
CANADIAN MARKET OPPORTUNITIES - IMPORT PROFILE WHEELCHAIRS, INVALID CHAIRS, AND PARTS

INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This report is one of a continuing series designed to increase business awareness of the potential existing for domestic production and to stimulate Canadian business to further explore potential opportunities in both the Canadian and export markets. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of manufacturing or competing in a particular market and should be treated as an indicator or starting point for the manufacturer or entrepreneur.

This report covers imports of Wheelchairs, Invalid Chairs and Parts, Canadian International Trade Classification (C.I.T.C.) code 885-71. It includes powered chairs, three-wheeled scooters and parts.

IMPORT TRENDS: OVERVIEW



Parts for Wheel Chairs and Invalid Chairs

Wheel Chairs and Invalid Chairs

Combined imports of wheelchairs, invalid chairs, and parts have risen steadily from \$5.2 million in 1982 to \$15.6 million in 1985, an average annual growth rate of 44 per cent. However, the imports of chairs grew at a moderate rate of 19 per cent, while those of parts increased at a much faster rate (60 per cent per year). Imports of parts accounted for 74 per cent of the combined value of imports in 1985.

In 1985, combined imports of wheelchairs, invalid chairs and parts totalled \$15.6 million, an increase of 57 per cent when compared to those of 1984. The large increase in combined imports of these products in 1985 can be attributed to a \$5.4 million increase in parts, when compared to imports for 1984. Imports of parts have increased from 54 per cent of combined imports in 1982, to 74 per cent of combined imports in 1985.

The United States was the major source of imports of wheelchairs, invalid chairs and parts, during the four-year period. However, its share of imports declined significantly; it decreased from 92 per cent of the combined value of imports in 1982, to 51 per cent in 1985. In the meantime, Switzerland's share of imports has risen from 0.5 per cent in 1982 to 29 per cent in 1985.

The United States has consistently been the major exporter of wheelchairs and invalid chairs to Canada, accounting for 62 per cent of the quantity and 80 per cent of the total value of imports in 1985 (down from 90 and 96 per cent respectively, in 1982). The second largest exporter of those types of chairs to Canada was France with 11 per cent of the value, and Taiwan with 22 per cent of the volume.

In 1985, the average unit price for wheelchairs and invalid chairs was \$467 per chair. Wheelchairs and invalid chairs from Taiwan had the lowest average unit price of \$110 per unit. The average unit price for the chairs from the United States, which was the highest in 1985, has fluctuated from a high of \$690 in 1984, to a low of \$624 in 1982.



Imports of parts for wheelchairs and invalid chairs have risen steadily from \$2.8 million in 1982 to \$11.6 million in 1985, at an average annual growth rate of 60 per cent. The value of imports for 1985 was almost double that for 1984.


Although the United States has been the largest exporter of parts for wheelchairs and invalid chairs to Canada in the 4-year period, it lost considerable grounds to other countries. The United States share of those imports, which was 89 per cent of Canadian imports of parts for those chairs in 1982, shrank to 41 per cent in 1985. On the other hand, imports of parts from Switzerland, which accounted for less than 1 per cent of imports of parts in 1982, represented 40 per cent of those imports in 1985. Imports of parts from Portugal and Taiwan were insignificant prior to 1984, but rose to 5 and 10 per cent of the imports in 1985, respectively.

The 10 major importers of wheelchairs, invalid chairs, and parts accounted for 78 per cent of total imports for 1985. Of these 10, four were manufacturers of orthopedic, prosthetic and surgical appliances and supplies, and accounted for \$8.8 million of imports of chairs and parts. Eight of those 10 major importers were located in Ontario. (For individual figures see page 9 and 10.)

There were at least 87 importers of wheelchairs and invalid chairs, including powered chairs, in 1985. The top 20 importers of those types of chairs accounted for \$2.9 million, or 74 per cent of imports. Nine of the wholesalers were wholesalers of professional equipment and supplies.

There were at least 121 importers of parts for wheelchairs during 1985. The top 16 importers accounted for \$10.4 million, or 90 per cent of imports. Of the six importers classified as manufacturers, three were manufacturers of orthepedic, prosthetic and surgical appliances and supplies; these importers accounted for \$7.7 million or 67 per cent of total imports. Five of the wholesalers were wholesalers of professional equipment and supplies.

CANADIAN PRODUCTION

There are at least three Canadian manufacturers of wheelchairs and invalid chairs, including powered chairs, and several manufacturers of various parts. Statistics Canada does not report separate data for wheelchairs and parts.

EXPORTS

Canadian manufacturers indicate they currently export, but Statistics Canada does not publish separate data on exports of wheelchairs.

DEPARTMENT OF SUPPLY AND SERVICES PROCUREMENTS

The Department of Supply and Services reports that the federal government purchased \$59 000 worth of wheelchairs during the period of July 1985 to June 1986.

NOTE: This figure is for purchases by the Oepartment of Supply and Services only, and may not include some purchases by other federal government departments.

MARKET SUMMARY

It is anticipated that the wheelchair market will experience some growth over the coming years. The first factor contributing to this growth is the aging population resulting in more people requiring mobility aids, such as wheelchairs. Another factor is the focus on rehabilitation. While previously a disabled person may have remained in an institution, or even bed-ridden, rehabilitation has enabled them to become more mobile, to join the work force and to participate in sports. This has increased, and will probably continue to increase, the market for wheelchairs.

while the market has grown, the nature of the market is also changing. Previously, the market was predominantly "institutional." The industry is now starting to focus on the market emanating from the individuals who have achieved economic independence. As a result, increased demand has been observed in the market for lighter, more aesthetically pleasing models of wheelchairs. Demand for specialized chairs, such as sportschairs, has also increased. Dependability and after-sales service will continue to be important criteria for the consumer in the selection of a chair.

Although the major portion of the Canadian wheelchair market is held by a small number of major companies, the change in product use and purchasers' requirements will give rise to areas of potential opportunity for current and prospective Canadian producers. Product modification through the use of new materials and designs should increase this potential.
