Other Key Evaluation Findings

- There is a continued need for the International Engagement Program
- The Program is reaching its expected outcomes, but there are **opportunities** to **increase efficiencies**
- Existing **coordination and collaboration** efforts do not sufficiently support the needs of the International Engagement Program and other groups engaged in international activities across the Department
- Greater coordination and collaboration are needed to support the variety of international activities taking place across Fisheries and Oceans Canada and the Canadian Coast Guard
- Strong representation and relationships are key components for influencing international decisions

Recommendations

Develop and implement a process to improve existing coordination and collaboration efforts, with regards to the bilateral and multilateral activities under the International Engagement Program.

Initiate a department-wide process aimed at establishing a strategic vision, based on shared priorities and goals, for all international activities taking place across Fisheries and Oceans Canada and the Canadian Coast Guard.

Establish a process to support the implementation of a department-wide strategic vision for the Department's international work.
