Valuation

Customs values are identical to selling prices for most transactions between non-affiliated firms, but customs values exceed selling prices for many transactions between affiliated firms. All values are reported in Canadian dollars and do not include duty.


INTRODUCTION

This report is one of a continuing series designed to increase business awareness of the enormous potential existing in the Canadian marketplace for domestic production and to stimulate Canadian business to explore further potential market opportunities in Canada. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of manufacturing or competing in a particular market and should be treated as an indicator or starting point for the manufacturer or entrepreneur.

From 1980 to 1983 imports of computer disk files increased at an average annual rate of 92 per cent in terms of quantity and 67 per cent in terms of value.

During 1983 imports totalled 12.1 million units, valued at \$70 million which was an increase of 137 per cent in terms of quantity and 55 per cent in terms of dollar value from 1982. The value of imports increased by 27 per cent for the first 10 months of 1984 compared to the first 10 months of 1983. The average unit price in 1983 was \$6. Unit prices ranged from \$5 for imports from the United States to \$120 from West Germany. This difference in unit price is due to: 1) the variety of products in this class, 2) boxes containing several items being counted as single units, and 3) pre-programmed disk files which have much higher values than unprogrammed files. This class contains floppy disks or diskettes, hard computer disks, tape cartridges and some disk packs, both programmed and unprogrammed.

The United States has consistently been the major exporter to Canada and accounted for 96 per cent of the quantity and 90 per cent of the value in 1983. It should also be noted that imports from Japan have increased rapidly from seven units in 1980 to 96 975 units in 1983.

The 10 major importers accounted for 49 per cent of the total imports for 1983. Six were identified as manufacturers of electronic computing and related equipment, and accounted for 36 per cent of total imports. Four were wholesalers located in Ontario, accounting for 13 per cent of total imports.

There were approximately 1 000 importers of computer disk files during 1983. The top 60 importers accounted for 83 per cent or \$58 million of the total imports. Importers identified as manufacturers (17 firms) represent 42 per cent of the import total.

E - CANADIAN PRODUCTION

There are at least four manufacturers of computer disk files in Canada. Statistics Canada does not report separate data on production of disk files. The data on disk files are included in the broad category "all other products", shipments of which were \$91.3 million for 1982, the latest year for which information is available.

F - EXPORTS

Exports of disk files appear to be very limited. Statistics Canada reports that exports of all types of electronic computers and equipment during 1983 amounted to \$990.7 million. Separate export data for disk files are not available.

I - MARKET SUMMARY

The disk file market parallels the disk drive market. The bulk of unit sales are in the $5\frac{1}{4}$ " size used in word processors and microcomputers. Other sizes of small files are 8" and $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". Large Winchester files are integral with their drives and are currently manufactured in Canada. A recent development has been in the area of five to 20 megabyte removeable media Winchester drives.

The optical data disk has been receiving a great deal of research attention and should emerge with a major market share in the next few years. This is an outgrowth of video-disk technology.
