

#### GLOSSARY OF ACTIVITIES AND SPECIALIZED TERMS\*

Brandon University Northern Teacher Education Program (BUNTEP)

The intent of this activity is to meet the need and demand for teachers in remote communities by providing teacher training and support to students who would otherwise have limited access to this opportunity.

Business Management and Advisory Services

Under this activity the provincial Communities Economic Development Fund provides various types of assistance, advisory services and training to participants in northern enterprises.

### Channel Area Loggers

Channel Area Loggers Company Ltd. is a pulpwood cutting operation at Berens River. The intent of this activity is to produce an economically viable operation harvesting the forestry resource in the area, to provide training and employment to northern residents and to ultimately transfer control to these residents.

## Churchill Pre-Fab Housing Plant

The Pre-Fab Housing Plant in Churchill was established to provide employment and training in building construction to northern residents, in particular unemployed or underemployed residents of that community.

#### Community Base Mapping (DIAND)

Community base mapping involves the production of topographic mapping and air photo mosaics. The maps are used extensively by the Chief and Council and their planners and engineers for community planning studies; for locating Reserve boundaries; for land use studies; and as records of ownership.

photo mosaic - pieces of air photo joined together to produce a picture of the Reserve.

\* Specialized terms are referred to under their appropriate activity.

Community Base Mapping (DNA)

This activity provides aerial photographs and comprehensive mapping of a cultural, physical and cadastral nature for northern communities. This portion of the activity is produced by the Surveys and Mapping Branch of the Department of Renewable Resources and Transportation Services. It also provides a property ownership map, land use map, residents map, and a photo binder and location plan for northern communities. This portion of the activity is produced by the Community Subdivision and Planning Branch of the Northern Planning Branch of the Department of Municipal Affairs.

Cadastral and Shoreline Survey - indicates property boundaries, subdivision lines, buildings, shorelines and related details.

Cadastral Contour and Photobase Survey - uses aerial photography to make contour maps of a township.

Planimetric Contour Shoreline Cadastral - a townsite plan showing contours and shorelines.

Community Infrastructure Services/
Fire Prevention/Protection (DIAND)

This activity provides fire protection equipment and fire safety training to northern Indian communities.

Community Infrastructure Services/ Internal Transportation (DIAND)

This activity provides internal transportation services in northern Indian communities. This includes the design and construction of internal transportation works such as new roads, upgrading existing roads, bridges, causeways, and docks and an aggregate search to identify sources of gravel primarily for road rebuilding on new road construction.

Community Infrastructure Services/ Multi-Purpose Facilities (DIAND)

4

This activity provides multi-purpose facilities in northern Indian communities. This includes the design and construction of a variety of multi-purpose facilities such as halls, recreation facilities, workshops, warehouses, and compounds, etc.

Community Infrastructure Services/ Safe Water Supply System (DIAND)

This activity provides one or more sources of potable water with a rudimentary delivery system to northern Indian communities.

Community Infrastructure Services/ Waste Disposal Facilities

The objective of this activity is to develop and provide facilities for the disposal of wastes in northern Indian communities. It includes the design to upgrade and expand existing lagoons and plants, or to construct waste disposal facilities such as lagoons, sewage collection and treatment systems, incinerators, landfill sites, etc.

## Community Infrastructure Support Services

The objective of this activity is to provide the support services necessary to assist northern Indian communities to plan and implement community infrastructure projects. Activities include the development of engineering and architectural concepts and designs, and the compilation of standard designs for equipment and facilities.

## Community Planning (DIAND)

This activity is designed to provide technical advice and funds to northern Indian communities. It provides a framework for long range comprehensive policies and programs including such components as land use and capability, housing needs, economic base and job opportunity.

## Community Resource Planning and Feasibility Analysis

This activity undertakes data and information gathering, land use planning, feasibility studies, pilot projects, and general assistance related to known and/or potential resource development possibilities in northern communities.

## Community Roads (DNA)

This activity provides basic internal community access systems such as roads, causeways, bridges, ferries, etc.

### Community Townsite Planning (DNA)

This activity assists communities to develop legal planning schemes to allow community councils to administer and control land use and development. Further assistance is given to communities by examining the resource base in their immediate hinterland and developing proposals for their utilization and protection.

#### Community Wildlife Management

This activity was designed to benefit residents of northern communities by examining methods of improving the utilization and management of wildlife resources.

## Co-operative Development Strategy

This activity investigated the possibility of establishing a co-operative financial service in remote northern communities that would satisfy both community needs and the requirements of the Credit Union Act.

#### Culture and Recreation Services

This activity assists northern communities to develop recreational opportunities to meet the needs of their citizens. It is composed of four components, Community Programs Development, Human Resources Development, Exposure, and Physical Resources Development.

- community recreation workers provides full time coordination of recreation services and the training, up-grading and supervision of community recreations workers in remote northern communities.
- conferences to provide a forum for the exchange of ideas, information giving, and the planning and evaluation of local, regional and provincial recreation services.
- consultative services provides consultation and support in the planning and management of recreation services, programs and facilities.
- demonstrations to expose communities to new recreation activities at the local, regional and provincial levels.
- facility grants a program funded out of lotteries revenue, in support of recreation facilities.

#### Culture and Recreation Services Cont'd

- leadership training provides workshops, clinics, and courses for the development of part-time and full time recreation leaders.
- Outreach a community based program which assists in the development of recreation activities by promoting the exchange of visits between communities. See also Outreach.
- recreation director an annual grant is provided to the communities for a full time recreation director.
- skill development activities provides schools, clinics and workshops to develop a base for leaders in activities which are underdeveloped.
- teacher/recreation director a program undertaken in conjunction with the Frontier School Division to provide half-time recreation directors in six northern remote communities.

Design/Engineering for Community Facilities (DNA)

This activity provides designs for the provision of water supply systems and the construction of airstrips in remote northern communities.

#### Director's Office

This activity provides support and program direction to the corporate projects provided for in the agreement.

## Fire Protection/Prevention (DNA)

This activity provides northern remote communities with basic protective firefighting equipment, training necessary to operate and maintain such equipment, and fire prevention knowledge.

community survey - determines the fire prevention and firefighting needs of the community. It includes the numbers of dwellings and other buildings, population, available water supply, usable roads for the use of fire apparatus and recommendations for the appropriate firefighting equipment.

#### Forestry Counterpart Training

This program provides on-the-job training to northern residents to assist them to qualify for positions as managers, bookkeepers, and/or mechanics.

#### 4-H North

This activity is a program which assists young people to acquire skills, attitudes and knowledge in the areas of project learning and group process. 4-H north promotes activities through northern youth conferences, public meetings with organizations and groups as well as expanding the number of members, leaders and clubs.

## Geotechnical Land Use Studies (DIAND)

These studies provide northern Indian communities with preliminary terrain data for use in infrastructure planning, and the identification of areas of potential economic development.

airphoto interpretation - a technique which is used to evaluate the terrain characteristics.

#### Geotechnical Land Use Studies (DNA)

This activity produces basic geotechnical reports, including: inventory, inventory extension, water and sewer feasibility, sewage lagoon site evaluation, waste disposal site evaluation, septic suitability, airstrip site investigation, water reservoir (dug-out) site evaluation, and others.

#### Information-Communication

This activity is designed to meet the basic informational needs of residents of northern communities to enable them to participate in a developing range of social and economic opportunities. In particular, the program is directed toward their involvement in local government and in the acquisition of personal and group skills.

Media Centre - centre in Thompson which produces video tapes and other informational and educational material.

Print Shop - centre in The Pas which provides informational and educational printed matter.

Integrated Building Systems/RTM Plant

This activity employs northerners in the building construction industry. During 1977/78, the pre-fab, precut and RTM (Ready to Move) housing operation at Young's Point/The Pas was moved to Cranberry Portage, and the Young's Point operation was converted to a cabinet and furniture plant.

#### Local Employment Assistance Program (LEAP)

The purpose of LEAP is to develop new ways of creating jobs for residents of northern communities. The funds provided through a LEAP contract are normally used for wages (paid at local rates), employer contributions for employee benefits and reasonable administration overhead costs. LEAP projects may be initiated by a range of sponsoring organizations voluntary non-profit groups, citizens' organizations, community corporations, cooperatives, individuals, or municipalities.

#### Log Bundling and Booming

This was a study of alternate methods of transporting logs and/or pulpwood from lake shore areas where geographic barriers prohibit the use of conventional barging methods and where roads for long-haul transportation do not exist.

#### Mapping

Aerotriangulation - surveying technique which uses aerial photography.

Altimetry - surveying technique which records changes in atmostpheric pressure associated with changes in altitude.

#### Mistik Creek Loggers

This activity provides employment and training to northerners in aspects of the woodlands industry.

## Moose Lake Loggers

The intent of this activity is to produce an economically viable operation harvesting forestry resources in the area, to provide training and employment to northern residents and to ultimately transfer control to local residents.

#### New Careers

This activity is designed to increase the participation of people from remote northern communities in professional, para-professional, technical and administrative jobs in both remote and urban centres. It consists of on-the-job training, related specifically to the skills and knowledge needed to perform particular jobs. For this purpose, it provides for staff, costs of adminstration, counselling, training allowances, travel, field cost of supervision and office expenses.

#### Outreach

Outreach focusses on providing manpower services along with the ongoing placement and support services of the CEIC to those residents of remote communities who lack the necessary skills to effectively participate in the labour market and who experience difficulty in finding and keeping satisfactory employment.

## Pakwagan Community Services

In 1977/78, this activity consisted of a milling plant which provided employment to northern residents.

#### Pre-Engineering and Design

This activity was intended to locate and design further extensions to the northern Manitoba road system to improve access to isolated communities.

Program Support Services/Economic Development Services

This activity provides the opportunity for northern residents to increase the degree of local ownership, control, employment and income in the northern economy.

#### Regional Services

This activity undertakes the delivery of a regionally-managed and community-based human development service. It includes referral services, training programs, economic development, family services, relocation services and Youth Corps.

## Regional Services Cont'd

Relocation Services - In this category there are three operations designed to move residents of remote communities to jobs in industrial centres.

- Project Tawow operates under agreement with Sherritt-Gordon Mines at Leaf Rapids.

- The Thompson relocation program operates in co-operation with the Manitoba Metis Federation and International Nickel Company.

- The Flin Flon relocation project operates in co-operation with Hudson Bay Mining and Smelting Company.

Youth Corps - This component is designed to create summer jobs for the youth in remote communities.

## Safe Water Supply (DNA)

This activity provides remote communities with potable water utilizing rudimentary delivery systems. Systems consist of either intake pipes (if surface supply) or wells (if groundwater source), pumphouses (equipped with filtration and chlorination), heat traced distribution lines and one or more standpipe buildings.

Upon completion of the construction phase the department assesses operating costs, conducts on-site inspections, tests water for quality and chlorination levels, and trains local residents in operation and maintenance of the system prior to turning it over to the community.

#### Special Mature Students Program

This activity offers degree level university programs in selected schools and faculties at Brandon University and the University of Manitoba. As well, there is a Registered Nurses Program at Brandon General Hospital. It provides for training allowances, instruction costs, program support costs, counselling, costs of administration, field costs of supervision and office expenses.

Under the Canada-Manatoba Northlands Agreement DIAND provides financial support to these programs.

#### Band Staff Training

The intent of this activity is to develop the skills required by Band Chiefs, Councillors, and council staff for effective Band management and local government development. The following courses are supported:

- Courses jointly developed by DIAND and Oo-Za-We-Kwun Centre (Rivers) such as the Basic Management Training Program, the Band Management/Administration Training Program, Orientation to Band Government, Management Training Program Development, and skill courses, modular in structure, which relate to accounting, secretarial sciences, and economic development.
- Courses developed by the Prince Albert Centre for Training and Research Development and tailored to meet respective community needs.
- Law enforcement training within the Band Council Police Training Program, and the Reserve Constable Training Program.
- Welfare Administration and related social education courses that may be offered through the School of Social Work, University of Manitoba, and/or by other instructional resource means (i.e. by private contract; DIAND staff).

#### BUNTEP

This activity is an off-campus teacher training program delivered to students residing in remote northern communities. It is a three year program which leads to an elementary teaching certificate. DIAND assists in the operation of the BUNTEP centres, located in northern Indian Reserve Communities, by providing classroom facilities in schools or by providing suitable instructional area elsewhere to facilitate program delivery.

#### Community College Training

This activity provides the opportunity to acquire specialized skills required for gainful employment in a wide range of occupations. Support is provided to students attending community colleges both within and outside Manitoba. Support is available for attendance in private college and in commercial training centres where approved courses of specialized skills at a post-secondary level are offered.

Community Counsellor Training Program

This activity enables Home/School Co-ordinators to pursue suitable training for future employment as education officers or counsellors in Reserve communities. The training program includes attendance at the University of Manitoba for 45 weeks over a three-year period leading to a certificate in Community Counselling. Credits provided in the course may be applied to degree programs. Support may include tuition fees, books, travel and other allowances, supplies, and special needs as required.

#### Community Educators Program

Support is provided to Band Councils employing a Community Educator who was trained originally through an arrangement with the Province of Manitoba. The central function of Community Educator is to provide direct counselling services to those persons on a Reserve requiring assistance relating to post-secondary education, skills training programs, career orientation and development, and to other matters which deal with a support system for ongoing education. Support may include wages of the Community Educator, office space, telephone, travel allowances, and other required needs.

#### CORE

CORE is a special native students program operated by Brandon University to prepare students for regular university. During the twelve month program involving credit and non-credit courses, CORE provides the students with an opportunity to assess their interests and aptitudes for various fields of further study. Upon completion, students may then choose to enroll in faculty studies offered at the Universities of Brandon, Manitoba and Winnipeg as regular native students. Support is provided in the form of tuition, books, supplies, travel assistance, living and other allowances, housing assistance, counselling services and special needs as required.

#### IMPACTE

IMPACTE, initiated and operated prior to BUNTEP, is an on-campus teacher training program at the Brandon University. It is a three year full time University Program leading to a teaching certificate. Support is provided to students enrolled in this program by transferring funds on their behalf to Brandon University for tuition, books, travel, living and other allowances, counselling services, housing assistance and special needs as required.

PENT (Project for Education of Native Teachers)

This activity provides teacher aides with an opportunity to further their education at Brandon University. Participants are sponsored for five spring and summer sessions (May through August) leading to teacher certification. Those graduating are employed at an initial salary above the normal intake level based upon the number of years' experience gained.

## Regular University

This activity enables students enrolled at universities in Manitoba, or an approved university outside the province, to pursue required training for professional employment. Support is provided in the form of tuition fees, books, travel costs, living allowances, counselling services and special needs.

These activities are totally funded and implemented by DIAND and are designed to increase the participation of northern Treaty Indian people in the labour force.

Basic Job Readiness Training (BJRT)

This activity is funded by CEIC and is offered within the local community or at Keewatin Community College in The Pas. It provides special academic training to upgrade the skills of Native people.

#### Employment Placement

This activity provides immediate assistance to placing people in employment situations. Support is provided, only when it cannot be obtained from CEIC and may include the purchase of clothing, tools, travel and other allowances, and related special needs.

#### General Adult Education

This activity provides support to people actively engaged in community school committees and social development programs. Funds for activities of school committees are provided to Band Councils on a per capita basis. Individual skill development programs which meet family and community needs are provided at the request of the Indian community.

Relocation Programs

This activity provides support to mobility or relocation programs with a wide range of assistance services. Funds are available for community liaison, home counselling, recreational activities, housing assistance, etc.

Summer Student Employment

Funds are provided for work activity projects developed and administered by either Band Councils or participating students. Support funding includes the wages of those students employed on the projects and of those students employed as area co-ordinators for projects.

Training on-the-job

Support is provided to employees of Parks Canada (attendants, game wardens, etc.); CEIC (clerks, manpower counsellors); Public Service Commission (clerks, etc.); and DIAND (clerks, employment training facilitators, etc.). It includes salary equivalence during the required training period and related special needs.

#### Surveys

Doppler Station - ground satelite system which is used for surveying.

Waste Management Demonstration Project

This activity was undertaken to test and evaluate the performance of innovative waste management processes and methods under northern conditions.

Youth Travel

The intent of this activity is to provide an opportunity for students in Grades I through XII in northern and remote communities to participate in educational travel.
