### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

### Method

The data shown in this analysis are extracted from Revenue Canada Customs documents. These documents provide a description of the products, names of importers, exporters, quantities, dollar values, unit prices, countries of origin, provinces of entry, tariff applications and rates of exchange.

The information presented in this report is more detailed than that generally available from Statistics Canada or other publications. Data which might reveal information about individual importers are aggregated.

### <u>Valuation</u>

Dollar values shown in this report are based on selling price F.O.B. plant, in Canadian dollars. This selling price represents the value paid by the importer, excluding all freight, packing and insurance costs when specified. All trade discounts, when applicable, are also deducted from the selling price.

### IMPORT ANALYSIS

### **BICYCLES AND BICYCLE PARTS**

### I. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This Import Analysis is one of a series prepared in order to assist businesses and other organizations in their market research of specific products. The detailed import information provided in these reports supports studies by organizations seeking to expand existing production lines, change individual product characteristics or engage in new manufacturing investment in Canada. The coverage of an import analysis is developed in close consultation with the client, and is tailored to meet those specific requirements. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of competing in a particular market.

This analysis of imports of bicycles and bicycle parts is based on a detailed examination of Revenue Canada Customs imports documents for the period January to March 1987. The following Canadian International Trade Classification (C.I.T.C.) import commodity codes were analysed:

611-08-50 Bicycles, Coaster or Rim Brake, Single Speed

611-08-90 Bicycles and Tricycles Other Than Childrens', Not Elsewhere Specified

611-20-10 Bicycles, Parts and Accessories, Not Elsewhere Specified, Excluding Saddles

Official Statistics Canada import figures for the above mentioned C.I.T.C. codes, for the period analysed, amounted to \$43.9 million. Due to the large volume of Revenue Canada Customs documents classified to these codes, only those shipments having a value of \$40 000 and over were examined. Further, only <u>selected</u> items from these codes were analysed, i.e. bicycles, brakes and brake parts, chains and chain sets, frames, hubs, pedals, rims, spokes & nipples. The total value shown in this analysis is \$12.9 million, or 29 per cent of the published Statistics Canada value for the period. Reconciliation of these figures is given in Appendix G.

According to Statistics Canada's published figures, total imports of bicycles and bicycle parts in these three categories grew from \$81 million in 1983 to \$113 million in 1987, an average annual growth rate of 8.7%. It is to be noted that all further figures in this Import Analysis are based only on shipments valued at \$40 000 and over.

#### III. ANALYSIS OF IMPORTS

### JANUARY TO MARCH 1987

During the months of January, February and March 1987, imports of bicycles and bicycle parts, as analysed in this report, totalled \$3.9 million and \$9 million respectively. Mountain type bicycles accounted for \$2.8 million followed by racer type, valued at \$724 000 and BMX type at \$400 000.

Mountain type bicycles were imported in 6, 12, 15 and 18 speeds, with the 18 speed accounting for \$2 million or 73 per cent of the total imports of mountain type bicycles. Individual prices ranged from \$50 to \$750 with the overall average unit price \$175. Racing type bicycles were imported in 12 and 18 speeds with prices ranging from a low of \$60 to a high of \$460. The average unit price was \$196. BMX type bicycles ranged in price from \$37 to \$150. The average unit price was \$53. For further details, refer to Appendix A.

Bicycle parts described as frames accounted for \$2.5 million. Other major bicycle parts reported on are brakes and brake parts, accounting for \$1.7 million and chains of all types, also accounting for \$1.7 million. For further details, refer to Appendix A.



### III. ANALYSIS OF IMPORTS (CONT'D)

Imports of <u>bicycles</u> originating from Taiwan amounted to \$2.1 million or 54 per cent of the total value of bicycles. Japan followed with \$1.6 million or 41 per cent.


Taiwan was also the major country of origin for <u>bicycle parts</u>, accounting for \$5.3 million or 59 per cent of the total value of <u>bicycle parts</u>. Japan again was the second largest with \$2.8 million or 31 per cent. For further details refer to Appendix B.

### COUNTRY OF ORIGIN



British Columbia and Alberta were the two major provinces of consignee of <u>bicycles</u> accounting for \$3 million or 78 per cent of the total value of bicycles. However, Québec was the major province of consignee for <u>bicycle parts</u>, accounting for \$5.8 million or 64 per cent of the total value of <u>bicycle parts</u>. Ontario followed with \$2.8 million or 32 per cent. For further details, refer to Appendix C.

### III. ANALYSIS OF IMPORTS (CONT'D)

There were 24 known consignee/importers of bicycles and bicycle parts during the period January to March 1987. The principal 3 consignees/importers accounted for \$8 million or 63 per cent of the total dollar value of imports. Only 4 of the known 24 consignees/importers imported both bicycles and bicycle parts. All consignees/importers are listed in alphabetical order in Appendix D.

### IV. CANADIAN PRODUCTION

Bicycles are manufactured in Canada. The total shipment value for 1987 was estimated at \$126 million. Further, it is estimated that between \$10 to \$15 million of bicycle parts were manufactured during the same year.
