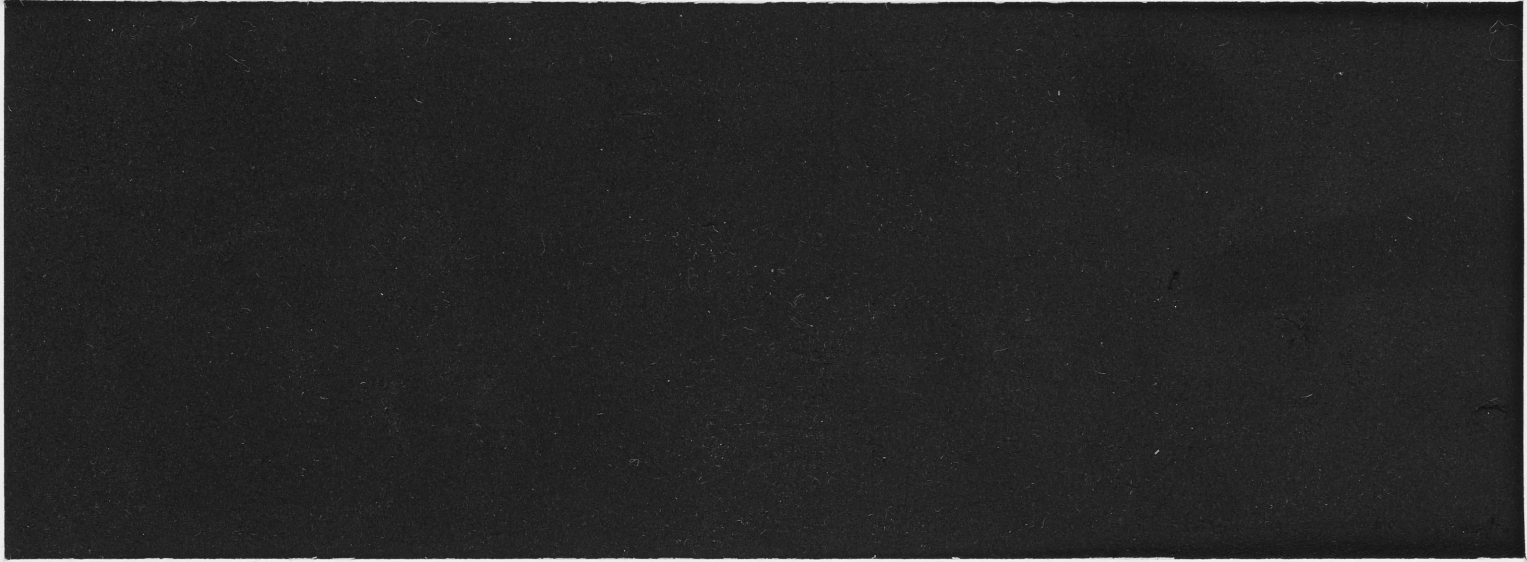

All information collected on the Canadian questionnaire will refer specifically to the travelling party. The person weight will be used to calculate all estimates.

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DEFINITION OF TERMS

International Traveller

The term International Traveller applies to all persons arriving in Canada who are cleared through Customs and Immigration points of entry. Any person may cross into Canada more than once in the same period. The method of collection counts each crossing made. The numbers, therefore, represent number of crossings and not individual travellers.

Resident Traveller

A resident traveller is an International Traveller who resides in Canada and has travelled outside of Canada for a period of less than 12 months, and is returning to Canada through Canada Customs. Foreign citizens, who are residing in Canada and travelling abroad on leave or for other reasons are included.

Person-trip

Each time a Canadian resident travels abroad it is considered a person-trip. The traveller's re-entry is recorded by Canada Customs. The person-trip concludes when the traveller returns to Canada.

Person-night

Each night a Canadian resident spends abroad during a person-trip is considered a person-night.

Visit

Each time a Canadian resident travels to a foreign destination on a trip, they are recorded as making a country or U.S. State visit.

Same-day

Same-day travel encompasses Canadian resident travellers who leave and re-enter Canada in less than 24 hours. This category includes Canadian residents commuting daily to and from work in the United States.

One or More Nights

Travel of one or more nights includes travellers staying at least 24 hours abroad.

Purpose of Trip

The main reason for the trip to Canada is grouped under four main categories:

- . Business
- . Pleasure
- . (VFR) Visiting friends, relatives .
- . Other

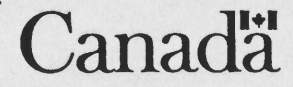

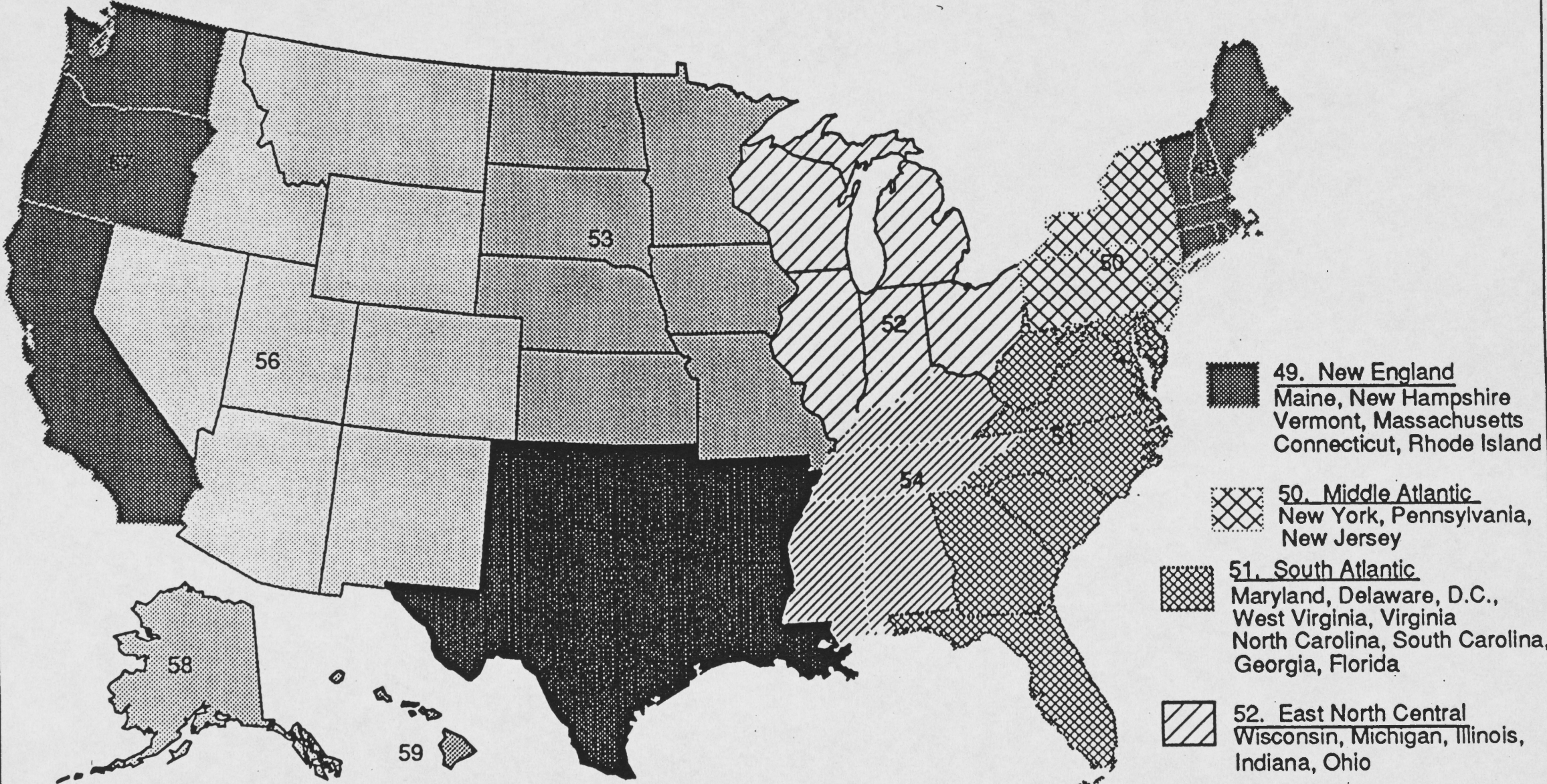

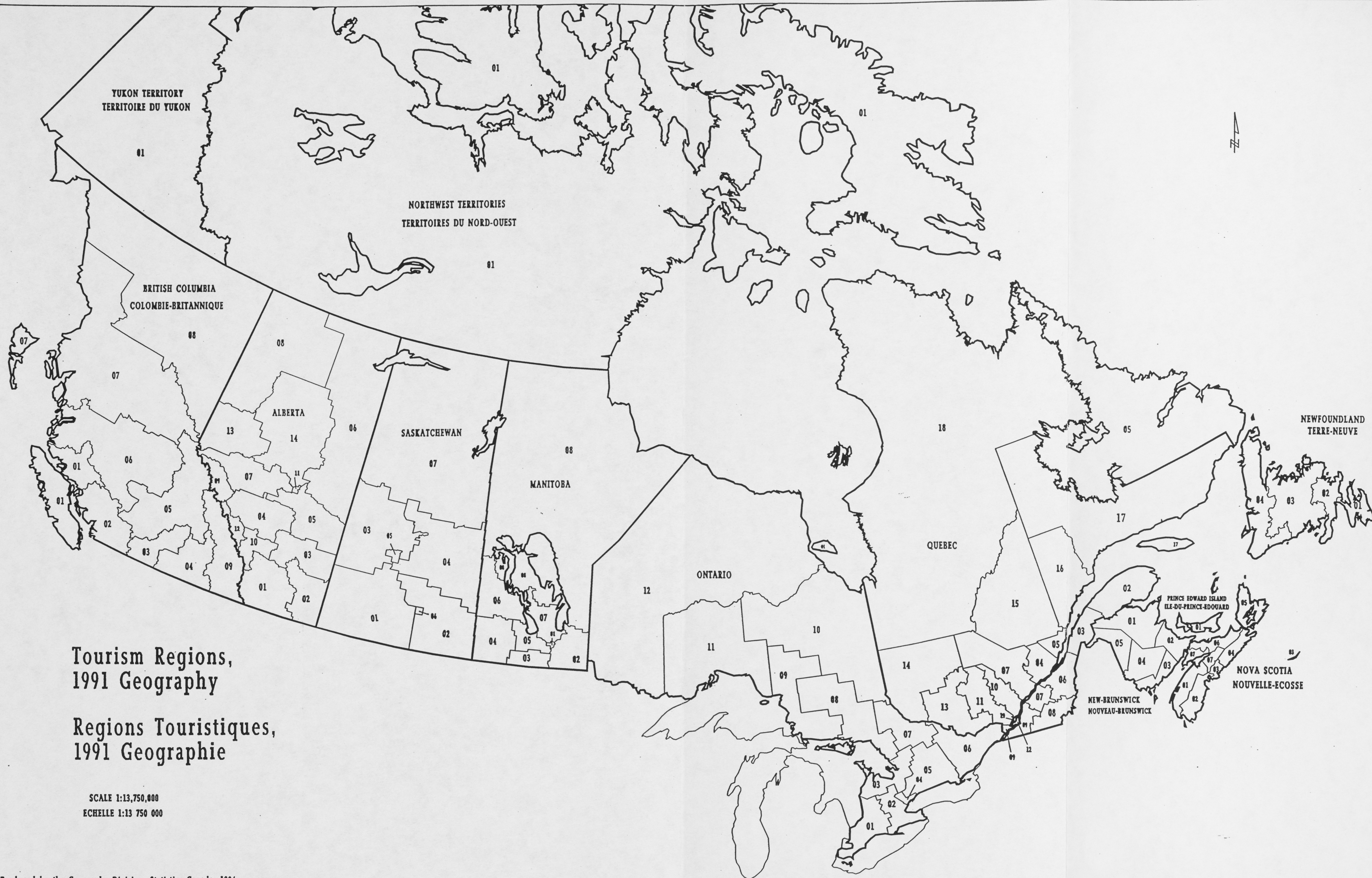
