
FOREWORD

The first five annual Progress Reports By Community, covering programming for 1976/77, 1977/78, 1978/79, 1979/80, 1980/81, were published in the fall of 1977, the summer of 1979, the fall of 1980, the winter of 1981 and the fall of 1982.


The Community Report 1981/82 presents a listing of activities delivered to each community under the Agreement. The information is drawn from the Canada/Manitoba Northlands Agreement Progress Report for 1981/82.

This Community Report has an attached matrix which displays the Agreement by sectors, programs, projects and activities. There is an alphabetical listing of northern communities by which residents may easily identify activities, a section containing information relevant to northern communities in general, a glossary of terms and a review of federal and provincial departments which have carried out the activities.



CANADA/MANITOBA NORTHLANDS AGREEMENT

BACKGROUND - 1981-82

The Canada/Manitoba Northlands Agreement expiry date was March 31, 1981. However, at that time a new Northern Development Agreement had not been signed. For this reason and because a number of projects began under Northlands were incomplete, it was agreed by the Governments of Canada and Manitoba to extend the Northlands Agreement through 1982. An amendment to the agreement (Amendment #3) extended its' duration for one year to March 31, 1982 and facilitated the completion of two road projects and selected community infrastructure projects. A separate Amendment (number 4) signed December 18, 1981 provided an additional 7.5 million to facilitate the continued cost-sharing of human development programs. This additional authority provided cost-sharing for extension and community affairs, manpower support services and adult professional development.

GLOSSARY OF ACTIVITIES AND SPECIALIZED TERMS*

Brandon University Northern Teacher Education Program (BUNTEP)

The intent of this activity is to meet the need and demand for teachers in remote communities by providing teacher training and support to students who would otherwise have limited access to this opportunity.

Community Infrastructure Services/ Waste Disposal Facilities

The objective of this activity is to develop and provide facilities for the disposal of wastes in northern Indian communities. It includes the design to upgrade and expand existing lagoons and plants, or to construct waste disposal facilities such as lagoons, sewage collection and treatment systems, incinerators, landfill sites, etc.

Community Planning

This activity is designed to provide technical advice and funds to northern Indian communities providing a framework for long range comprehensive policies and programs with regards to community development.

Community Roads

This activity provides basic internal community access systems such as roads, causeways, bridges, ferries, docks and the stockpiling of materials in advance of these projects.

Community Wildlife Management

This activity was designed to benefit residents of northern communities by examining methods of improving the utilization and management of wildlife resources.

* Specialized terms are referred to under their appropriate activity.

Cultural and Recreation Services

This activity assists northern communities to develop recreational opportunities to meet the needs of their citizens. The following services are provided:

- i) Arts Equipment Grant - provides assistance to communities in the purchase of various creative arts equipment.
- ii) Community Recreation Workers - provides full-time co-ordination of recreation services in remote communities. Training, upgrading and supervision of community recreation workers in remote northern communities was also provided.
- iii) Conferences - to provide a forum for the exchange of ideas, information giving and the planning and evaluation of local, regional and provincial recreation services.
- iv) Consultative Services - provides consultation and support in the planning and management of recreation services.
- v) Demonstrations - to expose communities to new recreation activities at the local, regional and provincial levels.
- vi) Energy Assistance Program - provided aid and offset the effects of Manitoba Hydro's demand billing system on major recreational facilities.
- vii) Equipment Grant to Communities - provides assistance to communities in the purchase of recreational equipment.
- viii) Facilities Consultation - provides a consultative service to communities and districts for the planning, operation and maintenance of major recreation facilities.
- ix) Facilities Grants - a program funded out of lotteries revenue, in support of the construction and renovation of recreational facilities.

Cultural and Recreation Services (continued)

- x) Frontier Games - provides students within the Frontier School Division with competitive activities and an opportunity for community exchange.
- xi) Leadership Training - provides workshops, clinics and courses for the development of part-time and full-time recreation leaders who would return and work in their communities.
- xii) New Activities Assistance - provides communities with assistance in the initiation of new activities with the intention of establishing programs.
- xiii) Regional Newsletter - provides information as well as a medium for the dispersal of information, programs and ideas among all northern Manitoba communities.
- xiv) Skill Development Activities - provides schools, clinics and workshops to develop a base for leaders in activities which are underdeveloped.

Employment Services

Progress under this activity is reported chiefly in terms of the following two components:

- i) Youth Corps - this component is designed to create summer jobs for youths in remote communities.
- ii) Relocation Services - this component is designed to move residents of remote communities to jobs in industrial centres.

Family Support Services

This activity provides educational programs in aid of nutrition, money management, home-making skills and housing for the shifting life patterns of socio-economic development in the north.

Fire Protection/Prevention (DNA)

This activity provides northern remote communities with basic protective fire fighting equipment, training necessary to operate and maintain such equipment and fire prevention knowledge.

- i) Fire College - provides training at the Brandon Fire College for northern individuals who will, in turn, train local volunteer fire departments.
- ii) Regional Workshops - community representatives received specialized training at regional workshops which was to be taken back to the home community. Training included cardio-pulmonary resuscitation, rescue techniques and the use and maintenance of portable fire extinguishers.

4-H North

This activity is a program which assists young people to acquire skills, attitudes and knowledge in the areas of project learning and group process. 4-H North promotes activities through northern youth conferences, public meetings with organizations and groups as well as expanding the number of members, leaders and clubs.

Local Government and Community Services (DNA)

This activity was designed to provide information services, training and exposure programs and other required resources in support of residents of northern remote communities for their increased participation in local and regional socio-economic opportunities and for their increased participation in the development of local government and community affairs.

New Careers

This activity is designed to increase the participation of people from remote northern communities in professional, para-professional, technical and

New Careers (continued)

administrative jobs in both remote and urban centres. It consists of on-the-job training, related specifically to the skills and knowledge needed to perform particular jobs. For this purpose, it provides for staff, costs of administration, counselling, training allowances, travel, field cost of supervision and office expenses.

Northern Gardening

Northern horticultural programming was designed to meet the basic goal of developing land skills in the production of vegetables in northern and remote communities thereby increasing the opportunity for improving the nutritional base of residents living in these communities.

- i) Commercial Projects - six communities engaged in commercial projects in 1978/79 with development varying in size from 1 to 25 acres.
- ii) Demonstrations - garden demonstrations were conducted and run by nutrition advisors who also collected production and variety performance data.
- iii) Horticultural Information - this was the most basic service provided under Northern Gardening to participating communities with main delivery through C.B.C. North Country Radio.
- iv) Nutrition Advisors - this program was the main delivery mechanism in promoting gardening to seven northern locations.
- v) Technical Backup - provided technical assistance with emphasis on the larger scale projects such as Thicket Portage and Norway House.

Northern Community Planning

The intent of this activity is to assist remote northern communities by producing a variety of cultural, physical and cadastral maps also indicating property ownership, land use and residence to support community planning.

Safe Water Supply (DNA)

This activity provides remote communities with potable water utilizing rudimentary delivery systems. Systems consist of either intake pipes (if surface supply) or well (if groundwater source), pumphouses (equipped with filtration and chlorination), heat traced distribution lines and one or more standpipe buildings.

Upon completion of the construction phase the department assesses operating costs, conducts on-site inspection, tests water for quality and chlorination levels, and trains local residents in operation and maintenance of the system prior to turning it over to the community.

Special Mature Students Program (ACCESS)

The Special Mature Students Program is designed to deliver a degree level university program, community college diploma or entrance in the School of Medicine to people who traditionally have not had the opportunity for such an education. Courses offered in selected schools and faculties at Brandon University, the University of Manitoba, Brandon General Hospital (which offers a Registered Nursing Program) and Red River Community College.

It provides for training allowances, instruction costs, program support costs, counselling, costs of administration, field costs of supervision and office expenses.

Youth Travel

The intent of this activity is to provide an opportunity for students in Grades 1 through XII in northern and remote communities to participate in educational travel.
