


CANADIAN MARKET OPPORTUNITIES - IMPORT PROFILE

FANS, VENTILATORS AND THEIR PARTS

INTRODUCTION

This report is one of a continuing series designed to increase business awareness of the potential existing in the Canadian marketpiace for domestic production and to stimulate Canadian business to explore further potential market opportunities in Canada. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of manufacturing or competing in a particular market and should be treated as an indicator or starting point for the manufacturer or entrepreneur.

A - IMPORT TRENDS OF FANS, VENTILATORS AND THEIR PARTS



From 1981 to 1984 imports of fans, ventilators and their parts increased at an average annual rate of 21 per cent in terms of quantity and of 5 per cent in terms of dollar value.

This import class includes ceiling fans, roof ventilators and fans, exhaust fans and their parts. It does not include electric portable fans and air circulators (commodity code 697-62) imports of which totalled 632 190 units valued at \$10.6 million in 1984, or industrial fans for permanent installation (commodity codes 507-99-31 to 507-99-39) imports of which were valued at \$8 million during 1984.

During 1984 imports totalled 461 095 units valued at \$29.2 million which was an increase of 32 per cent in value and 100 per cent in quantity from 1983. Average unit prices during the period 1981 to 1983 ranged from \$96 to \$106. The average unit price in 1984 was much lower at \$63.42. However, unit prices ranged from \$39.00 for imports from Hong Kong to \$156.26 for imports from the Netherlands. The variation in unit prices is due to the wide variety of equipment included in this group. The United States has consistently been the major exporter to Canada, accounting for 31 per cent of the quantity and 57 per cent of the value in 1984, followed by Taiwan with 35 per cent and 22 per cent respectively.

The 10 major importers accounted for 51 per cent of the total imports for 1984. Five of these firms were identified as manufacturers and five as wholesalers. Seven of the companies are located in Ontario and three in Quebec.

There were approximately 361 importers of fans, ventilators and their parts during 1984. The top 40 importers accounted for 72 per cent or \$30 million of the total imports. Of these 40, 14 were identified as importers who were manufacturers, with their total imports representing 29 per cent of the import total. The majority of these manufacturers (64 per cent) were located in Ontarlo. Eighteen of the 40 major importers were identified as wholesalers, their total imports representing 33 per cent of the import total.

E - CANADIAN PRODUCTION

There are at least 31 manufacturers of fans, ventilators and their parts in Canada. Three companies are located in British Columbia, eight in Manitoba, 15 in Ontario and five in Quebec. Statistics Canada reports that shipments of all types of non-industrial electric fans totalled 749 869 units with a value of \$18.2 million in 1982, the latest year for which information is available.

F - EXPORTS

Statistics Canada includes data on exports of fans and ventilators in the class "Electrical equipment, appliances and parts, not elsewhere specified," exports of which totalled \$20.5 million in 1984.

H - FEDERAL GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENTS

The Department of Supply and Services reports that federal government purchases of centrifugal, circulating (domestic), exhaust (domestic), and portable office fans during the period April 1984 to March 1985 amounted to \$241 000.

I - MARKET SUMMARY

The Canadian fan and ventilation industry manufactures a wide range of axial, centrifugal, portable, and permanently-installed fan units with a broad performance spectrum.

Growth in the market for fan and ventilation equipment during the past decade has resulted from a number of factors, including more rigid pollution control regulations, and the construction industry's transition to energy-efficient home designs which require forced ventilation.

Industry shipments of the fan and ventilation industry are expected to increase during the 1985-1990 period at an annual rate of 5 per cent (in constant dollar terms). This anticipated rate of growth in demand, along with the fact that imported quantities of fan and ventilator units represent approximately 50 per cent of Canadian unit shipments, indicate that potential opportunities exist for Canadian companies to manufacture new products as part of an overall sector import replacement activity.
