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Contracting Policy Notice 2014-3: Updates to the Treasury Board Contracting Policy

Date: July 18, 2014

To: Functional Heads, Finance and Administration of all Departments and Agencies

Subject: Updates to the Treasury Board *Contracting Policy*

Summary

The Treasury Board *Contracting Policy* has been updated to reflect changes previously approved by the Treasury Board, and to make a number of technical corrections.

These updates include:

- A new exceptional contracting limit for Public Works and Government Services
 Canada;
- A new exceptional contracting limit for Shared Services Canada;
- Removal of time-limited/expired exceptional limits; and,
- Corrections to names of policy instruments, names of departments and other typographical errors.

A description of each is provided in Annex A.
