

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Commodity Classification

Canadian Trade statistics are classified and published according to the International Convention on the Harmonized Commodity and Description Coding System (H.S.), as defined by the Canadian Customs Tariff and Statistical Nomenclature.

Method

The data shown in this analysis are extracted from Revenue Canada Customs documents. These documents provide a description of the products, names of importers, exporters, quantities, dollar values, unit prices, countries of origin, provinces of entry, tariff applications and rates of exchange.

The information presented in this report is more detailed than that generally available from Statistics Canada or other publications. Data which might reveal information about individual importers are aggregated.

Valuation


Dollar values shown in this report are based on selling price F.O.B. plant, in Canadian dollars. This selling price represents the value paid by the importer, excluding all freight, packing and insurance costs when specified. All trade discounts, when applicable, are also deducted from the selling price.

IMPORT ANALYSIS

INSTANT DRIED NOODLES

I. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This Import Analysis is one of a series prepared in order to assist businesses and other organizations in their market research of specific products. The detailed import information provided in these reports supports studies by organizations seeking to expand existing production lines, change individual product characteristics or engage in new manufacturing investment in Canada. The coverage of an import analysis is developed in close consultation with the client, and is tailored to meet those specific requirements. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of competing in a particular market.

This analysis of imports on instant dried noodles is based on a detailed examination of Revenue Canada Customs import documents for the period of October to December 1988 for the following:

II. ANALYSIS OF IMPORTS

IMPORTS OF INSTANT DRIED NOODLES

OCTOBER, NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER 1988

Imports of instant dried noodles totalled 3 475 334 packages for a value of \$563 933 for the period October to December 1988.

Imports of instant dried noodles were of two types: cups and flat packages.

Flat packages represented \$318 thousand or 56 per cent of the total value. Cups accounted for \$191 thousand, or 34 per cent of the total value. (Six percent of the imports by value did not show the container type.)

Instant dried noodles in cups had prices ranging from \$0.14 to \$0.43, with an average price of \$0.33 per cup.

Flat packages had prices ranging from \$0.09 to \$1.80, with an average price of \$0.12 per package.



IMPORTS OF INSTANT DRIED NOODLES BY COUNTRY OF ORIGIN

OCTOBER, NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER 1988

Of the total import market value, shipments originating from South Korea accounted for \$381 thousand or 68 per cent. Japan had 7 per cent. Singapore, Taiwan, Thailand and the United States together accounted for the remaining 25 per cent, or \$142 486.



British Columbia was the major province of consignee, accounting for \$292 thousand or 52 per cent of the total import value, followed by Ontario and Quebec with 48 per cent.

There were 20 known consignees/importers of instant dried noodles during the period October to December 1988. The top three consignees/importers accounted for \$313 thousand dollars or 56 per cent of the total dollar value of imports. All consignees/importers are listed in alphabetical order in Appendix B.

III. CANADIAN PRODUCTION

According to Statistics Canada, noodles as described in this report are made in Canada. However, for reasons of confidentiality, separate data on production or shipments by Canadian manufacturers are not available.
