#### A) INTRODUCTION/HIGHLIGHTS

The Access to Information and Privacy Secretariat has again received a large number of complex and voluminous requests this year which, as usual, has severely taxed its resources.

Also, it is worth noting that more than 20% of the formal access requests received by the Secretariat were abandoned during this reporting period. Seventy-eight percent of these involved our Research and Spectrum Sector which is moving towards an informal release policy for much of the data it possesses. Consistent with the Federal Government's Communications Policy, the Secretariat has worked closely with that Sector to develop these informal release mechanisms. Furthermore, we can expect a further decrease in formal requests processed by the Secretariat once the policy is fully implemented.

#### C) <u>INTERPRETATION OF STATISTICAL REPORT</u>

#### Costs of the ATIP Secretariat

The ATIP Secretariat handled both access and privacy requests, so costs are divided between the two functions, 75% for access and 25% for privacy. Total costs shown of \$ 200,729 were calculated as follows:

Systems are in place to fully account for the time and resources expended in carrying out ATIP responsibilities. Departmental personnel track the time spent on each request, and report quarterly on other activities such as policy formulation, management of personal information banks, advising third parties on the protection of their information, attending ATIP meetings and briefings, and so on. The costs of providing photocopies, microfiches, tapes, and other records are tabulated.

The Secretariat purchased a new automated tracking system at the end of the reporting period to record all the activity on access and privacy requests. It also collates all of the statistics needed for the annual reports to Treasury Board and to Parliament.

#### Time Extensions over 60 Days

There were 24 requests for which time extensions over 60 days were necessary. Again this year, several of these requests were for all records related to a given topic, and involved large volumes of sensitive files.

#### **Abandoned Enquiries**

There were 23 abandoned enquiries this year, 78% of which were for our Research and Spectrum Sector. This high rate of abandoned requests is likely due to the fees that were assessed.

#### Source of Requests

While we do not ask requestors to identify themselves or explain their reasons for requesting information, we do attempt to categorize them into the five groups stipulated by Treasury Board. Based on the information that we have, the percentage breakdown is as follows:

#### D) PRACTICES AND PROCEDURES

#### Organization of ATIP Activities

The Coordinator, Access to Information and Privacy Secretariat, is the departmental Access to Information Coordinator. He reports to the Director General, Administrative and Technical Services.

The Secretariat administers and coordinates all ATIP enquiries. It is composed of one full time Coordinator, one full time senior advisor, one full time administrative assistant, and one full time administrative clerk.

We find that it is not possible to simply send the request out to the responsibility centres and rely on them to interpret the request, find the appropriate exemptions which may apply, and return completed documents to the ATIP Secretariat. When a request is received, it is routed through the sector coordinator to the responsibility centre, and at this point usually the ATIP Secretariat is contacted for advice in tracking down the documents and determining what the requestor wants.

#### Formal and Informal Inquiries

Informal mechanisms of information release continue to work well, and account for the vast majority of information requests handled by the Department. Staff are urged to refer the public to the ATIP Secretariat only when they believe the information requested may be sensitive. The Secretariat in turn tries to handle requests informally when there is obviously no concern about the protection of the information. Once we have received a few ATIP requests for a certain type of report or information, which we know is not exempt, we try to set up informal systems of release.

#### E) <u>INSTITUTIONAL POLICIES</u>

Our fee policies have been outlined in our 1988-1989 Annual Report which is still available from our ATIP Secretariat located at:

We have found it necessary this year, when faced with voluminous requests which would adversely impact on the functioning of the ATIP Secretariat, to require a deposit before processing the request. Regrettably, the use of fee estimates is the only way of ensuring that the requestor is serious in making his request.

#### F) <u>DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY</u>

On May 5, 1989, the Coordinator of the Access to Information and Privacy Secretariat was added to the list of the Deputy Minister, the Assistant Deputy Minister, Corporate Management, the ATIP Coordinator as having delegation of authority for all sections of the Act. These designations were also extended to any person holding any of the above positions in an acting or temporary capacity.

#### G) EDUCATION AND TRAINING

This year, ten briefing sessions were given with over 128 departmental employees in attendance. Among the subjects discussed at these briefing sessions were Treasury Board policies on the Management of Government Information Holdings and Data Matching as well as access related matters.

We have found that usually the responsibility centre manager requires assistance in preparing the documents and suggesting exemptions. As a result, a great deal of time is spent by ATIP personnel in the initial review of records. Again this year, two of our sector coordinators attended a three day course given by the Treasury Board Secretariat. We have found that the skills and knowledge acquired have assisted them in carrying out their functions more effectively and has had a trickle down effect to employees in their sectors.

The ATIP Secretariat also gave briefing sessions to a number of program managers regarding information collections and public opinion surveys. A total of 12 information collections or public opinion surveys were processed through the ATIP Secretariat.

#### H) COMPLAINTS AND INVESTIGATIONS

The department has received notice of 6 complaints to the Information Commissioner this year. The salient points of these six investigations are outlined in the table on page 8. In addition, there are 2 ongoing complaints from the previous year which are still outstanding. This brings the total number of investigations to **eight**.

## C) <u>INTERPRETATION OF STATISTICS</u>

#### Costs of the ATIP Secretariat

The staff of the ATIP Secretariat continue to spend a significant portion of their time addressing the issues of retention, protection, and disclosure of personal information. Their advice is frequently sought in connection with the implementation of the security policy. We continue to spend 25% of time on privacy issues, although the requests themselves do not compare in complexity to the access requests which we receive.

#### Personnel Costs

A system has been developed to track the time spent by other departmental personnel on each request, and on other activities such as briefing sessions, policy development, and activities related to Info Source. Salary costs are reported quarterly, and the total costs of \$ 58,656 are calculated as follows:

## D) PRACTICES AND PROCEDURES

#### Organization of Privacy Activities

The organization of the ATIP Secretariat is fully described on page 5. The Coordinator, Access to Information and Privacy Secretariat, is the departmental Privacy Coordinator and reports to the Director General, Administrative and Technical Services.

The ATIP Secretariat implements policy and coordinates access and personal information requests. The ATIP Coordinator is also responsible for advising the Deputy Minister on privacy matters. In situations where the Deputy Minister must become involved, the Assistant Deputy Minister raises the matter at senior management meetings.

Finally, the Coordinator is also responsible for the oversight of all data collection within the Department, and acts as the liaison with Statistics Canada and the Department of Supply and Services concerning data collection and opinion polls.

#### E) <u>INSTITUTIONAL POLICIES</u>

Personal information requests are dealt with on a strictly confidential basis. Employees are encouraged to consult with the Access to Information and Privacy personnel who may be able to suggest informal sources of access to their personal information in order to avoid the formal privacy process when they wish to access their personal information.

# F) <u>DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY</u>

The Deputy Minister, the Assistant Deputy Minister, Corporate Management, and the Coordinator, Access to Information and Privacy Secretariat, have delegation of authority for all sections of the <u>Act</u>. These designations are also extended to any person holding any of the above positions in an acting or temporary capacity.

#### G) EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Two of our six sector coordinators attended Treasury Board training sessions which dealt, in part, with the <u>Privacy Act</u>. All ATIP briefing sessions to departmental employees touch on privacy issues. The ATIP Secretariat on privacy issues at the department's annual human resources conference.

# H) <u>COMPLAINTS AND INVESTIGATIONS</u>

One complaint was lodged against the Department this year because of alleged wrongfull collection of personal information. The investigation of this complaint is still ongoing.

## I) APPEALS TO FEDERAL COURT

We had no appeals to Federal Court under the Privacy Act this year.

# J) <u>DISCLOSURES UNDER 8(2)(E) OF THE PRIVACY ACT</u>

The Department received four requests for disclosure under 8(2)(e) of the Act.

### K) <u>EXEMPT BANKS</u>

The Department has no exempt banks.

#### L) <u>USE AND DISCLOSURE</u>

The importance of the protection of personal information as well as recent Treasury Board policies on the employee privacy code, data matching and the control of the social insurance number are stressed in our ongoing series of briefing sessions given to departmental employees.
