EXPLANATORY NOTES

Commodity Classification

Canadian Trade statistics are classified and published according to the International Convention on the Harmonized Commodity and Description Coding System (H.S.), as defined by the Canadian Customs Tariff and Statistical Nomenclature.

Method

The data shown in this analysis are extracted from Revenue Canada Customs documents. These documents provide a description of the products, names of importers, foreign exporters, quantities, dollar values, unit prices, countries of origin, provinces of entry, tariff applications and rates of exchange.

The information presented in this report is more detailed than that generally available from Statistics Canada or other publications. Data which might reveal information about individual importers are aggregated.

Valuation

Dollar values shown in this report are based on selling price F.O.B. plant, in Canadian dollars. This selling price represents the value paid by the importer, excluding all freight, packing and insurance costs when specified. All trade discounts, when applicable, are also deducted from the selling price.

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IMPORT ANALYSIS

POLYVINYL CHLORIDE COATED FABRICS

I. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This Import Analysis is one of a series prepared in order to assist businesses and other organizations in their market research of specific products. The detailed import information provided in these reports supports studies by organizations seeking to expand existing production lines, change individual product characteristics or engage in new manufacturing investment in Canada. The coverage of an import analysis is developed in close consultation with the client, and is tailored to meet those specific requirements. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of competing in a particular market.

This analysis of imports on polyvinyl chloride coated fabrics is based on a detailed examination of Revenue Canada Customs import documents for the period of April, May and June 1989. The following Harmonized System (H.S.) import commodity codes were analyzed:

IMPORT ANALYSIS

POLYVINYL CHLORIDE COATED FABRICS

I. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE (Cont'd)

Import statistics for the aforementioned H.S. import commodity codes analyzed for the period April, May and June 1989 amounted to \$13 million. For purposes of this analysis, only those shipments described as polyvinyl chloride coated fabrics were recorded. These shipments amounted to \$4.3 million. Further, due to the large number of shipments registered to these H.S. commodity codes, only those shipments having a value of \$10,000 and over were recorded. Also, those shipments of polyvinyl chloride coated fabrics to be used in the Automotive Industry were not captured. For further details, refer to the Reconciliation table in Appendix H.

II. ANALYSIS OF IMPORTS

IMPORTS OF POLYVINYL CHLORIDE COATED FABRICS

APRIL TO JUNE 1989

Imports of polyvinyl chloride coated fabrics totalled more than 872 thousand kg for a value of \$4.3 million for the period April to June 1989. Of this, polyvinyl chloride coated fabrics for use in the manufacturing of garden furniture accounted for 312 thousand kg (36 per cent) valued at \$1.6 million (37 per cent). For further details by apparent end use and type of fabric, see Appendix A.

APRIL, MAY AND JUNE 1989

Imports of polyvinyl chloride coated fabrics originating from the United States accounted for 671 thousand kg or 77 per cent for a value of \$3.1 million or 72 per cent. Taiwan followed with 82 thousand kg and \$309 thousand (9 per cent and 7 per cent respectively).





There were 70 known consignees/importers of polyvinyl chloride coated fabrics during the period April, May and June 1989. The top three consignees/importers accounted for \$1.4 million or 33 per cent of the total dollar value of imports. All consignees/importers are listed in alphabetical order in Appendix D.

III. CANADIAN PRODUCTION

There are at least 11 manufacturers of polyvinyl chloride coated fabrics in Canada. Statistics Canada reports shipments of 5.2 million square meters with an estimated value of \$5.5 million for these products in 1986 (the latest year for which information is available).

IV. CANADIAN EXPORTS

Effective January 1, 1988, Statistics Canada reports domestic exports under the Harmonized System (H.S.) for textile fabrics impregnated, coated, covered or laminated with polyvinyl chloride N.E.S., as follows:

V. UNITED STATES IMPORTS

The United States Department of Commerce reports that imports into the United States of polyvinyl chloride coated fabrics from all countries during the first nine months of 1989, totalled 6.6 million kilograms for a value of \$41.8 million. Canada's share of United States imports totalled 3.3 million kilograms for a value of \$17.1 million or 50 per cent and 41 per cent respectively of the total quantity and value.
