### INTRODUCTION

The Regional Development Incentives Act is intended to create new job opportunities in regions of slow growth. This publication is an attempt to give a visual impression of the effects of the Act while it is still in progress. Two methods are used to present the information: maps, showing the geographic distribution of offers, incentives, and unemployment; and statistical tables showing incentives and unemployment. The tables also provide data, such as number of jobs created, that could not be shown on the maps. The factual data were collected from weekly and monthly reports, and the status reports of the Incentives Division, for the period August 1969 to June 1970.

The unemployment statistics quoted here are those available from the Department of Manpower and Immigration; these are more nearly up-to-date than the latest available from the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. They are, however, based on the Canada Manpower Centres: thus the areas included by the Canada Manpower Centres have to be the basic units for this study, and the Incentives Division data had to be suitably converted.

Most plants receiving Incentives were still in the construction stage, so that the number of jobs actually created to date is unobtainable. The "jobs created" figures quoted here are no more than 5-year projections made by plant managers. Because of this, there is no map of jobs created: all other maps are based on actual statistics, and a map of jobs created could mislead the reader.

The labour force figures provided by the Department of Manpower and Immigration have a possible error factor of 25%, although they are taken from the 1966 Census. However, the unemployment figures are accurate as to the number reporting as out of work at Manpower offices. For the statistical tables, the unemployment <u>high</u> figures are those for April 1970: April is the month of highest unemployment and does not include the student work force. The unemployment <u>low</u> figures are those for October 1969: this was the month of lowest unemployment during the studied period (except for Corner Brook, Newfoundland). Persons in training are not considered to be unemployed for this study. No separation into male (full- and part-time) and female (full- and part-time) unemployed was available except for Quebec. This is published here as a graph.

This study, then, is only a snap report of conditions at one point in the life of the Act. The number of offers accepted, jobs created, and total cash value of incentives, is in constant change. In the month since this survey ended, eighteen new offers were made. By the time of publication, the figures will have changed considerably.







# NEWFOUNDLAND'S, CANADA MANPOWER CENTRES WITHIN THE DESIGNATED REGION




11—ST. JOHN'S 12—GRAND FALLS 13—CORNER BROOK






# UNEMPLOYMENT HIGH IN NEWFOUNDLAND WITHIN THE DESIGNATED REGION (April 1970)

# UNEMPLOYMENT HIGH AS A PERCENTAGE OF NEWFOUNDLAND LABOUR FORCE (April 1970)






## SPECIAL AREAS

#### SPECIAL AREAS

The Regional Development Incentives Act confined incentive grants to certain specific types of industry within the rigid boundaries of the designated region. To alleviate any injustice caused by this rigidity, and allow more kinds of industry to receive the benefits of an incentive grant, special areas were set up both inside and outside the designated region in areas of inadequate employment opportunity.

Special Areas did not conform to the Canada Manpower Centres; therefore, meaningful statistical analysis had to be abandoned. However, the population estimates may be of interest to the reader. To assist further studies, the Department of Manpower and Immigration should be instructed to gather data on special areas.

Since no offers have yet been made in the Special Areas program, only the offers accepted under the Regional Development Incentives Act, but located in special areas, could be included (see Table 1, p.83). All the maps of the individual special areas are not yet prepared, but a map of special areas across Canada is included.


