

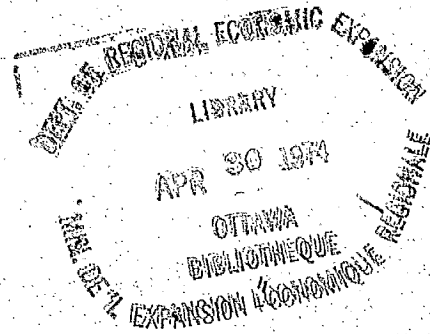



A copy of this report is also being forwarded today air mail special delivery to Mr. Ross Young, Newfoundland Fisheries Development Authority, Newfoundland.

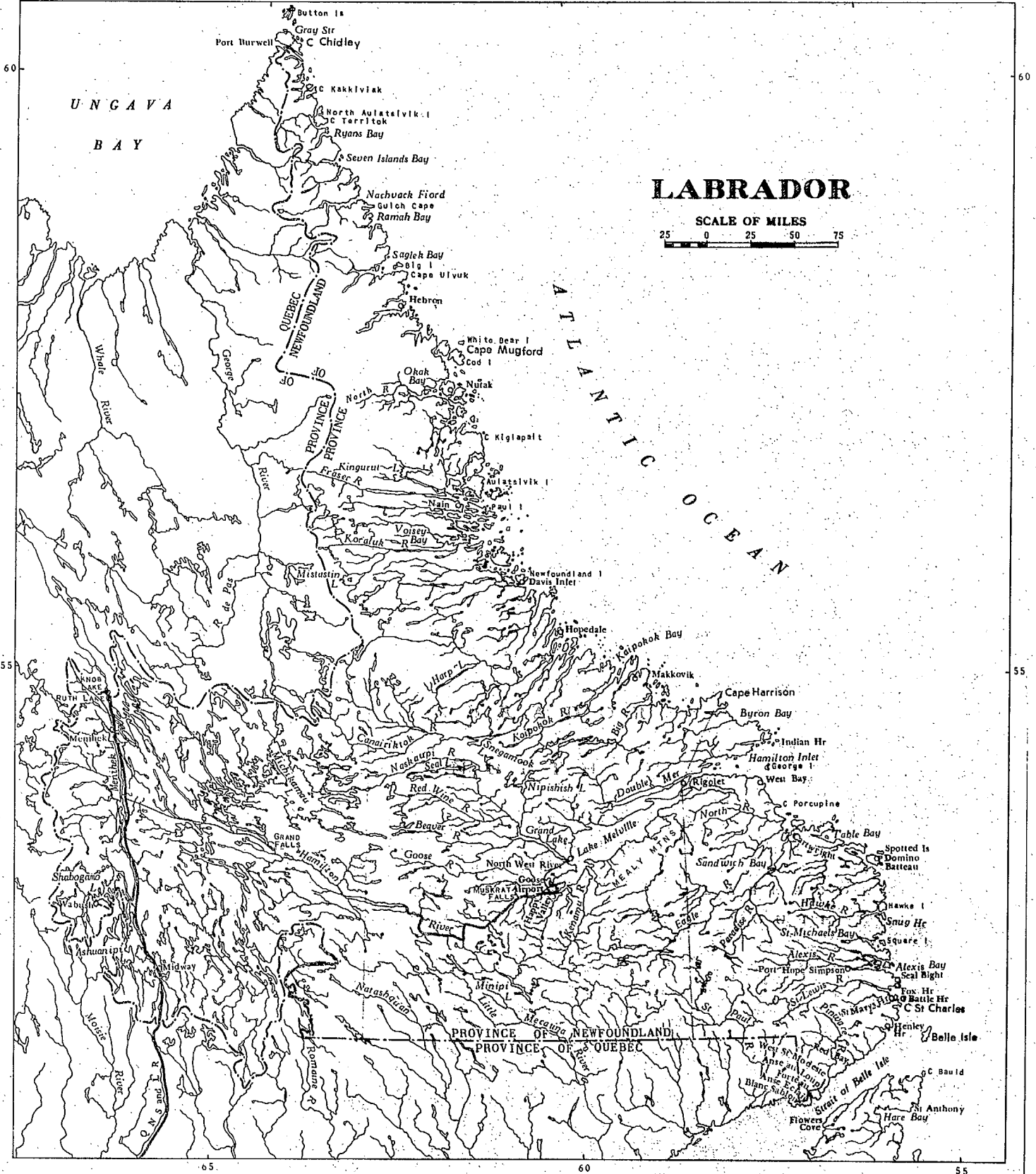

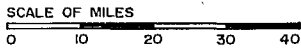

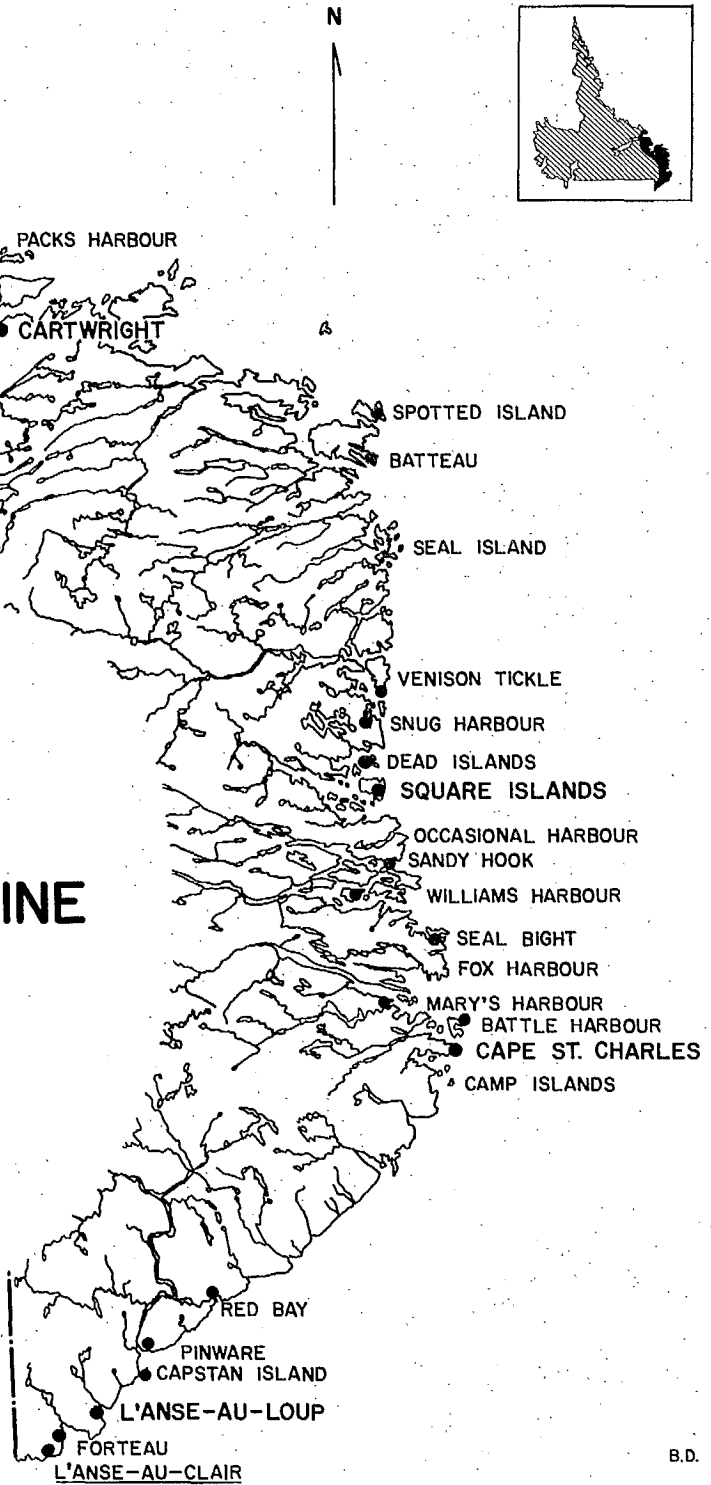

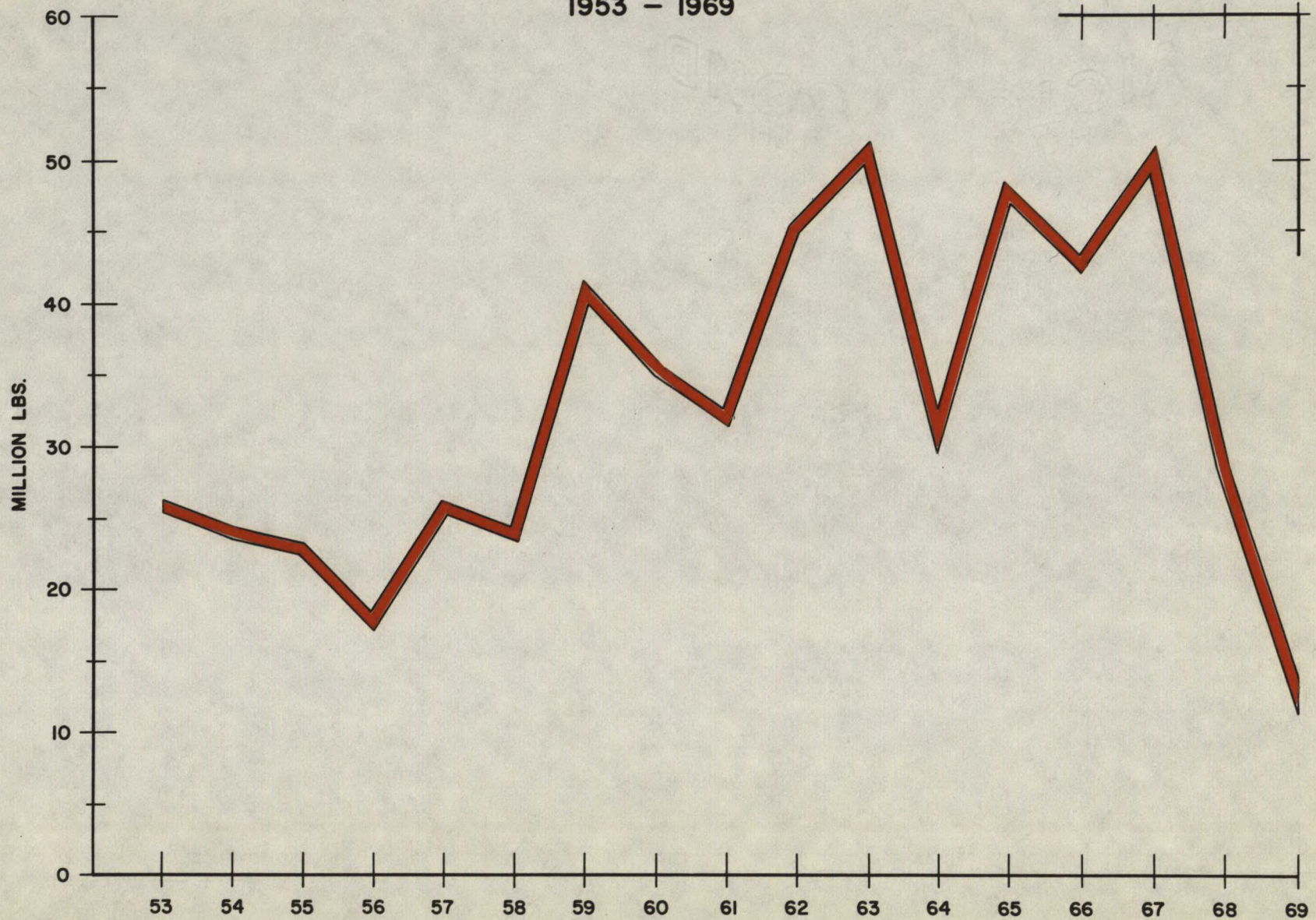

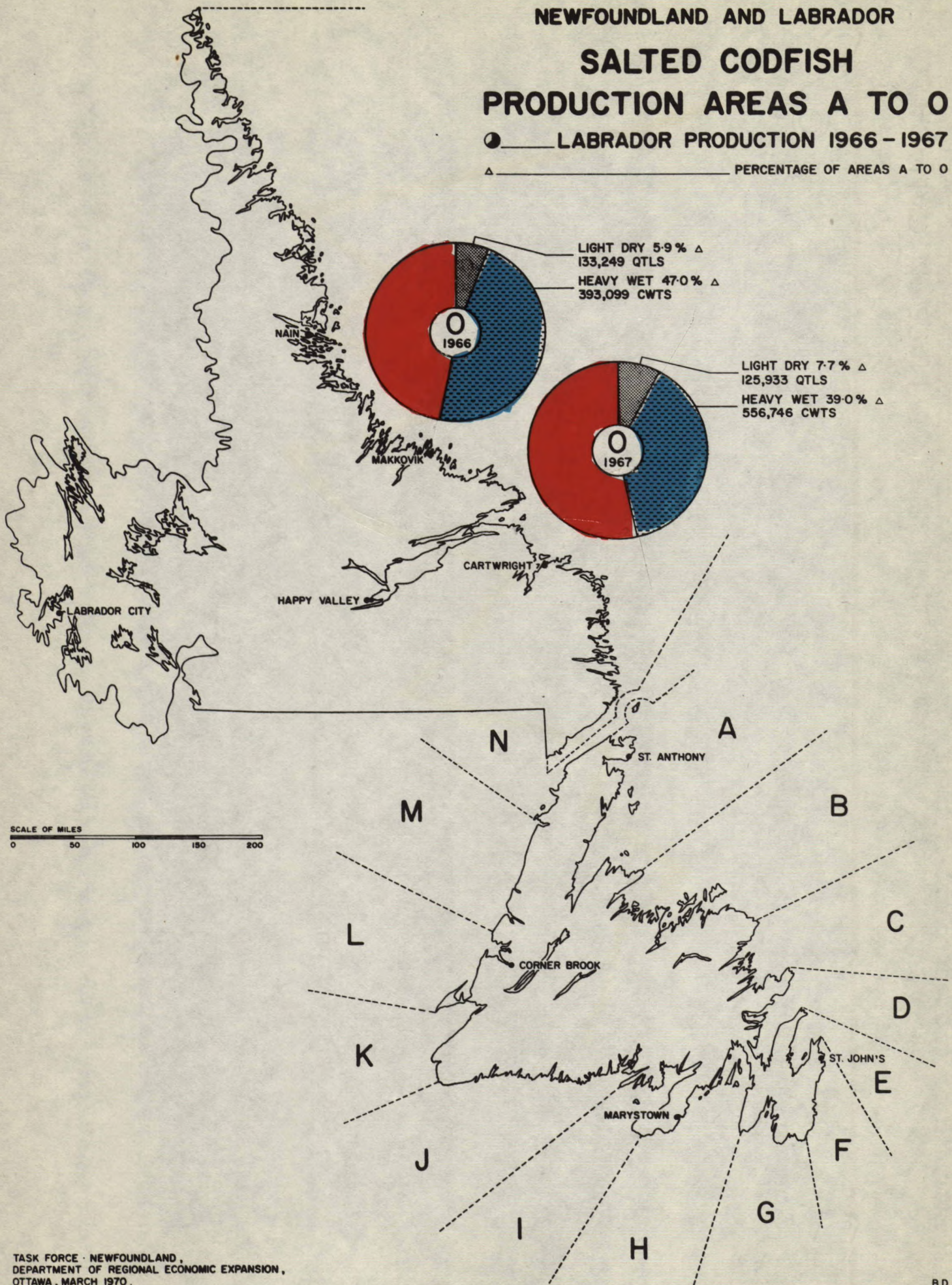

△ PERCENTAGE OF AREAS A TO O



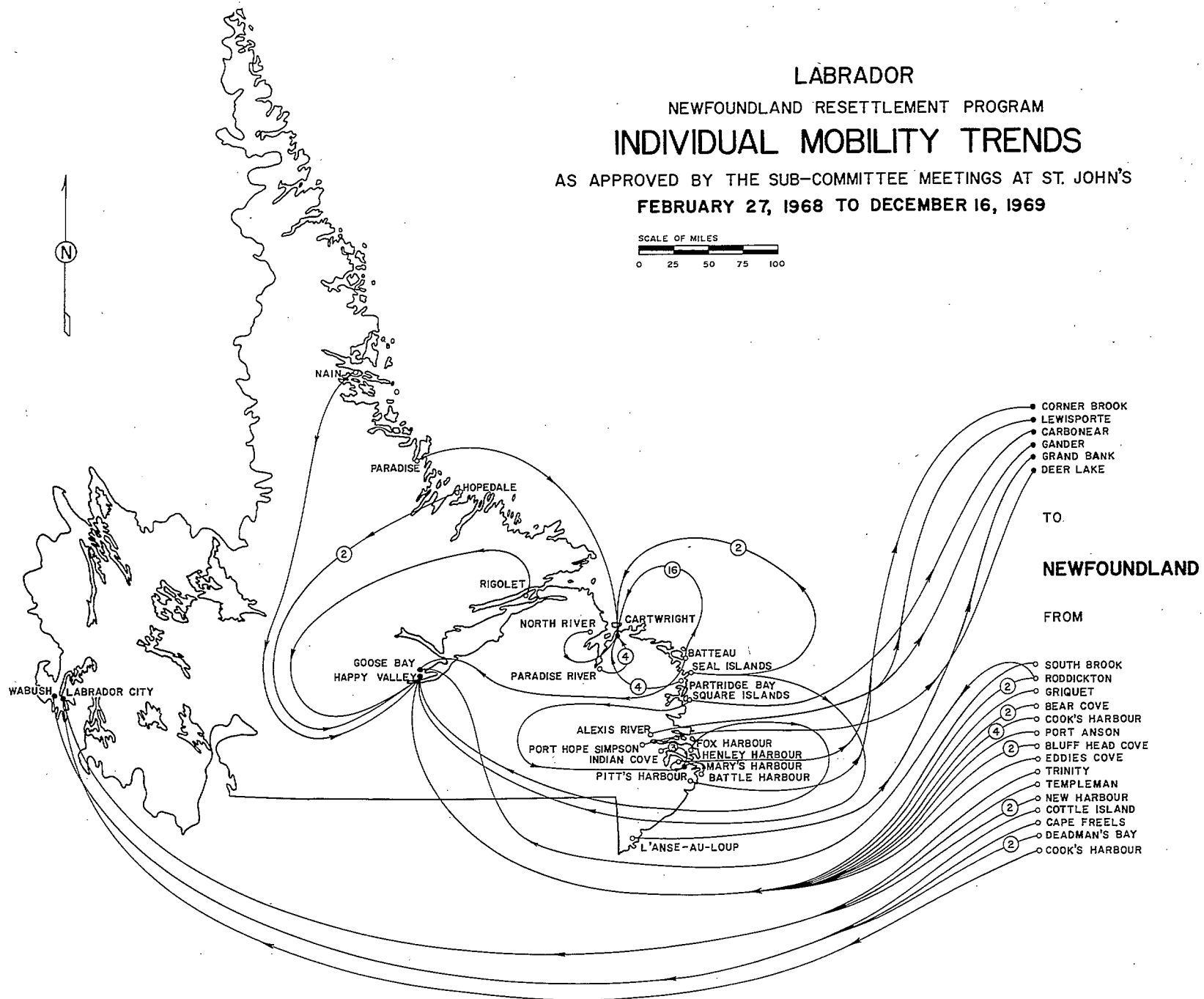
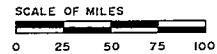

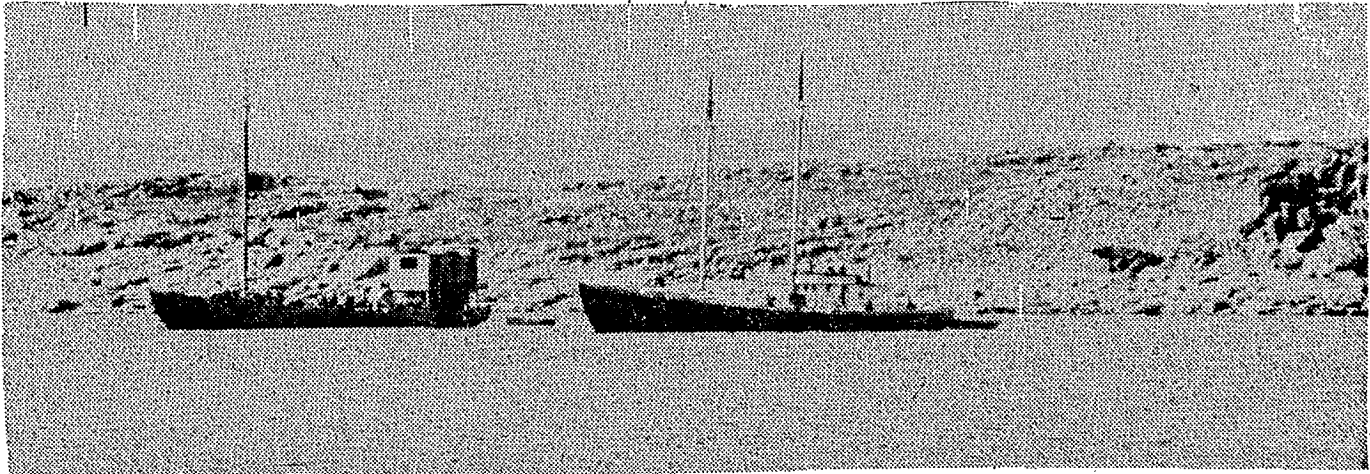

"Floaters" anchored off the coast of Labrador. This year, some fishermen claim, there will be no Labrador inshore fishery unless the government compensate the men for the dismal failure of the fishery last year. A figure of \$500,000 has been mentioned as adequate reimbursement for the hundreds of men who suffered financial loss last season.

Northern fishery hangs in balance as fishermen seek government help

Unless the provincial government financially reimburses fishermen for the failure of the inshore fishery for last year, there probably won't be a fishery along the northern coast in 1970.

This is the feeling of many fishermen who fished the coast last season and experienced one of the worse catches in memory.

Fishermen in Newfoundland have formed committees to bring their plight to the attention of the government. A total figure of \$500,000 in compensation has been mentioned.

Early last month a committee was formed at a meeting at Gander attended by about 70 fishermen, including boat owners and crew members from Bonavista Bay, Notre Dame Bay and Green Bay. Purpose of the meeting was to plot a course of action to be

followed in an attempt to get government reimbursement for their financial losses.

This meeting was a follow-up to a meeting held at Centreville, Bonavista Bay, when about 30 ship owners and crew members formed the Bonavista North Fishermen's Association.

It was disclosed at the meetings that some individual losses incurred by boat owners run as high as \$15,000.

Some Newfoundland fishermen went to the coast during May and fished until sometime in July when many of them quit, declaring the Labrador inshore fishery a complete blank. Other stayed a little longer, but the fishery didn't pick up and disappointed men, counting on the fishing season to buy supplies, food and pay off bills return-

ed to their home and sought other employment.

Some found jobs on the Churchill Falls hydro power project, others were absorbed in the construction industries. Other had no alternative, but to seek relief assistance.

Many of the men coming back last year complained that they didn't earn sufficient money to pay merchants for their fishery supplies. And it came out in the Gander and Centreville meetings that there are cases in which merchants are now pressing the men for payments.

There are three categories of fishermen who prosecute the Labrador inshore fishery. There are the liviers . . . people who live on the coast throughout the year . . . The floaters are fishermen with schooners who search the coast

for the best fishing areas. The planters are men who have their own summer premises and use them during the fishing season.

Many of the planters are brought north by vessels operated by Canadian National.

The fishermen have set no date for their proposed meeting with government officials.

Many explanations have been forwarded for the unusual scarcity of fish on the Labrador coast last summer. One marine scientist said a survey of water temperatures in the area revealed a higher than usual cold layer of water which could affect fish populations and movements.

While the Labrador fishery was a complete failure, vessels operating along the northeast coast of the island of Newfoundland did very well, generally.
