SECTION I

SCOPE OF ANALYSIS

This report is based on a detailed examination of documents covering imports of livestock waterers for the period January to December 1983 included in Statistics Canada Import Commodity Code 546-12-30 "Watering bowls and cups, livestock, agricultural".

This report does not include waterers for poultry or pet which are classified to import class 545-99-90 "Poultry equipment not elsewhere specified, agricultural" and class 949-99-49 "Pet supplies not elsewhere specified/except feed".

SECTION II

RECONCILIATION

The value reported in this analysis does not correspond to official Statistics Canada figures for various reasons.

SECTION III

ANALYSIS OF IMPORTS

Imports of livestock waterers during the period January to December 1983 amounted to a total value of \$979,554. The analysis indicates that automatic waterers accounted for \$659,198 or 67 per cent of the total waterers.
