EVALUATION SUMMARY

\$122.2M is invested annually to help unemployed EI eligible individuals in Newfoundland and Labrador find and maintain employment.

Newfoundland and Labrador designs and delivers programs and services similar to Employment Benefits and Support Measures.

Examined programs and services include Skills Development (including Apprentice Supports), JobsNL, Self-Employment Assistance, Job Creation Partnerships and Employment Assistance Services.

Improved the labour market attachment of active claimants participants (compared to nonparticipants)

Reduced dependence on Employment Insurance and/or Social Assistance Providing Employment Assistance Services early during unemployment claim produced larger impacts

Social benefits of participation exceeded costs of investments for most interventions
