


is one of Canada's largest, longest-lived, freshwater fish species and has special significance to Indigenous Peoples.



In 2017, based on Canada's freshwater biogeographic zones and new genetic information, four related populations (designatable units) were identified as DU1 Western Hudson Bay, DU2 Saskatchewan-Nelson River, DU3 Southern Hudson Bay-James Bay, and DU4 Great Lakes-Upper St. Lawrence.
