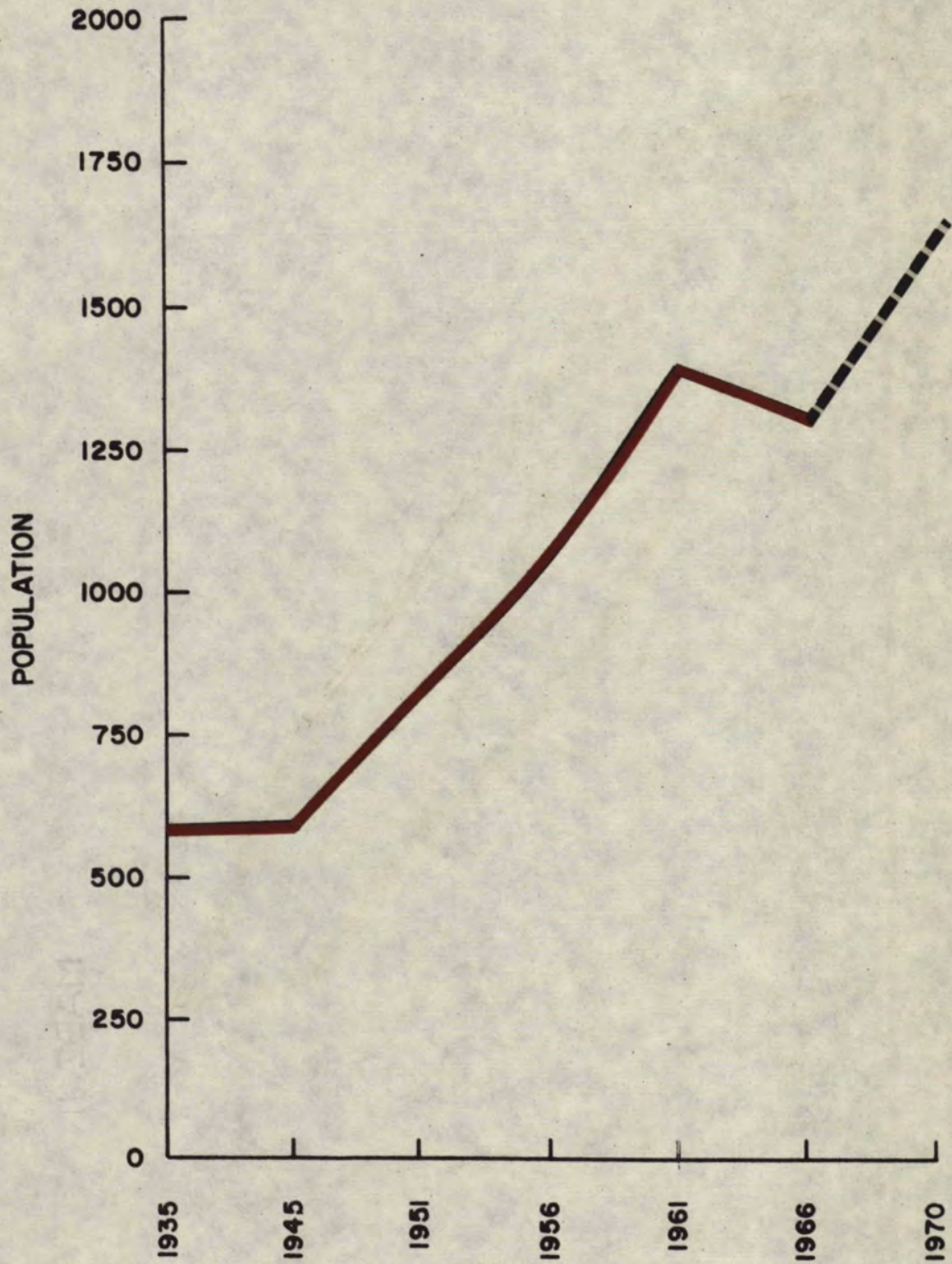
POPULATION TRENDS 1935 - 1970

NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR



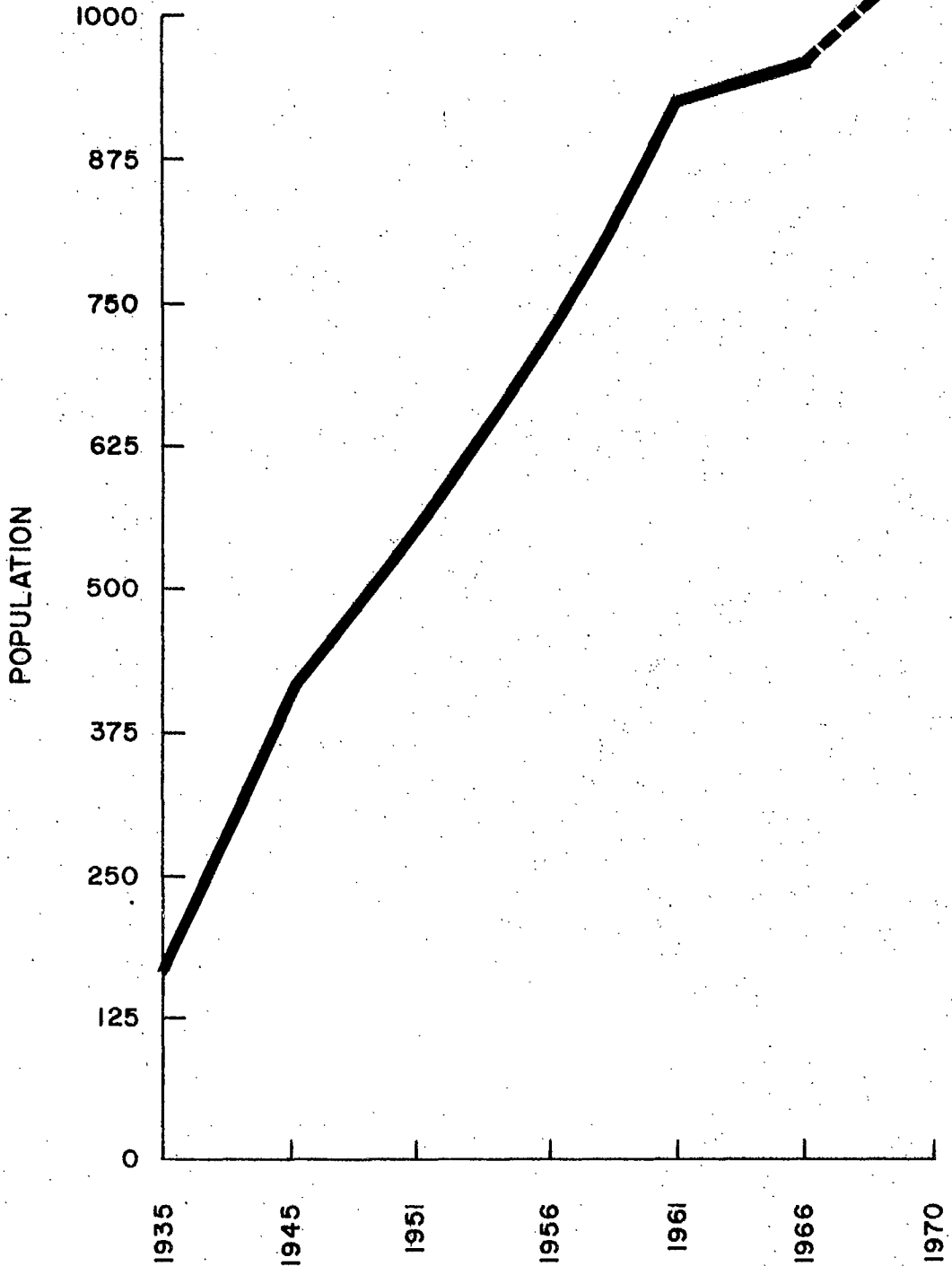

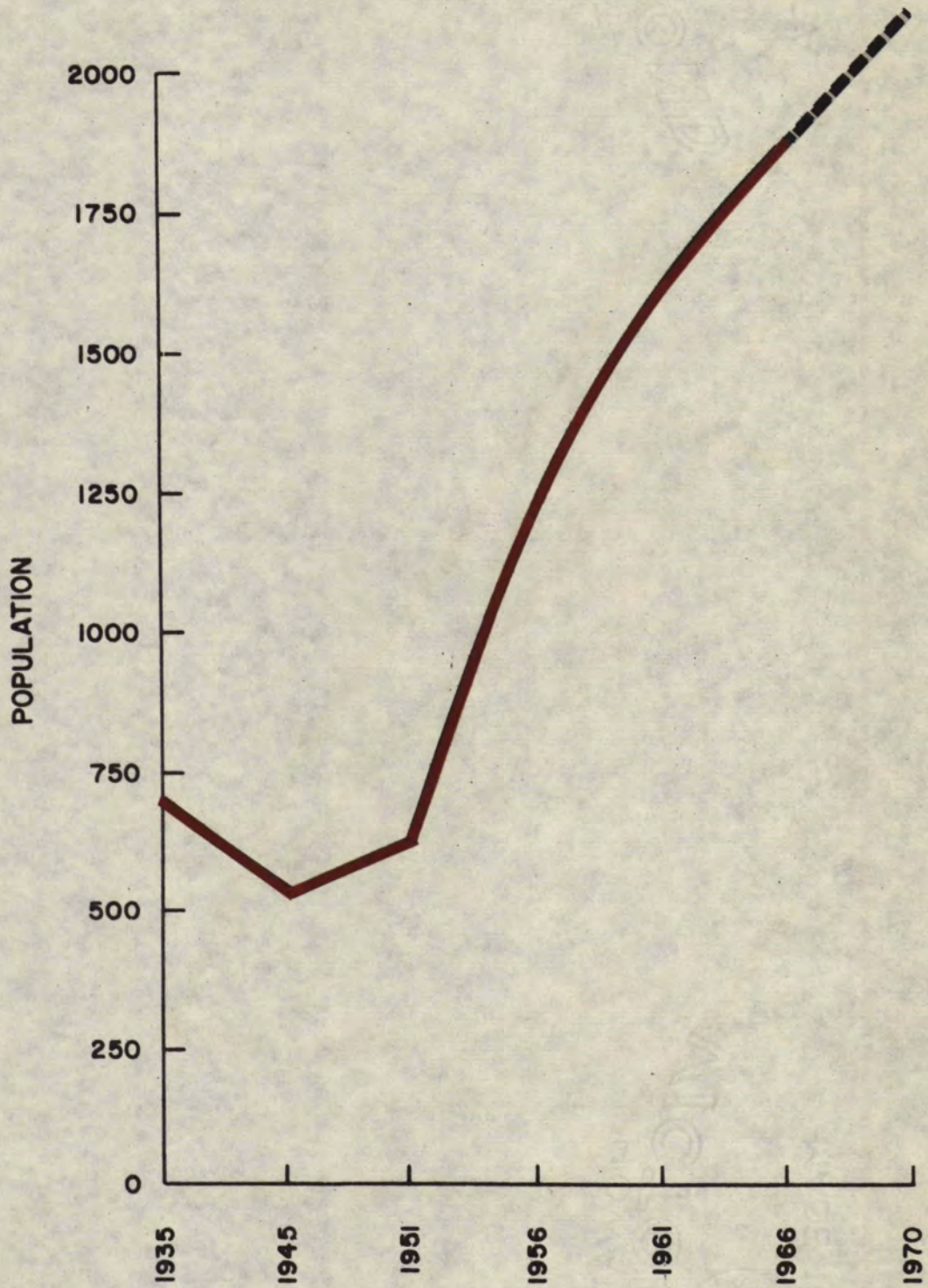

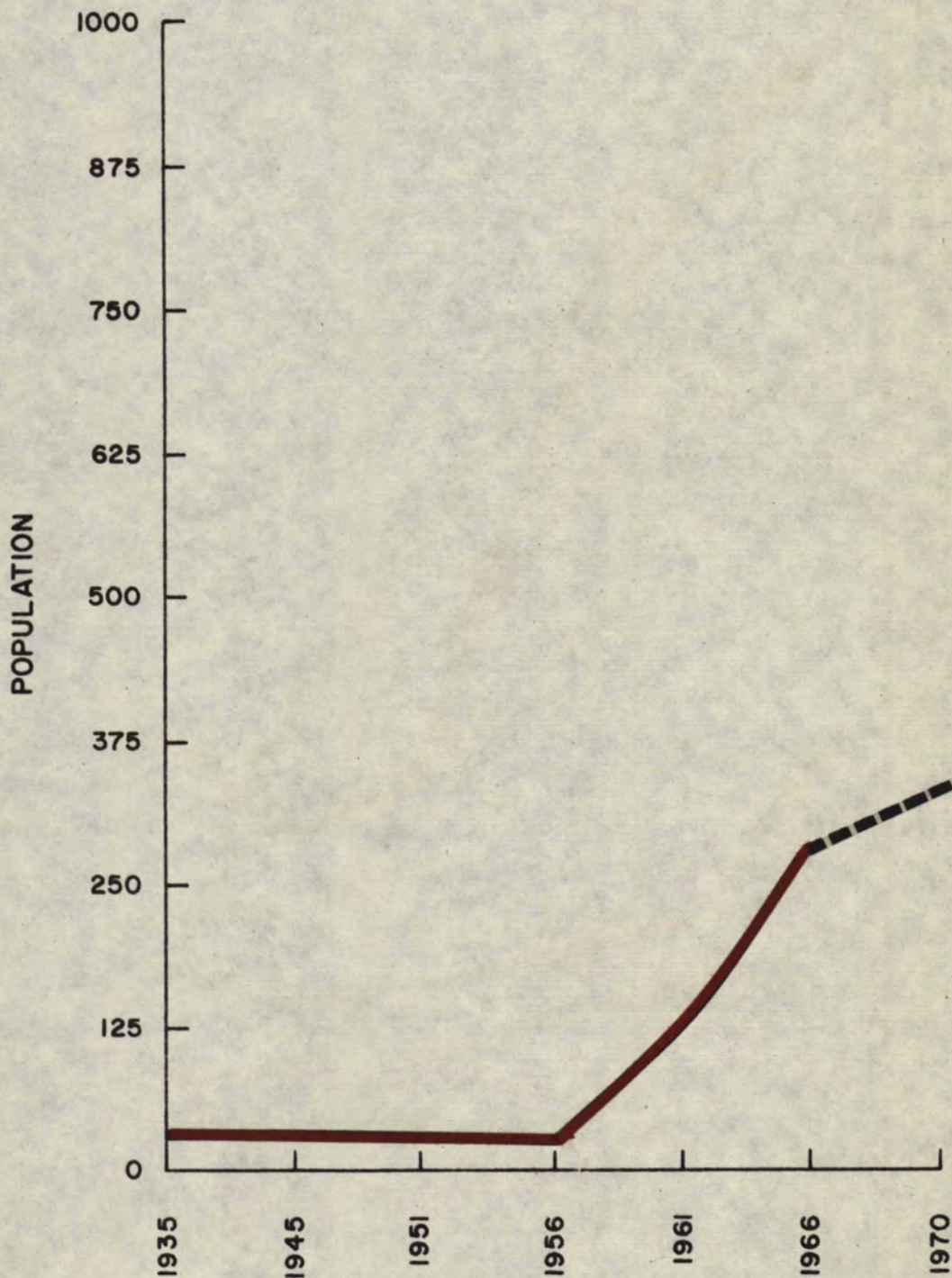
POPULATION TRENDS

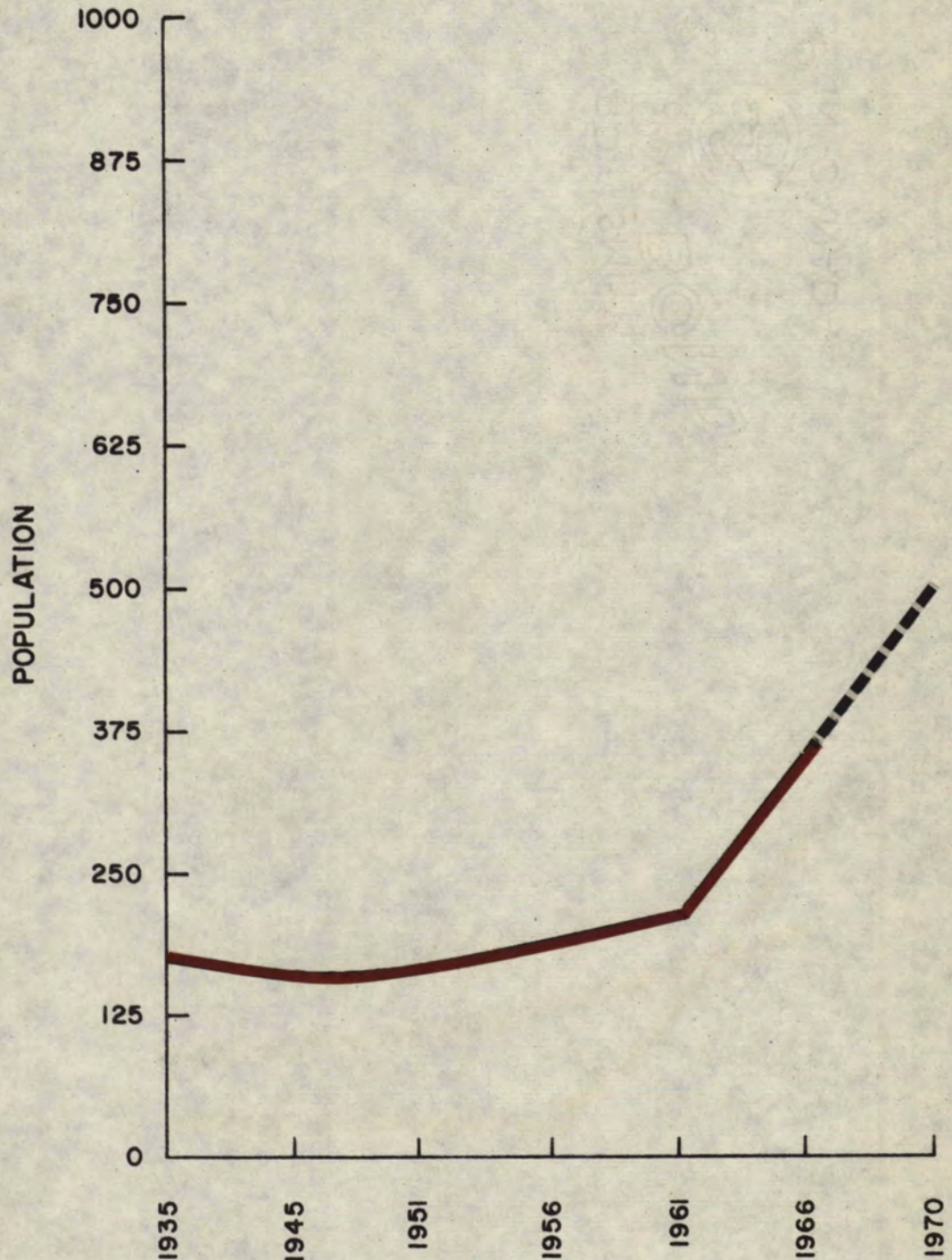
POPULATION TRENDS 1935-1970

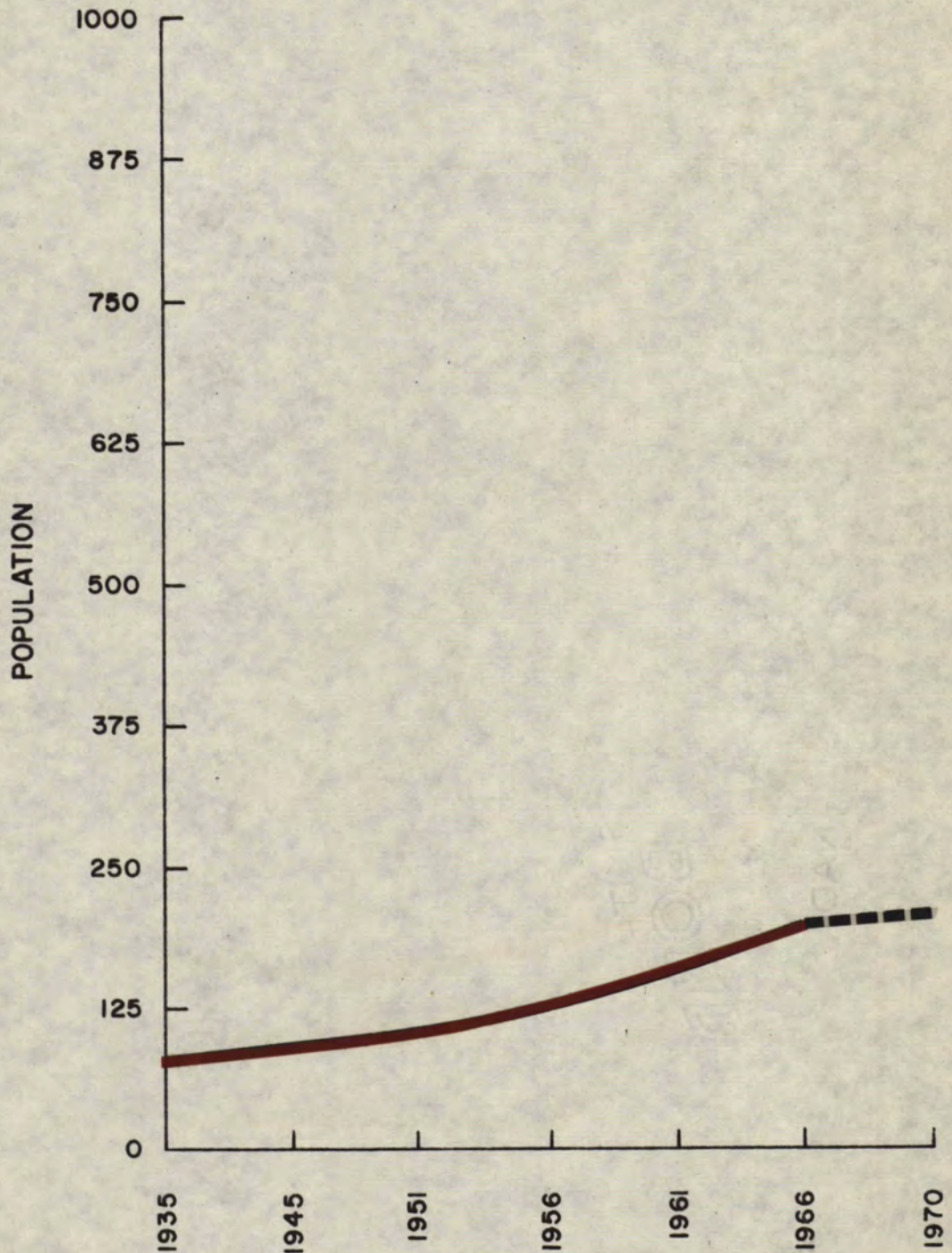
POPULATION TRENDS 1935-1970 ARNOLD'S COVE NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR

Summary of Education

There are three High Schools in the Placentia Bay Area located at Dunville and Long Harbour (Central High) and Placentia (Regional High).

Five Communities have No School Facilities while ten Communities have an Elementary School and All-Grade Schools are located in five Communities.

Enrollment figures for 1968 in the High Schools show 859 pupils. Total enrollment in the Elementary Schools is shown at 2178 pupils. While enrollment in All-Grade Schools shows 616 pupils registered.

Summary of Medical Facilities

Of the three hospitals servicing the Placentia Bay Area two are located at Placentia and Markland while the hospital at Come By Chance also serves this area.

Ten communities are approximately 0-10 miles from the nearest hospital. Six communities are located approximately 10-20 miles from this facility.

Admiral's Beach is approximately thirty-three miles from a hospital facility but only twelve miles from the nearest doctor. Long Harbour and Admiral's Beach are located over twenty miles from the nearest hospital, while the remaining communities are all within reasonable distance of medical facilities.

Summary of Communications Facilities

The Post Office serves seventeen communities within the study area with daily mail delivery. Mail deliveries are made three times per week to Ship Harbour and four times per week to North Harbour.

Dial Phone Service is offered in fifteen communities while the Telegraph provides the only service for the remaining four communities.

Ferry Service to and from Argentia is scheduled twice per week on a year-round basis.

Television Coverage both C.B.C. and Private is available to all residents of the area. Seven communities are within the Grade A Contour (Excellent Viewing), while the remaining twelve communities lie within the Grade B Contour (Medium Coverage).

Summary of Mobility Trends

Arnold's Cove showed the greatest influx of households resettled for the period ending September 30, 1969. (134 households).

Southern Harbour and Freshwater received 71 & 67 households respectively while Placentia with 59 households, Jersey'side and Dunville with 47 & 43 households constitute the majority of resettled families within the study area. Admiral's Beach and Point Verde account for 13 of the households, bringing the total number of families resettled to 434.

Resettlement accounted for an increase of 2,088 in population for this period, an average of 4.8 persons per household.

The population resettled into the study area originated from isolated communities situated on Placentia Bay. These communities are now completely or partially evacuated.
