## SECTION I

## SCOPE OF ANALYSIS

This report is based on a detailed analysis of imports of dog and cat feed during the period October 1982 to September 1983. These products are included in Statistics Canada Import Commodity Codes:

157-69(20) Dog and cat feeds, complete, canned

157-69(31) Dog and cat biscuits, whole or kibbled

157-69(90) Dog and cat feeds, complete, except canned, not elsewhere specified

The documents examined were selected by a sampling technique, see Section IV.

#### SECTION II

#### RECONCILIATION

The value reported in this analysis does not correspond to official Statistics Canada figures for various reasons.

Standard deviation of total value due to sampling is approximately \$480,000. Therefore the difference of total value can be attributed to sampling.

### SECTION III

#### ANALYSIS OF IMPORTS

Imports of dog and cat feed reported on documents examined during the period October 1982 to September 1983 amounted to a total value of \$23,329,508.

The analysis indicates that cat feed accounted for 55 per cent of the total value; with dog feed accounting for 39 per cent of the total value. The remaining six per cent was specialty diet feed for both cats and dogs.

Of the total \$12.8 million cat feed imported, 67 per cent was in cans sized 6 and 6.5 ounces, with an average unit price of 35¢ per tin. The majority of these products (68 per cent) were composed in whole or in part of fish, with tuna being the largest single base ingredient.

Moist cat food was mostly contained in packages of 1 ounce and 1.5 ounces, averaging 22¢ per package. Beef and beef/flavour was the largest composition accounting for 36 per cent of total imports of moist. Cat food described as being dry accounted for 26 per cent of the total value. Seventy-five per cent of the dry cat food was in containers sized 500 g, 1 kg and 1.82 kg averaging 84¢ per package. Liver base ingredients was the major composition accounting for 36 per cent of the value.

Dog feed imports were valued at \$9.0 million. Canned feed accounted for 3 per cent of total with container sizes ranging from 14.5 oz to 700 g at an average unit price per tin of  $36 \rlap/e$ . Beef composition was the largest single base ingredient accounting for 38 per cent of canned feed values.

Moist dog feed was valued at \$153 thousand or 2 per cent of the total value, with beef being the only composition.

Dry feed was the major type of dog feed imported accounting for approximately \$7.5 million or 83 per cent of the total imports of dog feed. Fifty-nine per cent of this product was in containers sized 8 kg, 20 kg, 40 lb and 44 lb, with average price per package ranging from \$4.48 for the 8 kg size to \$11.19 for the 20 kg size and \$12.19 for the 40 lb and 44 lb sizes. Composition for dry dog feed was not indicated on information documents.

Dog feed described as biscuits amounted to \$852 thousand or II per cent of the total value. The largest containers in terms of percentage of value were 22 lb and 25 lb accounting for 38 per cent. Beef was the largest single identifiable base composition, 12 per cent of the value for biscuits.

Sixty-three per cent of all shipments included in this analysis are apparently, in Statistics Canada's terminology "affiliated transactions", i.e. shipments between affiliated firms.

Full details of the analysis are provided in the following tables.

#### SECTION IV

#### SAMPLING AND ESTIMATES

The documents examined were selected as follows. The shipments were divided into three groups (strata):

Stratum (A): \$20,000 Shipments and over Stratum (B): \$13,000 to \$19,999 Shipments Stratum (C): \$ 0 to \$12,999 Shipments

All shipments in Stratum A were examined. In Stratum B one shipment in four was examined, and in Stratum C one shipment in ten. Results in this report were based on the examined documents those of Stratum B and C being multiplied by 4 and 10 respectively.

#### ACCURACY OF RESULTS

Since some of the shipments were selected using random sampling, figures in the tables do not correspond exactly to the results which would have been obtained if all shipments had been examined. The probable range of error depends on such factors as the number of shipments examined, their similarity or otherwise, etc.

The following summary shows the probable range of error for various values shown in the tables in Section III.

In most cases (approximately two thirds or more), the true result will be within plus or minus one relative standard deviation of the values shown in the tables. In rare cases (less than one in twenty) the true value will be more than two relative standard deviations from the table value.
