INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This report is one of a continuing series designed to increase business awareness of the potential existing for domestic production and to stimulate Canadian business to further explore potential opportunities in both the Canadian and export markets. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of manufacturing or competing in a particular market and should be treated as an indicator or starting point for the manufacturer or entrepreneur.

This report covers imports of bicycle saddles classified to Canadian International Trade Classification (C.I.T.C.) code 611-16-10 and bicycle parts and accessories, except bicycle saddles classified to C.I.T.C. code 611-20-10.

The import commodity code 611-20-10 includes:

Parts: Bicycle brakes, frames, handle bar grips, pedals, gears, chains, brake assemblies, etc.


Accessories: Bicycle bells, flashlight holders, pumps, speedometers, reflectors, saddle covers, etc.

IMPORT TRENDS: OVERVIEW

BICYCLE PARTS AND ACCESSORIES,

EXCEPT SADDLES (611-20-10)



Imports of bicycle parts and accessories (not including saddles) fluctuated considerably over the years 1982 to 1986. Between 1982 and 1983, the value of imports increased by 80 per cent from \$39.2 million to \$70.5 million. A further, slight increase of 5 per cent occurred in 1984, with a major decrease in 1985 by 24 per cent.

During the first eight months of 1986, the value of imports increased significantly when compared to the same period for 1985. The value for the first eight months of 1986 exceeds that of the whole of 1985.



Japan has consistently been the major country of export to Canada of bicycle parts and accessories. In 1983, Japan's imports increased by 98 per cent but dropped by 25 per cent in 1985. Taiwan was the second major country of export. Imports from this country followed a similar pattern to those of Japan with a 95 per cent increase in 1983 and a drop of 30 per cent in 1985.

IMPORT TRENDS: OVERVIEW

BICYCLE SADDLES (611-16-10)



Imports of bicycle saddles followed a pattern similar to that of bicycle parts and accessories. In 1983, the value of imports of bicycle saddles increased from \$2.0 million to \$3.1 million. However, imports decreased in 1984 and 1985 to reach about the same level as 1982.

The volume of imports followed the same pattern as values. In 1983, the volume of imports increased from 1.1 million units to 1.8 million units. In 1985, imports totalled 1.2 million units.

During the first eight months of 1986, the volume of imports stayed at the same level, when compared to the same period for 1985. However, the value of imports for the first eight months of 1986 exceeds the level of 1985 for the same period.



In 1985, Italy was the major exporter to Canada accounting for 66 per cent of the quantity and 65 per cent of the value. Taiwan, the leading exporter in 1982 and 1983, followed with 32 per cent of the quantity and 30 per cent of the volume.

In 1985, the average unit price of bicycle saddles imported from the two main countries of export (Italy and Taiwan) was less than \$2 per unit. However, the average unit price of all the other countries was more than \$2 per unit.

In 1985, \$40.3 million or 69 per cent of the value of imports of bicycle saddles, parts, and accessories were imported through Québec. The next ranking province of entry was Ontario with \$10.4 million or 18 per cent. This was followed by British Columbia with \$7.2 million or 12 per cent.

The main country of export to Québec was Japan with \$19 million or 33 per cent of the total imports.

In 1985, the top 10 importers of bicycle parts and accessories including saddles accounted for 83 per cent of the total imports. Of these 10 importers, six were manufacturers which accounted for \$38.7 million. Six of the 10 importers were located in Québec.

In 1985, there were 156 known importers of bicycle parts and accessories, including saddles. The top 20 importers accounted for 91 per cent or \$52.9 million of the import total. Of these 20 importers, nine were manufacturers of bicycles and parts, representing \$40 million or 69 per cent of the total import value. Seven of the 11 wholesalers were wholesalers of sporting and recreational goods and supplies, accounting for \$10.4 million or 18 per cent of the total value.

CANADIAN PRODUCTION

At least six companies in Canada manufacture exclusively bicycle parts, accessories and saddles. In addition, several bicycle manufacturers produce parts for use in their own bicycle manufacturing process. Statistics Canada does not provide data on production of bicycle parts due to confidentiality.

EXPORTS

Exports of bicycle parts are included in the category "Vehicle parts". Statistics Canada does not provide separate data on bicycle parts.

MARKET SUMMARY

Bicycling, as a participation activity, is quite popular in Canada and the U.S.A. Recent participation surveys in both countries have indicated that this category is among the top four sports recreation/activities.

Over 75 per cent of the Canadian market for parts and accessories is supplied by imports, primarily from the Far East. Currently, both Japan and Taiwan are the major suppliers to Canada and the U.S.A.

Almost 60 per cent of total imports enter Canada duty-free mainly for use by Canadian bicycle manufacturers in their own production. Although this duty-free situation has been instrumental in assisting the bicycle manufacturers to remain competitive, it has also had the effect of slowing down the development of the parts and accessories industry in Canada. Offsetting this negative aspect has been the fact that Taiwan and Japan, as world suppliers of many of the parts, have been unable to deliver in periods of high demand. This happened in 1984. Having been caught short at critical times, several bicycle manufacturers examined and implemented more in-house parts manufacturing. In addition, they are co-operating more closely with new and existing Canadian parts and accessories manufacturers, despite the potential cost premium.

There exists a potential opportunity to replace some of the \$58 million import volume with Canadian production.
