



As of May 15, 2022, there were 70,566 police officers in Canada, 406 more than in 2021. This represents a rate of police strength of 181 officers per 100,000 population, a decrease from 2021.1

Women accounted for 69% of civilian employees, **36%** of special constables and 27% of recruits.

Across Canada, police services received 11.9 million calls

for service.
