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## Present Federal Government Funding of S&T Associations

#### Introduction

This report was requested in order that some background material be compiled on the present funding of S&T associations by the federal government. At this stage in the review of associations it was desirable that the search for information on funding be restricted to data currently available in the Ministry.

The question of which societies and associations to include in the compilations was deliberately left unanswered in full at the outset in order that a rather more comprehensive listing of organizations be constructed. At a later date the consequences of adopting stricter definitions of S&I associations may then be immediately seen.

The results are presented in two ways. There is an alphabetical listing of "associations" giving the funding department and the support given and a second table of the "associations" supported by each department giving the amount as well. To facilitate further review of this material as much narrative as seemed reasonable was included.

It was suggested by the Research and Information Services that these files might profitably be entered on the EDP facilities of the Ministry making possible additional compilations and restructuring of the order of presentation with a minimum of clerical assistance. For example it would be possible to present a list of all those "associations" receiving support of over \$5,000. The eventual updating or editing of these files is made simpler. These points will have to await decisions regarding the future of the review.

The alphabetical listing of associations is maintained on disc file with the Word Processing Unit of the Ministry. If changes are required they can be made with a minimum of retyping necessary.

#### Highlights of Results

The <u>Public Accounts of Canada</u>, Volume 2, was used as the source of expenditure data for the associations and the fiscal year 1974-75 was chosen.

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- 1. The federal government funded approximately 110 "S&T associations" in Canada for the fiscal year 1974-75 with grants and contributions totalling \$5,542,000.
- 2. The average grant or contribution was just under \$50 thousand (<a href="mailto:mean">mean</a> value of grant was \$49,482) while there were half of the "S&T associations" who received less than \$13,500 (<a href="median">median</a> value of grants).
- 3. The aggregation of associations in terms of value of grants shows 29% of the associations receive not more than \$5,000. (See Table 3)

## 2. Methodological Problems and Procedures:

#### 2.1 Sources

The only readily available sources of expenditure data for all government departments and agencies that offer a consistent and comparable base are the budgetary accounts of the federal government either the <a href="ESTIMATES">ESTIMATES</a>
("Blue Book"), or the <a href="Public Accounts of Canada">Public Accounts of Canada</a>, Volume 2, Details of Expenditure and Revenue. The latter is preferable since it reflects the amounts actually expended.

To check on a particular organization as to its area of concern, location etc. we have only two sources and these are: Directory of Associations in Canada, edited by Brian Land, University of Toronto Press, and Corpus Almanac of Canada, edited by Margot Fawcett Corpus Publishers Services Limited. The former is preferable but neither contains any reference to sources of funding and only a general reference to the subject index. The only use of either publication at this stage is to look up an association mentioned in the Public Accounts to see if it is listed. If later, however, one wishes to contact associations and make further inquiries they should prove invaluable for addresses and phone numbers.

One further source of information which can be used at the present time is annual reports of departments and agencies to attempt to locate a reference to the funding of a particular society and perhaps its purpose and major area of interest. This, however, is a rather "hit and miss" procedure.

# Where to find the starting points

PRACKING down inforin mation on associations can be time-consuming and often frustrating since this type of data can be located only from widely scattered sources. Pinpointing the sources is the problem — a problem overcome by Brian Land's Directory of Associations in Canada. The 1975 edition, just off the press, should prove invaluable to researchers, government officials, businessmen, librarians and others who need to know where to go for information on these organizations.

It provides an alphabetical listing of more than 9,300 associations serving

the interests of the general public, the arts, business, industry, trade, labor, and the professions. Cross-references are used to link the two corporate names of a bilingual association.

Mailing addresses are

provided along with the names of officials to be contacted.

A special feature is the subject index which classifies associations by principal service or type of activity. A separate alphabetical guide to this index is also included.

The list of active associations in Canada includes national, interprovincial, provincial, regional, metropolitan and local, as well as international and foreign associations that maintain offices or branches in Canada. Also included are a number of other nonprofit organizations — foundations, marketing boards, and research institutes.

#### 2.2 Definition of an S&T Association

In examining the grants and contributions listed in the Public Accounts one can propose no fewer than eight types of bodies which may be eligible for inclusion in the category "S&T association". They are:

- 1) associations
- 2) institutes
- 3) councils
- 4) societies
- 5) foundations
- 6) federations
  - ) acadamies
- 8) miscellaneous. . . Canadian Chamber of Commerce Agriculture for Young Canadians

To further compound the definitional problem even these eight categories are not rigidly defined and the terms have no uniform legal basis.

Since it seems impossible to base the inclusion criteria strictly on some "label" chosen from the above eight, the following broad suggestions for inclusion are made.

## Defining "Associations or Societies"

In the book "Directory of Associations in Canada" by Brian Land the following definition was used.

An association is defined as. . .

"a voluntary, non-governmental, non-profit organization composed of personal or institutional members with or without a federal or provincial charter formed for some particular purpose or to advance a common cause especially of a public nature."

It is proposed to retain these aspects of the above definition

- a) non-governmental
- b) non-profit
- c) personal or institutional members

#### and to add

- d) concerned with the field of science and technology (both human and natural sciences)
- e) whose activities are primarily conducted or based in Canada.

## "Some Particular Problems for Inclusion/Exclusion"

Excluded here are - International bodies

- Research Institutes associated with universities
- Committees of various Congresses and Conferences,
- Contributions to international funds.

## Notes:

The grants, contributions and transfer payments of the Department of Agriculture deal mainly with contributions in accordance with agreements with various provinces for assistance to farmers.

Excluded from the above list are several contributions of funds for Canada's membership in international organizations (5 organizations, \$19,000). Contributions of \$438,000 to the Commonwealth Agricultural Bureaux are also excluded since it is not a national organization.

There are significant funds granted to agricultural fairs and agribitions, agricultural museums etc. These have not been included.

\$850,000 is given in 1974-75 to universities and other scientific organizations in Canada in aid of agricultural research. Some of these other organizations may be of interest here but it is not possible to identify them separately.

Department of COMMUNICATIONS:

Fiscal Year 1974-75

There are no appropriate associations listed in the Public Accounts as receiving support from Communications.

There is a grant of \$11,000 to the Canadian Radio Technical Planning Board, but it is not included in S&T associations.

Communications also pays a share of the cost of international radio, telephone and telegraph organizations but as is the case with the Department of Agriculture it is excluded here. It amounts of \$772,000 in 1974-75.

## Department of Consumer and Corporate Affairs: Fiscal Year 1974-75

There are no appropriate associations specifically mentioned in the Public Accounts for this department.

However, \$615,000 is given to various consumer organizations under the Consumer Affairs program. Some associations may be included in here but a search of departmental sources would be required to ascertain which ones.
