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SECTION I

SCOPE OF ANALYSIS

This report is based on a detailed analysis of imports of elastic knitted fabrics during the period February, March and April 1983. These fabrics are included in Statistics Canada Import Commodity Code 385-11 "Elastic Knitted Fabrics".

All available documents recording imports of "Elastic Knitted Fabrics", classified to Import Commodity Code 385-11 were examined.

According to industry sources, elastic knitted fabrics are not manufactured in Canada.

SECTION II

RECONCILIATION

The value reported in this analysis does not correspond to official Statistics Canada data. Reconciliation of the dollar value published by Statistics Canada and the Import Analysis is explained as follows:

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SECTION III

ANALYSIS OF IMPORTS

Imports of elastic knitted fabrics during February, March and April 1983 as reported on the documents examined, were valued at \$1,747,596.

The United States was the major country of export accounting for 80.9 per cent of the value, followed by Italy with 10.4 per cent.

Transactions, identified as "arms length transactions", amounted to \$1,674,021 or 95.8 per cent of the value of imports.
