#### INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This report is one of a continuing series designed to increase business awareness of the potential existing for domestic production and to stimulate Canadian business to further explore potential opportunities in both the Canadian and export markets. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of manufacturing or competing in a particular market and should be treated as an indicator or starting point for the manufacturer or entrepreneur.

Imports of colour television receiving sets (hereinafter referred to as T.V. sets) are found under 10 import commodity codes (Canadian International Trade Classification). Most of the imports (95 per cent) are classified in four import commodity codes which make up the bulk of this report. The other six import commodity codes include imports of combination T.V. sets and kits. Imports of combination T.V. sets and kits are detailed in Appendix A of this report. Information on imports of chassis for T.V. sets is detailed in Appendix B, and can be used to estimate the volume of the Canadian production of T.V. sets. This report does not include imports of black and white television receiving sets, which totalled \$7.5 million in 1985.

Other related products are examined in the published import profile, Video Cassette Recorders (VCR's), Number 64-86.



In 1985, imports to Canada of T.V. sets amounted to 767 300 units, valued at \$215 million. The majority of imports (54 per cent by quantity and 65 per cent by value) consisted of T.V. sets, over 19 inches (C.I.T.C. 637-14-21). The second major group of imports was made of T.V. sets in the 10- to 18-inch range (C.I.T.C. 637-11-22), which accounted for 36 per cent of the volume and 25 per cent of the value of imports of T.V. sets.


Imports of T.V. sets experienced a high rate of growth from 1982 through 1984. In 1985, the volume and value of imports of T.V. sets declined seven per cent and 10 per cent, respectively, when compared to 1984. However, imports of T.V. sets, under 10 inches, continued to increase at a strong pace in 1985, when compared to 1984. The decrease in imports of 19-inch T.V. sets began in 1983.

With the exception of T.V. sets, under 10 inches, the average unit price for each category of T.V. sets has shown a clear downward trend during the 1982-1985 period.

The United States was the dominant source of imports of all sizes of T.V. sets, in terms of value, while the Republic of Korea was the largest exporter to Canada of T.V. sets, in terms of volume. In 1985, imports of T.V. sets from the United States accounted for 37 per cent of the value and 25 per cent of the volume of imports. The Republic of Korea supplied 29 per cent of the quantity, and only 20 per cent of the value, of T.V. sets imported to Canada.

Between 1982 and 1985, Japan dominated the imports of T.V. sets, under 10 inches. In 1985, it had 50 per cent of the volume and 57 per cent of the value of the import market for small T.V. sets. The second major exporter to Canada of small T.V. sets was Taiwan, which supplied 30 per cent of the volume and 24 per cent of the value of Canada's imports. It is worth noting that Taiwan's share of Canadian imports declined significantly, when compared to 1984.

In 1985, the average price for small T.V. sets was \$233 per unit. However, the average prices ranged from \$186 per unit for T.V. sets from the Republic of Korea to \$269 per unit for those imported from Japan.

In 1984, the 10 major importers of T.V. sets, under 10 inches, accounted for \$3.6 million, or 91 per cent of the value, of imports of small T.V. sets. Nine of these major importers were located in Ontario.



In 1984, there were 19 known importers of T.V. sets, under 10 inches. The top 13 importers accounted for \$3.9 million, or over 99 per cent of the value of those imports. Three of the top 13 importers, which imported \$1.5 million of small T.V. sets, manufactured T.V. sets in Canada. Nine of the 13 major importers were wholesalers of electrical household appliances, which accounted for 59 per cent of the imports. Seven of those wholesalers were subsidiaries of multinational firms, which manufactured T.V. sets in foreign countries.

Between 1982 and 1985, the Republic of Korea displaced Japan as the major source of Canada's imports of intermediate T.V. sets. Imports of intermediate T.V. sets from the Republic of Korea increased from 23 889 units in 1982, to 104 468 units in 1985. In that year, they accounted for 38 per cent of the volume of those imports. Imports of that category of T.V. sets from Japan amounted to 77 427 units, or 28 per cent of the volume of Canadian imports. During the four-year period, Singapore and Malaysia have become important suppliers of intermediate T.V. sets.

In 1985, the average price for intermediate T.V. sets was \$194 per unit. However, the average prices ranged from \$171 per unit for T.V. sets from the Republic of Korea to \$218 per unit for those imported from Japan. The average unit price has declined steadily in the four-year period.

In 1984, the top 10 importers of T.V. sets, 10 to 18 inches, accounted for \$44.5 million, or 72 per cent, of the imports of intermediate T.V. sets. Of the top 10 importers, eight were wholesalers of electrical household appliances, which accounted for 59 per cent of the value of imports of this category of T.V. sets. At least five of the wholesalers were subsidiaires of multinational companies, which generated \$20.9 million worth of imports.



In 1984, there were 60 known importers of intermediate T.V. sets. The top 20 importers accounted for \$58 million, or 94 per cent, of those imports. Twelve of these top 20 importers were wholesalers which generated 68 per cent of the value of imports. Seven of the 12 wholesalers were subsidiairies of multinational companies, which accounted for 40 per cent of the imports.

Between 1983 and 1985, imports of 19-inch T.V. sets decreased significantly. In 1985, imports of 19-inch T.V. sets totalled 21 516 units, valued at \$7.7 million. The decrease in the volume of imports of T.V. sets was 28 per cent, while the decline in the value of imports was 41 per cent, when compared to 1984. The decline in imports was due mainly to a technical modification in the manufacture of 19-inch T.V. sets. As a result of that modification, most imports of 19-inch T.V. sets were, and continue to be, recorded as imports of 20-inch T.V. sets.

Between 1982 and 1985, the United States dominated Canada's imports of 19-inch T.V. sets. In 1985, imports from the U.S.A. amounted to 17 315 T.V. sets, valued at \$6.5 million. These imports accounted for 81 per cent of the volume, and 84 per cent of the value, of the import market. Japan, Taiwan and the Republic of Korea were the other principal exporters to Canada of 19-inch T.V. sets.

In 1985, the average price for 19-inch T.V. sets was \$358 per unit. However, the average prices varied from \$207 per unit for those from the Republic of Korea to \$425 per unit for those imported from Japan. The average unit price for 19-inch T.V. sets has declined consistently since 1982.



In 1984, there were 51 known importers of 19-inch T.V. sets. Six of the 10 major importers were wholesalers of electronic products, whose imports represented \$10.5 million, or 81 per cent of the value, of imports. Four of the six wholesalers were subsidiaries of multinational companies, which accounted for \$9.7 million of the imports of this size of T.V. sets.

Between 1982 and 1985, the United States was the largest exporter to Canada of T.V. sets, over 19 inches. However, its share of the volume of Canada's imports of large T.V. sets decreased from 60 per cent in 1982, to 40 per cent in 1985. The U.S. share of the Canadian import market decreased principally at the expense of an increase in the Republic of Korea's share. The Republic of Korea supplanted Japan as the second exporter to Canada of large T.V. sets.

In 1985, the average price for large T.V. sets was \$341 per unit. However, the average prices varied from a low of \$224 per unit for those from the Republic of Korea, to a high of \$425 per unit for those from the United States. The average unit price for large T.V. sets has declined through the four-year period.

In 1984, there were 75 known importers of T.V. sets, over 19 inches. The top 15 importers accounted for \$138 million, or 91 per cent, of the imports of large T.V. sets. Eleven of these top 15 importers were wholesalers of electronic products, whose imports represented 71 per cent of the value of imports. Seven of the wholesalers were subsidiairies of multinational firms, which manufactured T.V. sets in foreign countries. The seven wholesalers accounted for 55 per cent of Canada's imports of large T.V. sets.

#### CANADIAN PRODUCTION

There are five assemblers of colour television receiving sets in Canada. In this report, shipment and market estimates are based on figures obtained from a report on T.V. sets from the Tariff Board. According to the report, the Canadian production of T.V. sets totalled 696 000 units and had a value of \$263 million in 1984. Canada does not manufacture black and white television receiving sets.

#### **EXPORTS**

Statistics Canada reports that Canada's exports of T.V. sets totalled 164 628 units, and had a value of \$68.5 million in 1985.

#### MARKET SUMMARY

In 1985, the Canadian market for all sizes of T.V. sets was approximately 1.3 million units. The market is mature as approximately 91 per cent of Canadian households own at least one T.V. set. The sales of 14-inch, 20-inch and 26-inch T.V. sets accounted for over 90 per cent of the market.

In terms of volume, the 20-inch T.V. sets had about 47 per cent of the market. The 14-inch T.V. sets had a considerably smaller share than that, while the 26-inch T.V. sets had only 18 per cent of the Canadian market. In terms of value, however, the 26-inch T.V. sets had the largest share of the market, with 33 per cent.

Three technical modifications have been affecting positively the sales of T.V. sets in the Canadian market. The first change is the manufacture of 26-inch and 28-inch portable T.V. sets, which compete directly with the console sets in those sizes. The second one is the incorporation of an electronic tuning system; T.V. sets that feature such a tuning system account for over 50 per cent of the volume of sales. The third one is the introduction in the Canadian market of T.V. sets that have flatter and squarer screens.

The Government has been promoting the assembly in Canada of T.V. sets. It removed tariffs on imports of television chassis. Furthermore, it eliminated the duty-free provision on T.V. sets imported from certain countries, that benefited from the General System of Preference.

The absence of restrictions on Canada's imports of television components, the high disposable income of Canadians, and the willingness of Canadians to accept product innovations make the Canadian market attractive to assemblers. The degree of import penetration suggests that opportunities exist for the establishment of new assembly operations in Canada.




