#### SECTION I - INTRODUCTION

#### Scope of Analysis

This analysis of garnet grain is based on a detailed examination of Revenue Canada, Customs import documents for the period January to December 1984. This product is classified to Canadian International Trade Classification import commodity code 274-99-90 "Abrasives, Natural NES".

Garnet grain is only one of the many products classified to the aforementioned import commodity code. Total imports under that code for the period analyzed (January to December 1984) amounted to \$1,385,000, of which \$828,079 or 60 per cent was described as garnet grain.

#### Method

The data shown in this analysis were extracted from Revenue Canada Customs documents. These documents provide a description of the products, names of importers and exporters, quantities, dollar values, unit prices, countries of origin, provinces of entry, tariff applications and rates of exchange.

Please note that dollar values shown are based on selling price F.O.B. plant, in Canadian dollars. This selling price represents the value paid by the importer, excluding all freight, packing and insurance costs when specified. All trade discounts when applicable are also deducted from the selling price.


#### SECTION II - ANALYSIS AND OBSERVATIONS

#### Analysis of Imports

Imports of garnet grain as reported on documents examined for the period January to December 1984 were valued at \$828,079 (selling price). All shipments originated from United States.

Ontario and Quebec were the major provinces of clearance accounting for 96 per cent of the total dollar value, followed by Alberta and British Columbia with 4 per cent. (Graph refers)

### Summary of Imports

Garnet grain of mesh size 80 to 120 accounted for approximately half the total imported quantity and value. Grain with mesh sizes of 8 to 60 made up over a third of the total quantity, but, at low unit prices accounted for only about a quarter of the total value.
