### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

### Method

The data shown in this analysis are extracted from Revenue Canada Customs documents. These documents provide a description of the products, names of importers, exporters, quantities, dollar values, unit prices, countries of origin, provinces of entry, tariff applications and rates of exchange.

The information presented in this report is more detailed than that generally available from Statistics Canada or other publications. Data which might reveal information about individual importers are aggregated.

#### Valuation

Dollar values shown in this report are based on selling price F.O.B. plant, in Canadian dollars. This selling price represents the value paid by the importer, excluding all freight, packing and insurance costs when specified. All trade discounts, when applicable, are also deducted from the selling price.

### IMPORT ANALYSIS

### PLASTIC HANDLES, KNOBS AND PULLS

### I. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This Import Analysis is one of a series prepared in order to assist businesses and other organizations in their market research of specific products. The detailed import information provided in these reports supports studies by organizations seeking to expand existing production lines, change individual product characteristics or engage in new manufacturing investment in Canada. The coverage of an import analysis is developed in close consultation with the client, and is tailored to meet those specific requirements. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of competing in a particular market.

This analysis of imports of plastic handles, knobs and pulls is based on a detailed examination of Revenue Canada Customs import documents for the period July, August and September 1987. The following Canadian International Trade Classification (C.I.T.C.) import commodity codes were analysed:

425-62-20 Handles, Plastic 425-62-30 Knobs, Plastic 425-62-40 Pulls, Furniture, Plastic



### II. IMPORT TRENDS - 1983 to 1987

### Plastic Handles

Between 1983 and 1987 the value of plastic handle imports increased from \$1.3 million to \$2.1 million, an average annual growth rate of 12.5 per cent.



### Plastic Knobs

Between 1983 and 1987 the value of plastic knob imports increased from \$327 thousand to \$496 thousand, an average annual growth rate of 11.0 per cent.



The value of plastic pull imports increased from \$30 thousand in 1983 to \$58 thousand in 1987, an average annual growth rate of 17.9 per cent.

# JULY TO SEPTEMBER 1987 SUMMARY OF IMPORTS BY PRICE RANGE

During the months of July, August and September 1987, imports of plastic handles, knobs and pulls amounted to a quantity of 2.2 million for a value of \$655 thousand.

### PLASTIC HANDLES

During the months July, August and September 1987, imports of plastic handles amounted to 1.9 million units for a value of \$551 thousand. Slightly more than half of the total quantity, 1.0 million units (54 per cent) valued at \$190 thousand, were for paint brushes and rollers, the majority of these being consigned to wholesalers. (Refer to Appendix A for further details by apparent end use industry.)

Unit prices for all plastic handles ranged from \$0.05 to \$14.28 with the overall average being \$0.29. Eighty per cent or 1.5 million units valued at \$253 thousand were priced from \$0.05 to \$0.30. (For further details refer to Appendix C.)

### PLASTIC KNOBS

During the period July to September 1987, imports of plastic knobs amounted to 273 thousand units for a value of \$91 thousand. Apparent end uses for these products were parts for motor vehicles, furniture, cookware, etc., with the largest identifiable apparent end use being for stoves and heating and air conditioning equipment. The total accounted for 55 thousand units for a value of \$19 thousand or 20 per cent of the quantity and 21 per cent of the value. (Refer to Appendix A for further details by apparent end use industry.)

Prices ranged from \$0.10 to \$7.32 with the average unit price being \$0.33. A total of 86 per cent of the total quantity, 235 thousand units valued at \$53 thousand or 58 per cent of the total value were priced from \$0.10 to \$0.50. (For further details refer to Appendix C.)


### PLASTIC PULLS

During the period of analysis, imports of plastic pulls amounted to a total quantity of 85 thousand units for a value of \$13 thousand. All imports were used for the cabinet furniture industry with 86 per cent of the total value being imported by manufacturers.

Unit prices ranged from \$0.08 to over \$2.50 with an average unit price of \$0.15. The majority of plastic pulls were priced from \$0.08 to \$0.21, with 94 per cent of the total quantity and 74 per cent of the total value being in that price range. (For further details refer to Appendix C.)









United States was the dominant country of origin for the imports of plastic handles accounting for \$391 thousand of the total value.


