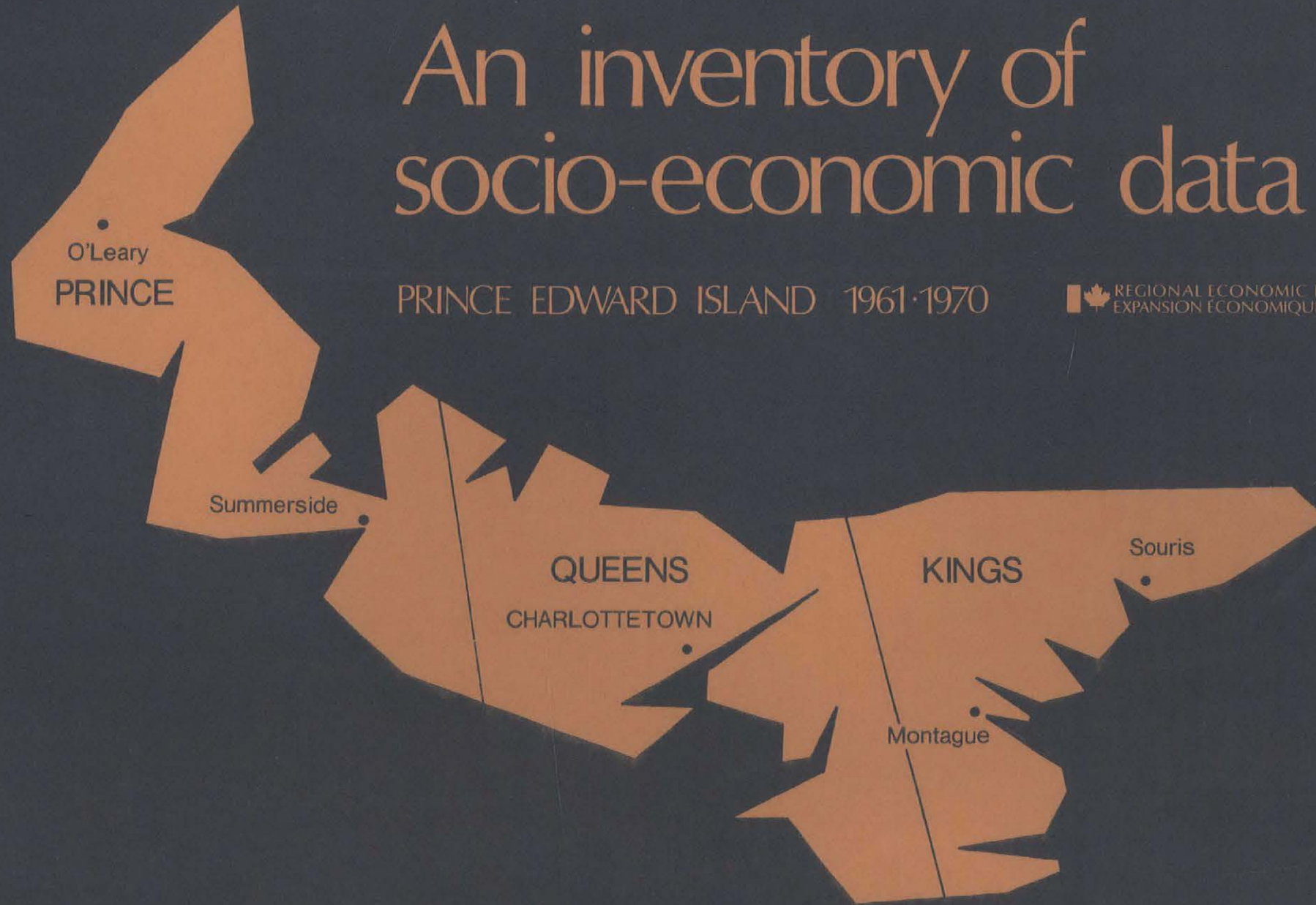

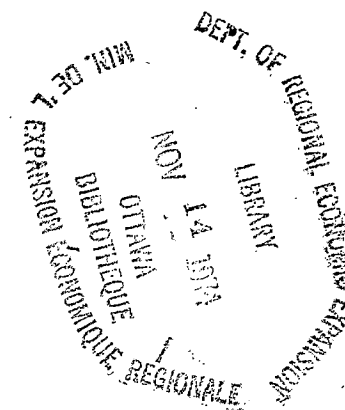

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FOREWORD

Undertaken by the Program Evaluation Branch of the Canada Department of Regional Economic Expansion with the cooperation and assistance of the Government of Prince Edward Island, the following inventory compilation was approved jointly by Canada and the Province under "The Development Plan for Prince Edward Island".

Presented whenever possible as a time series from 1961 - 1970, the data inventory is intended to give a statistical picture of all the important sectors of P.E.I. influenced by "The Plan". As data for the Atlantic Provinces and Canada are given in many instances, comparisons can be made among various regions of Canada.

The Inventory's uses are expected to be many. Those wishing to study the Island may use the data to measure the provincial economic and social environment discretely or they may choose to project the data to simulate baseline conditions. However, it should be recognized that since "The Development Plan for Prince Edward Island" is comprehensive in scope and is in fact designed to effect major revisions in the Island make-up, the trends apparent in the time series may well shift dramatically.

It is anticipated also that individual program and project managers of "The Plan" will use the data for management purposes. Implementors, armed with both trend patterns and actual figures, may be able to establish yardsticks with which to effectively gauge their own performance and formulate macro-goals for which to strive.

Continued updating of this document would be desirable if it is to retain its currency. We anticipate that this will be agreed to and will occur.

The data, compiled by Messrs. T. Brennan, R. Callaghan, J. Cronier, J. Gibson and T. Rankin under the supervision of M. Parnes was amassed during the three month period, June - August, 1971.

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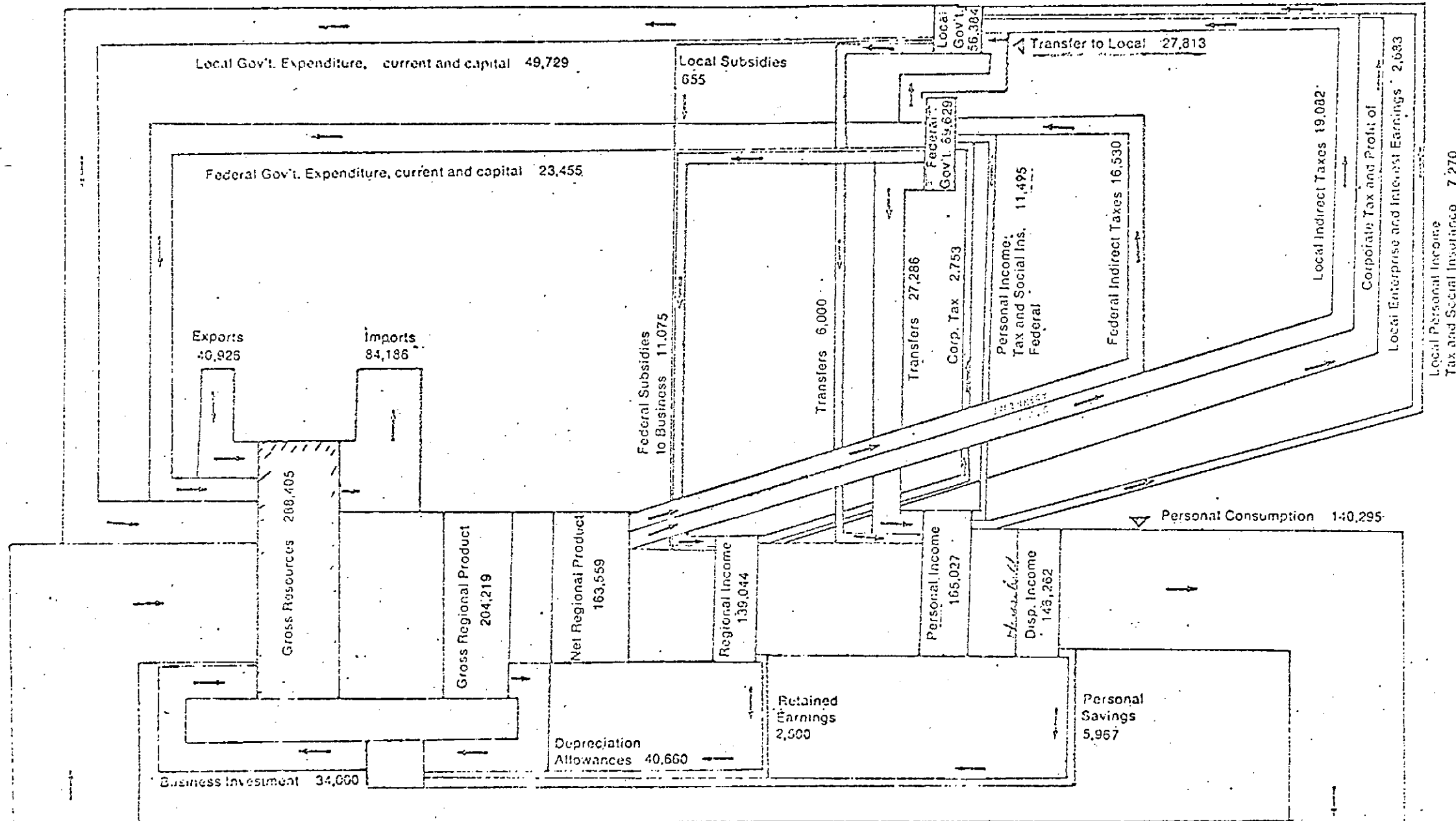

GROSS REGIONAL EXPENDITURE

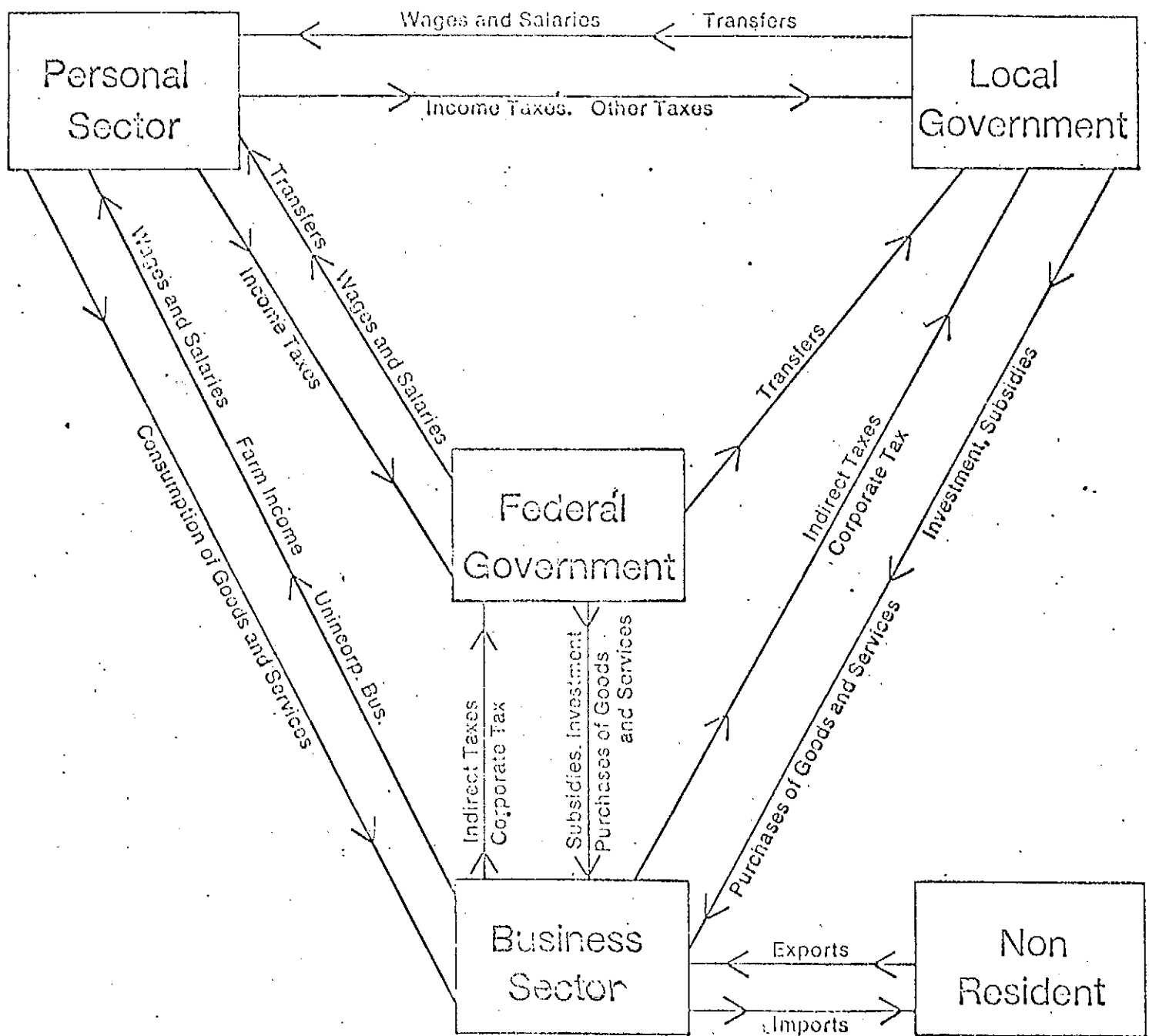

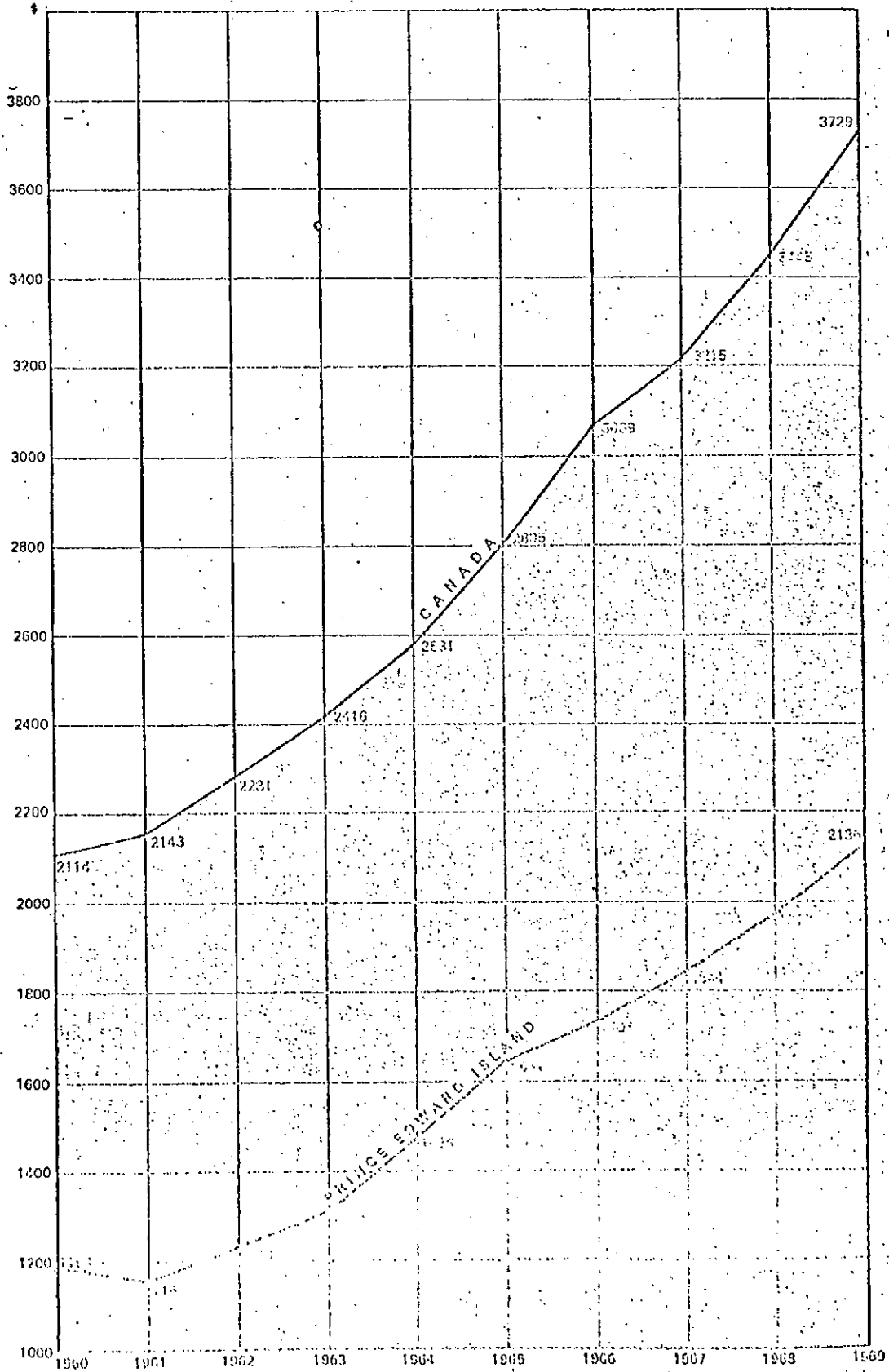

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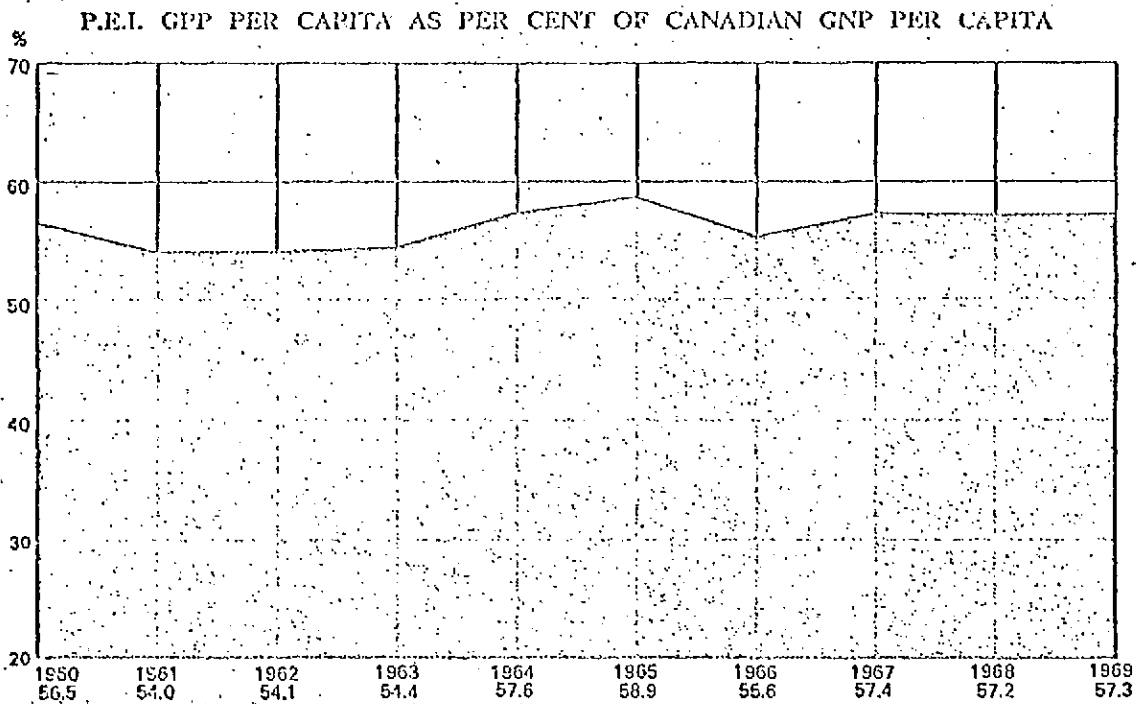

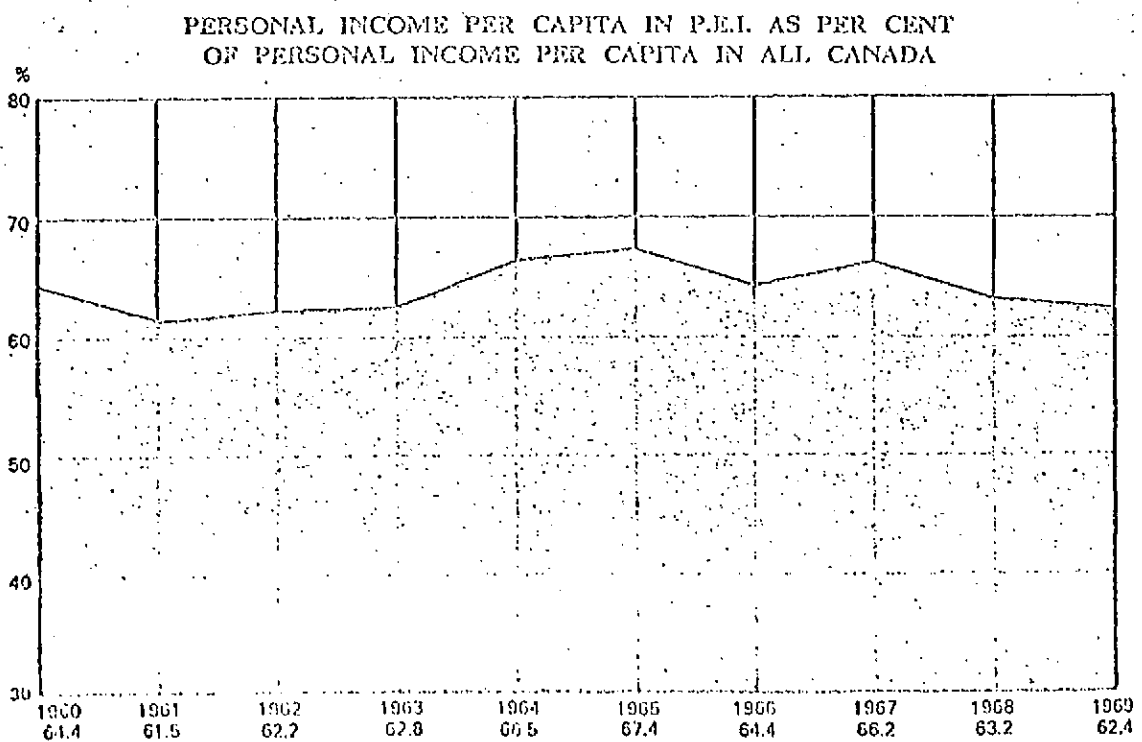
GNP PER CAPITA—CANADA AND GPP PER CAPITA—P.E.I.

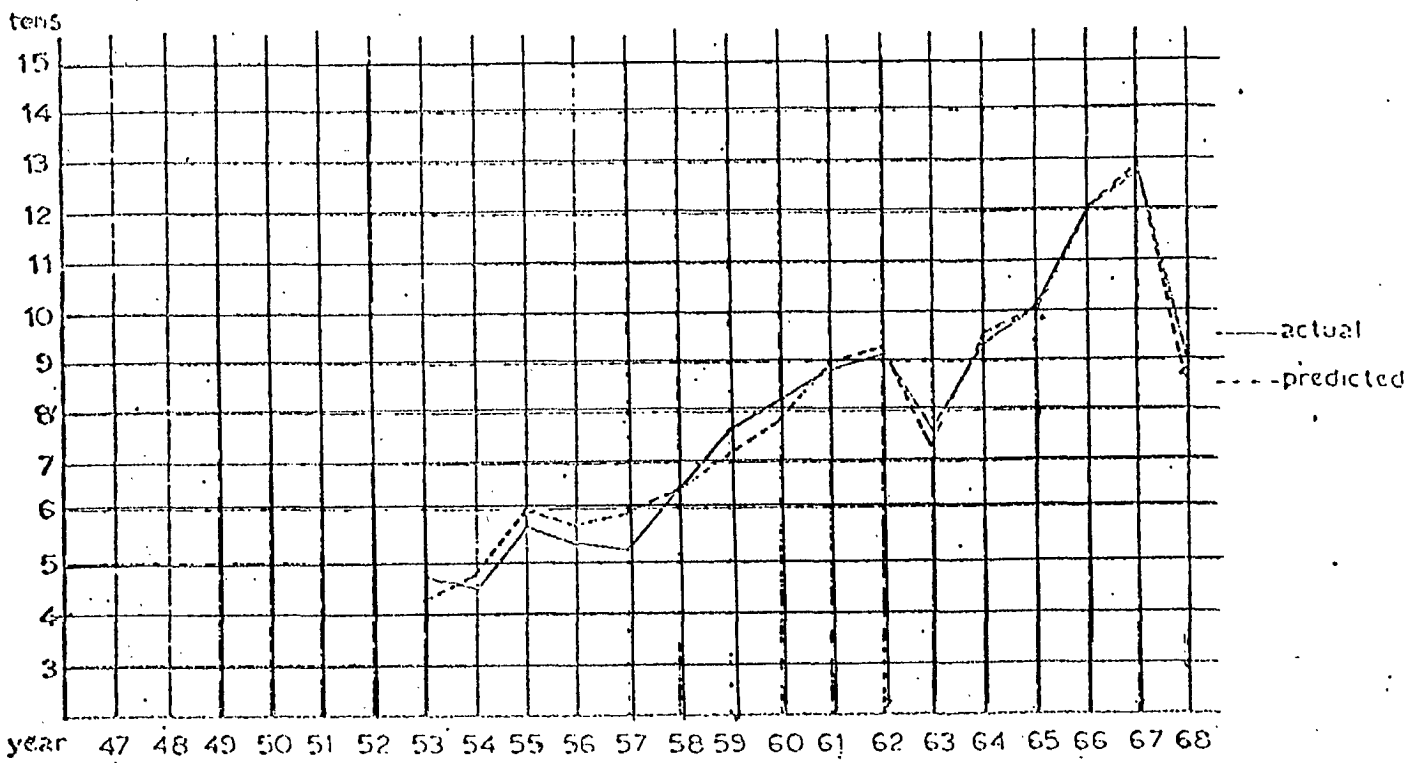

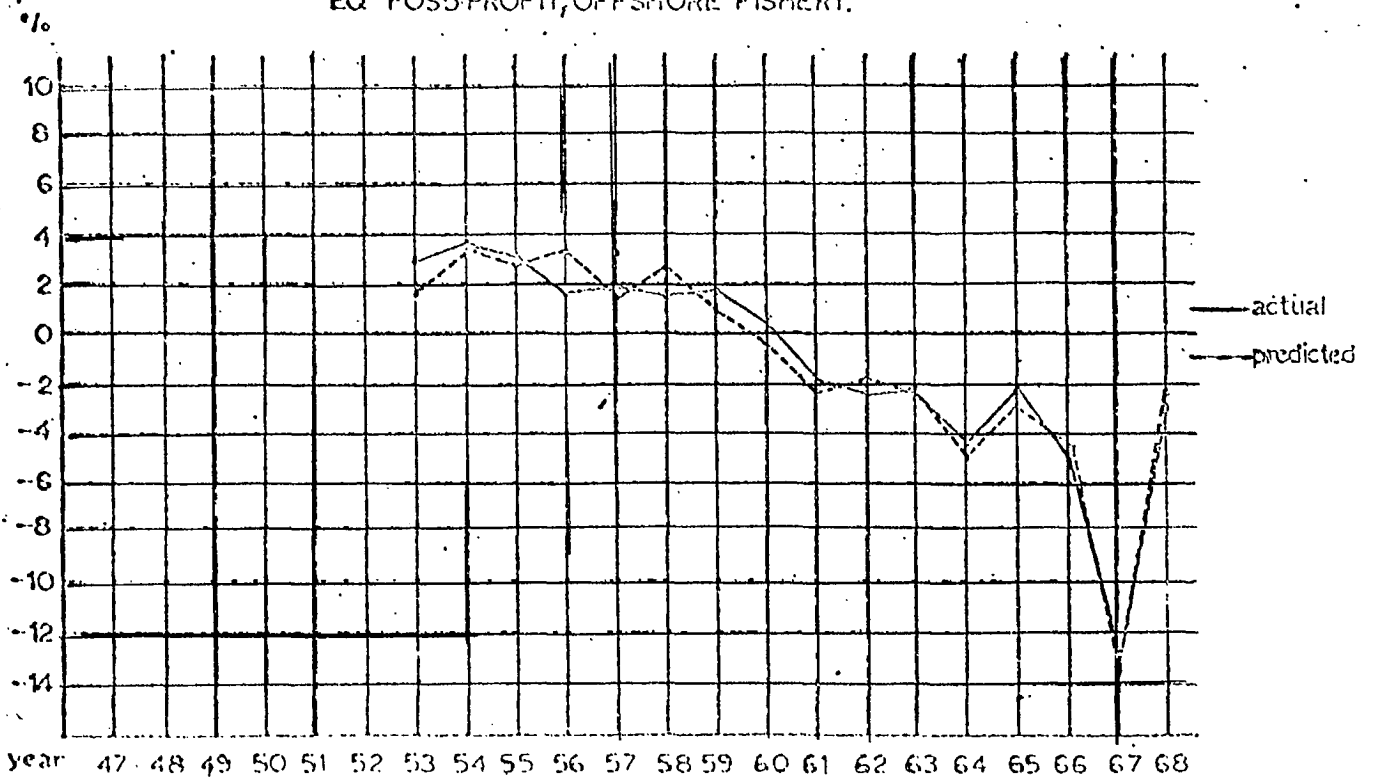

EQ FOS4: EMPLOYMENT, OFFSHORE FISHERY

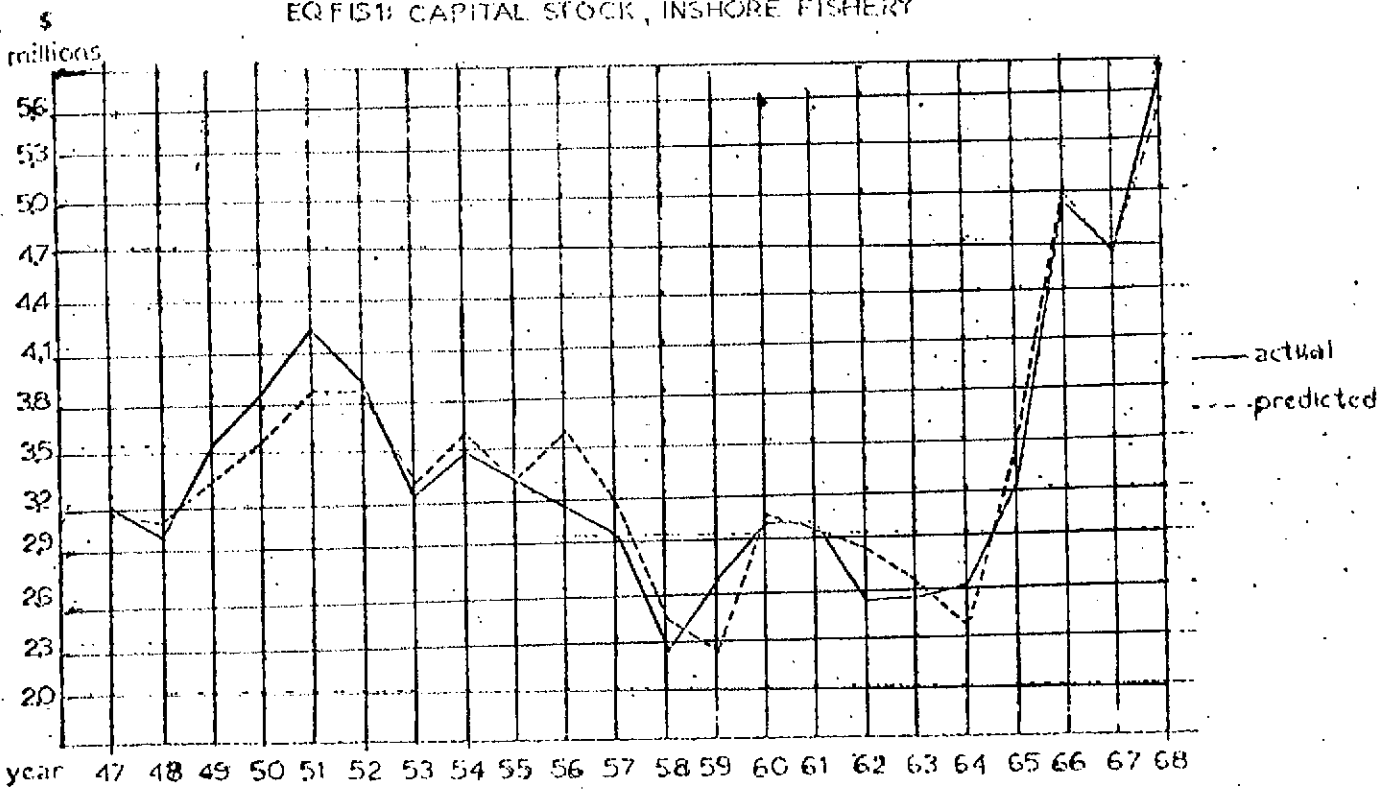


EQ FOS5: PROFIT, OFFSHORE FISHERY.

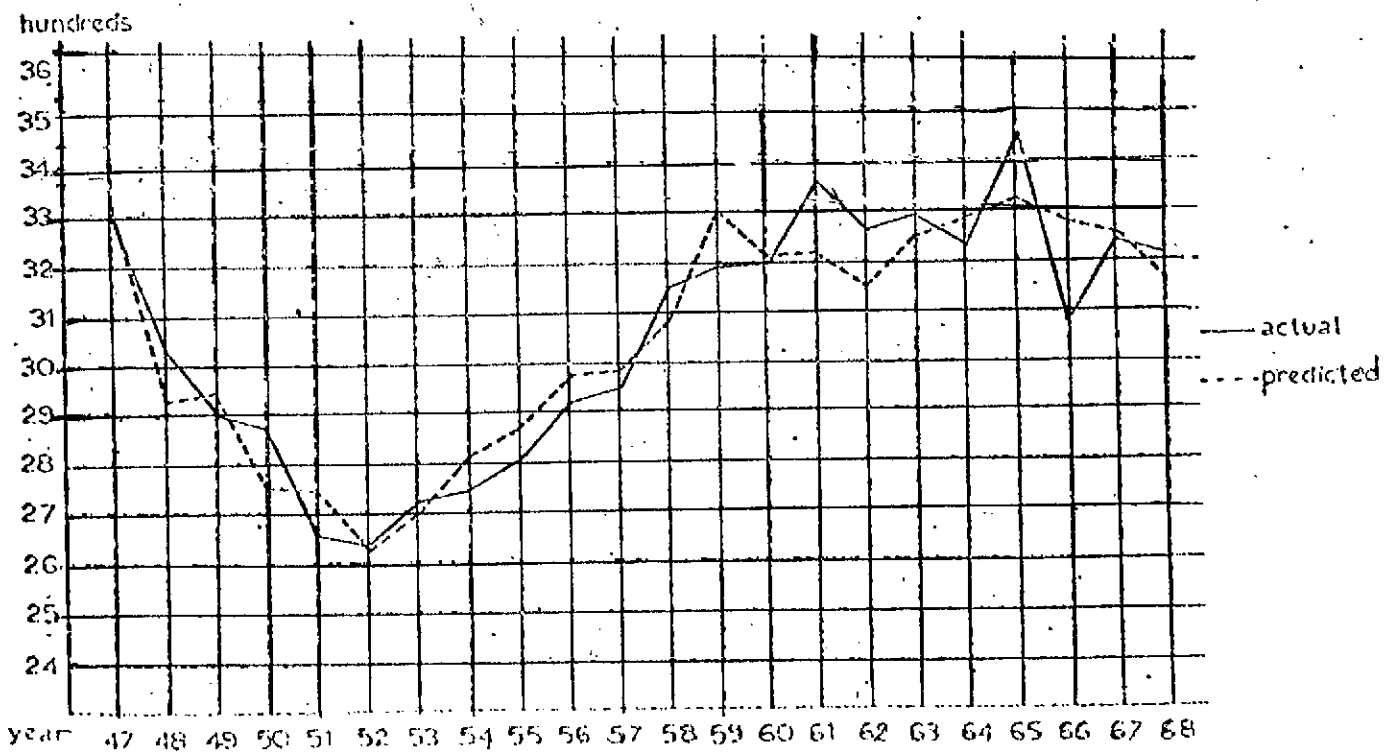

EQFIS1: CAPITAL STOCK, INSHORE FISHERY

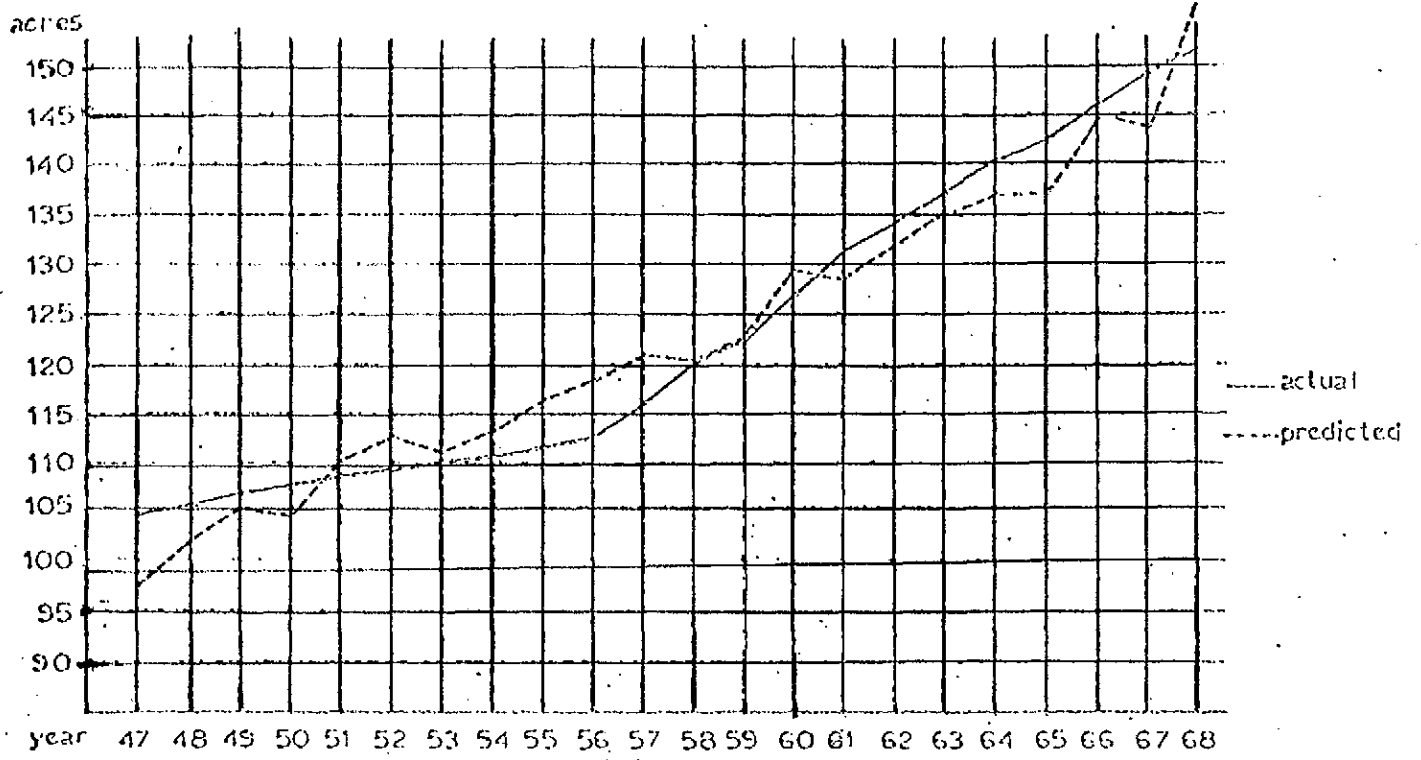


EQFIS2: EMPLOYMENT INSHORE FISHERY

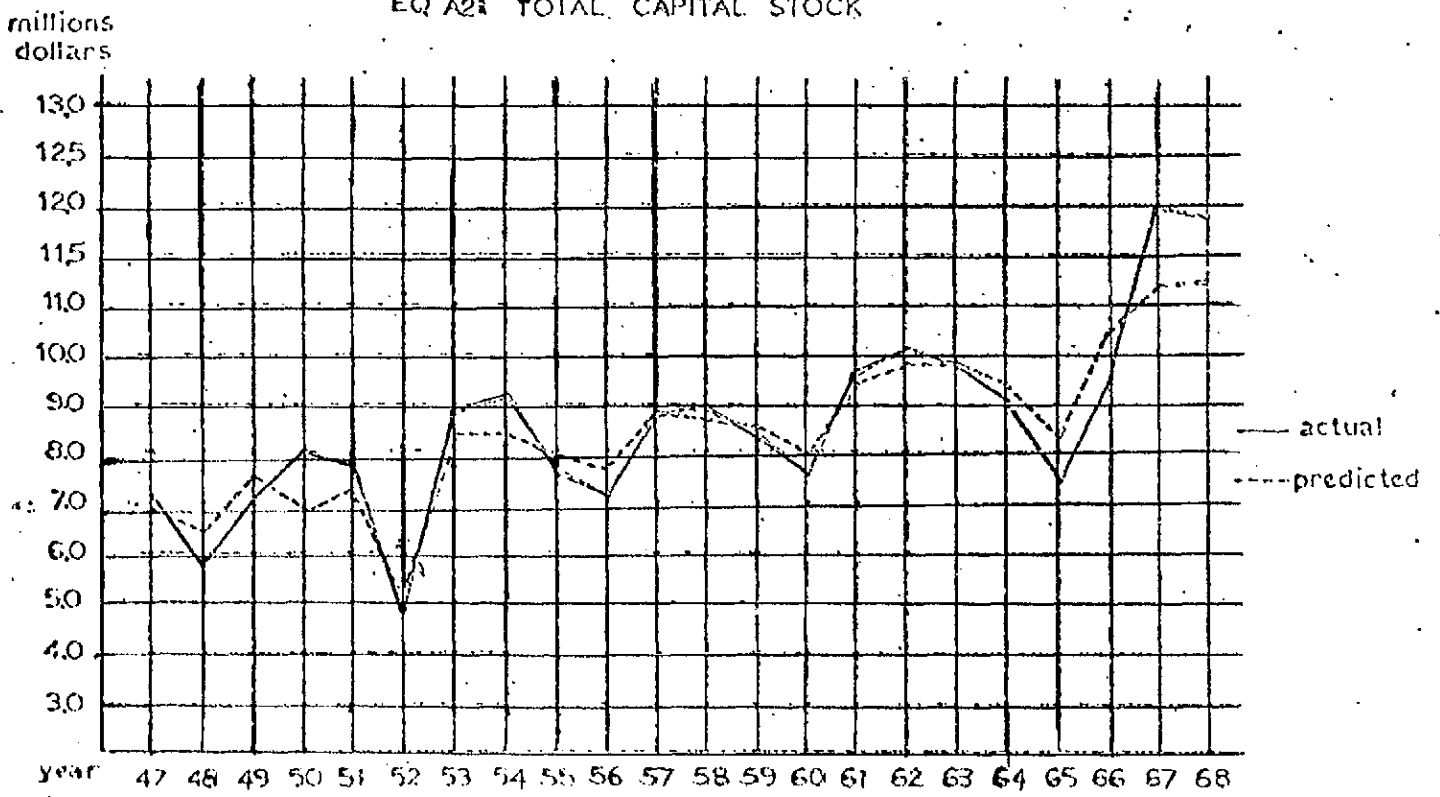

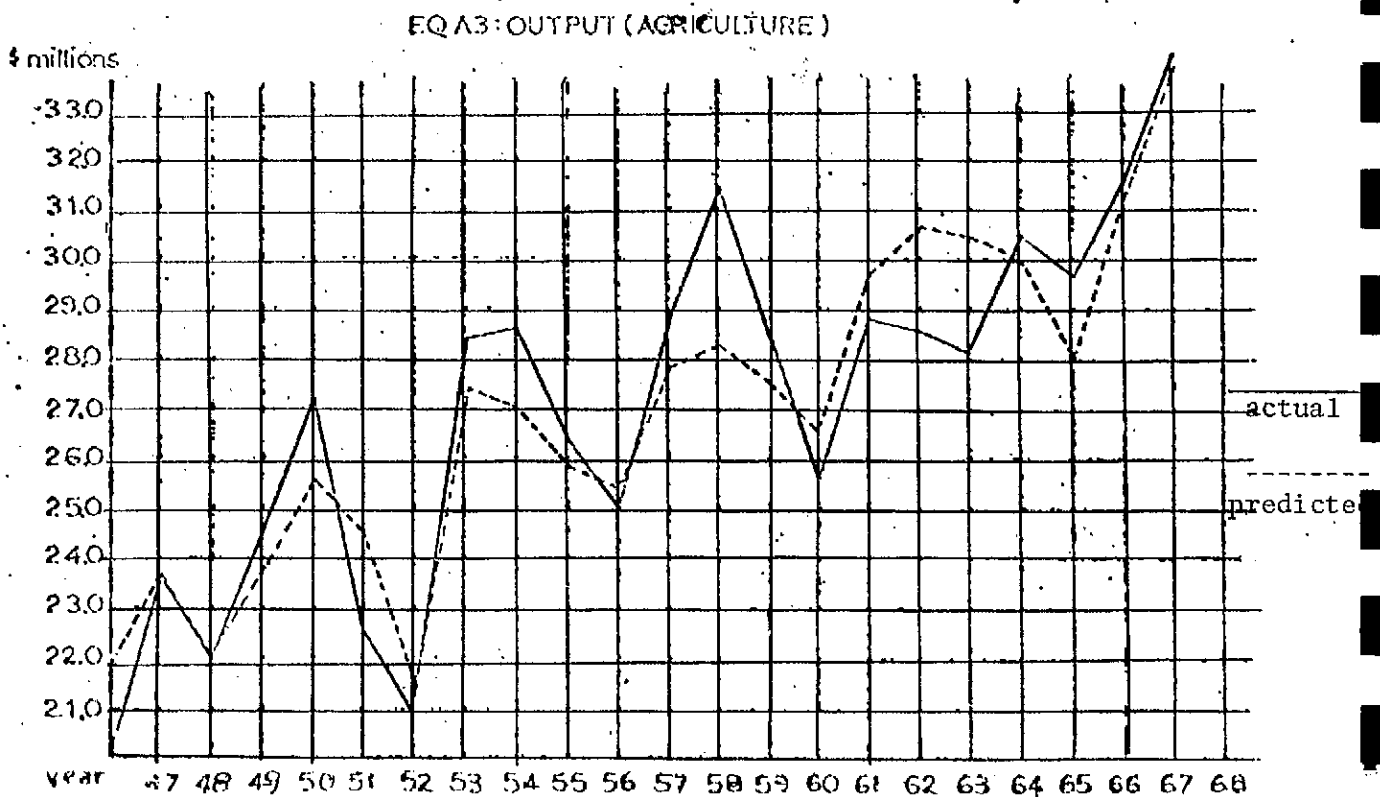
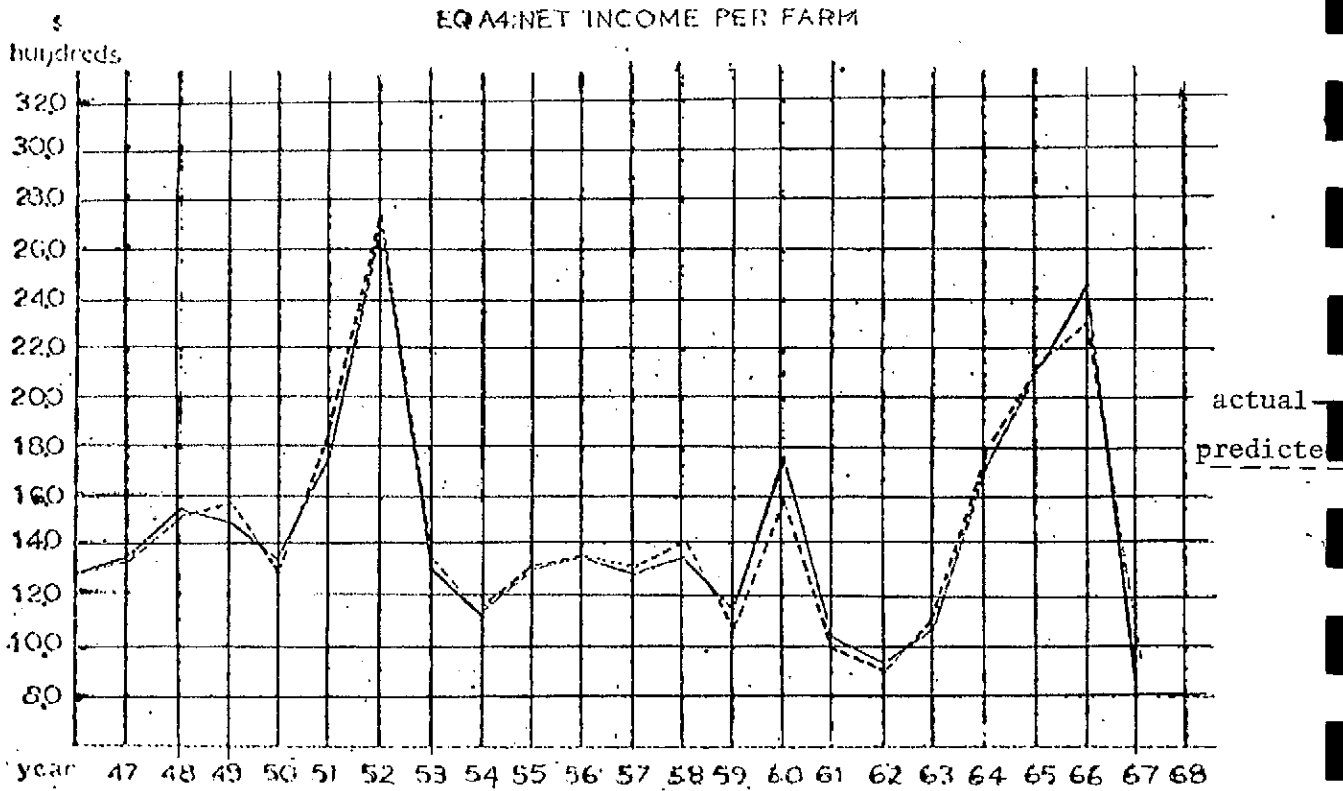
EQ A1: ACTUAL FARM SIZE



EQ A2: TOTAL CAPITAL STOCK

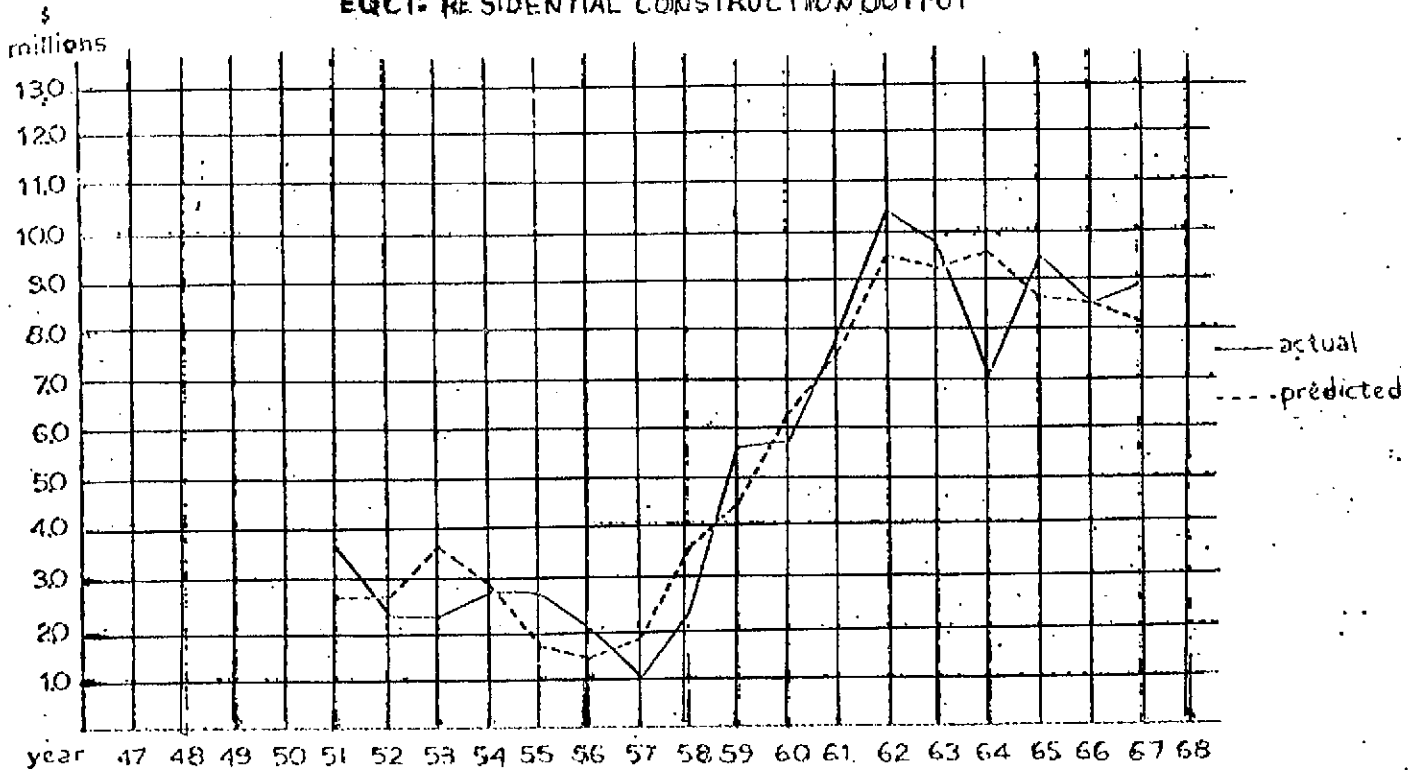

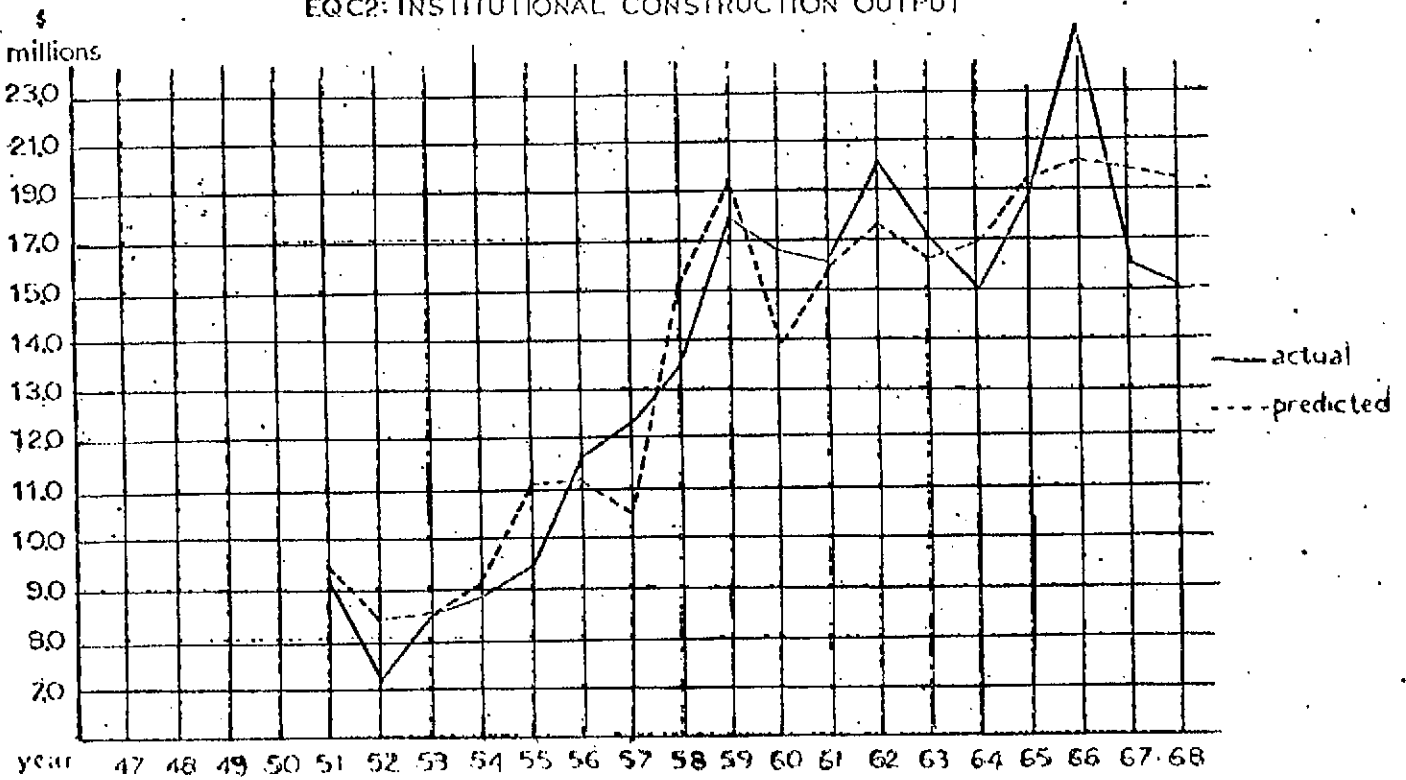

EQC1: RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION OUTPUT

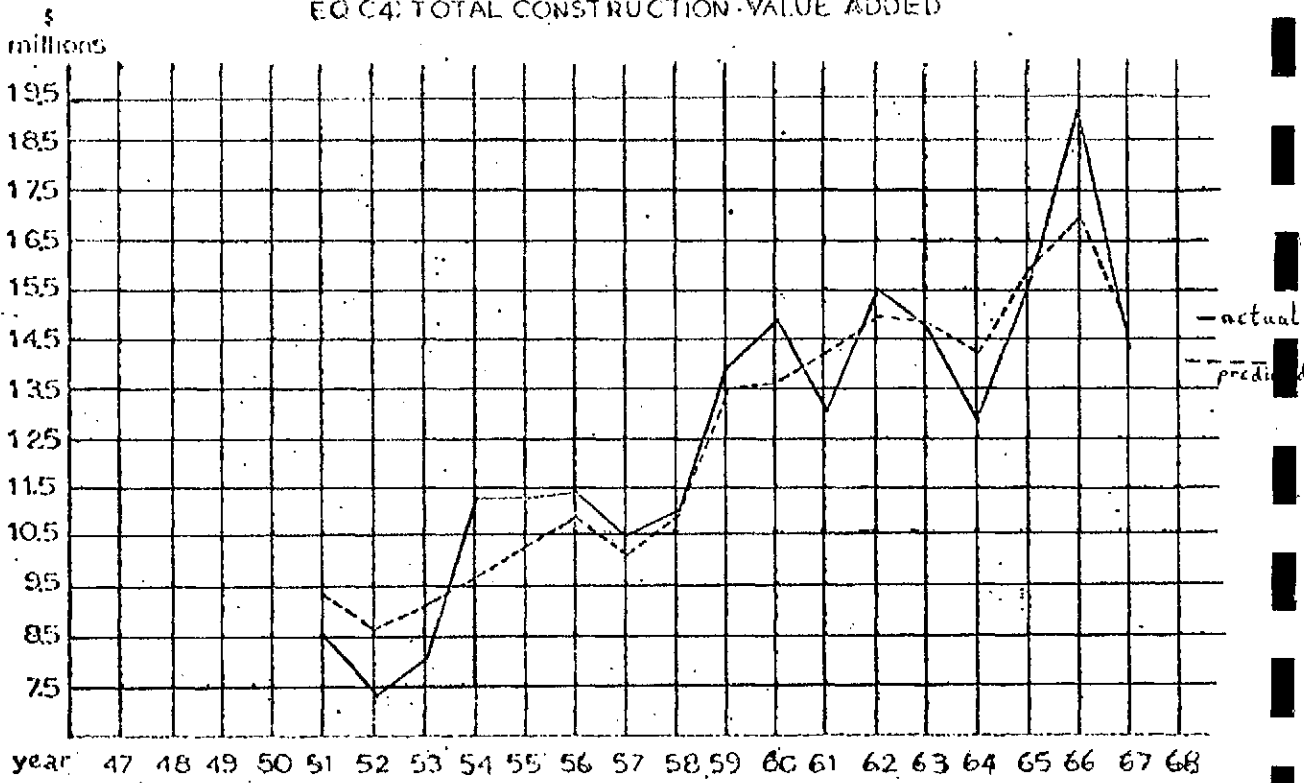


EQC2: INSTITUTIONAL CONSTRUCTION OUTPUT

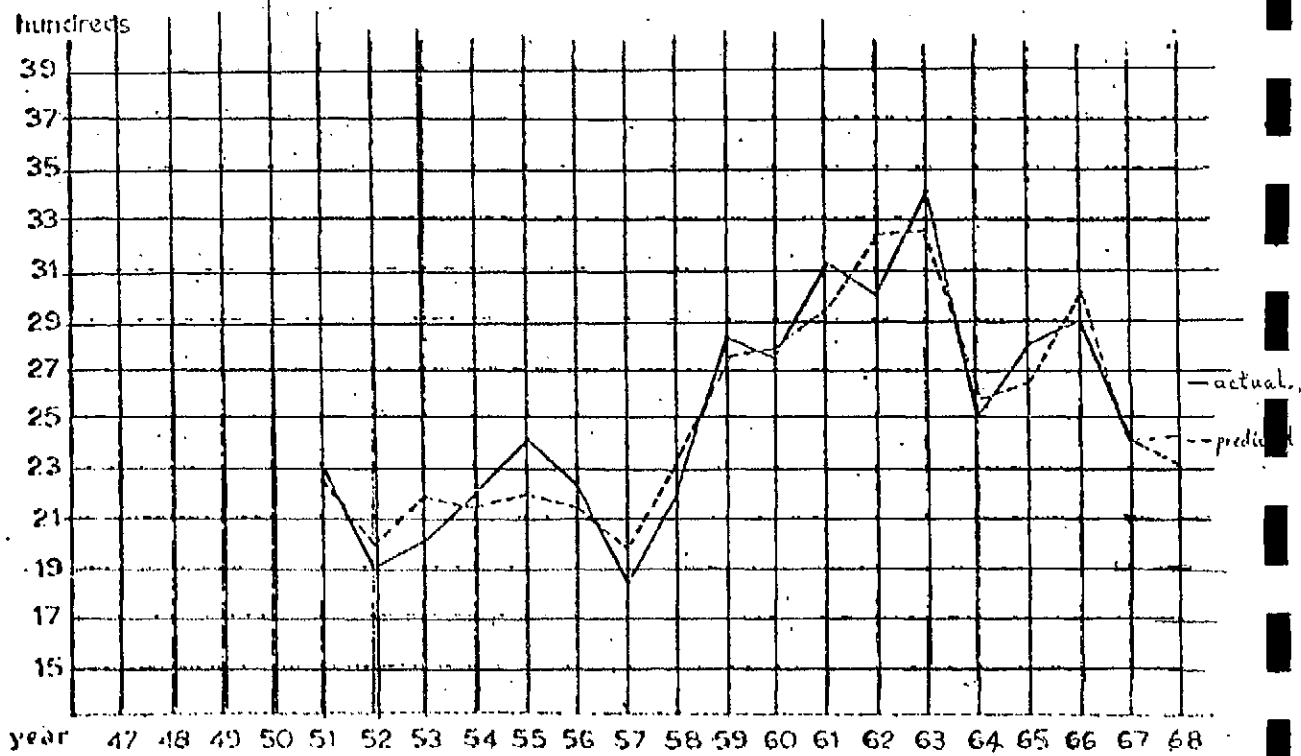

EQ C4: TOTAL CONSTRUCTION VALUE ADDED

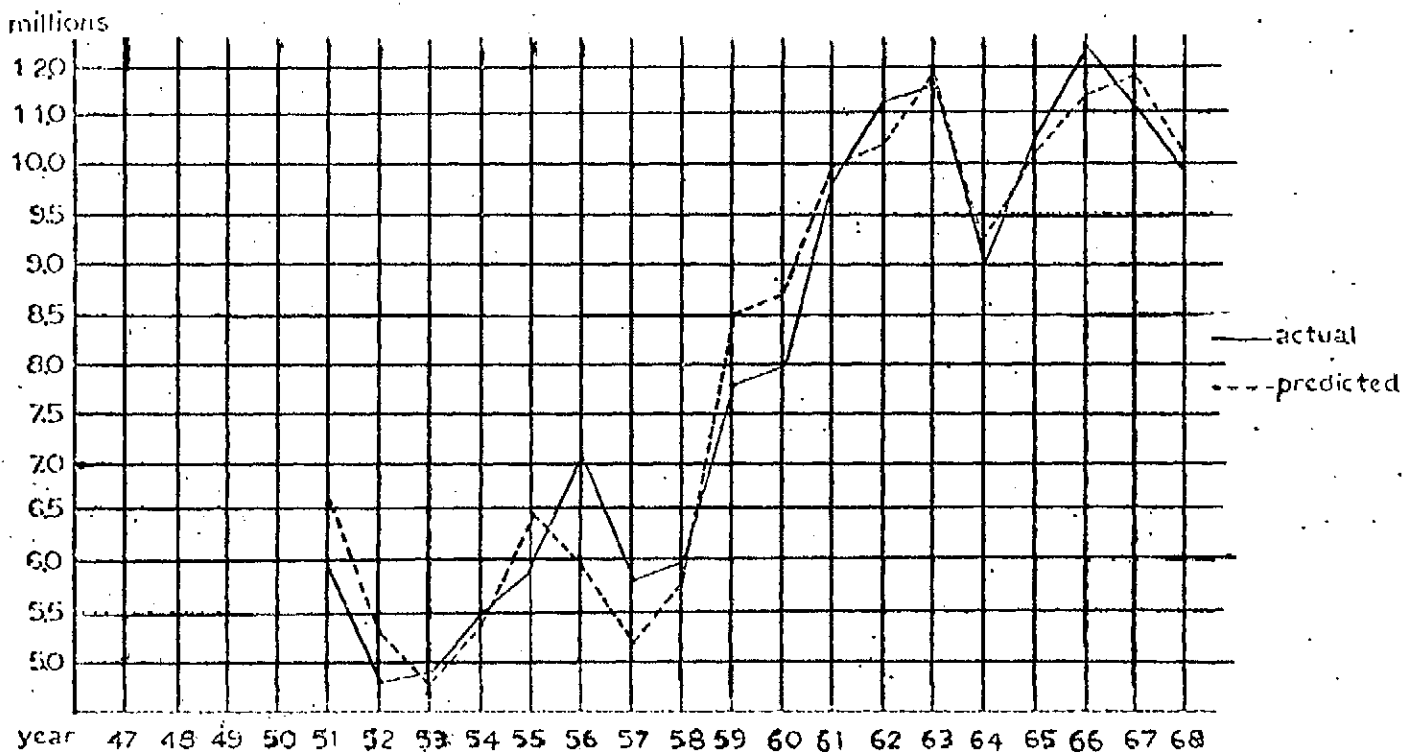


EQ C5: TOTAL CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYMENT



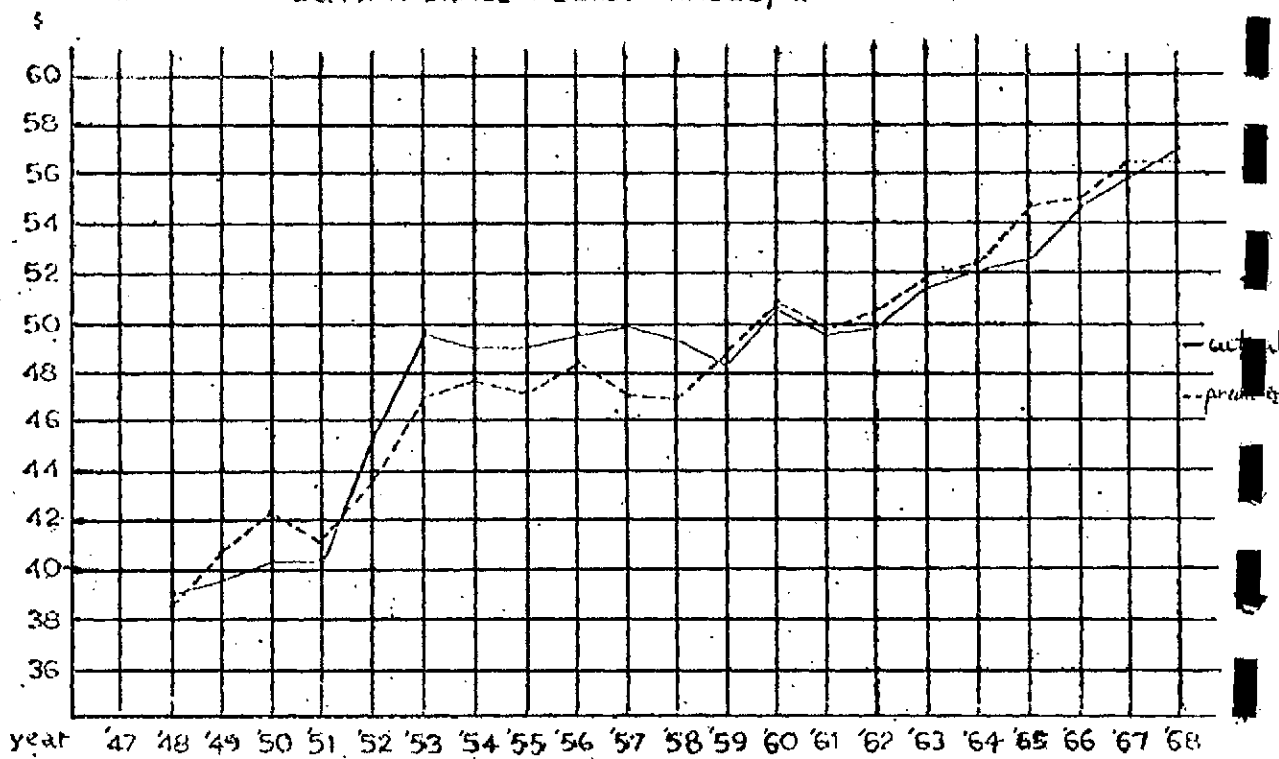

EQ C6: TOTAL CONSTRUCTION WAGE BILL

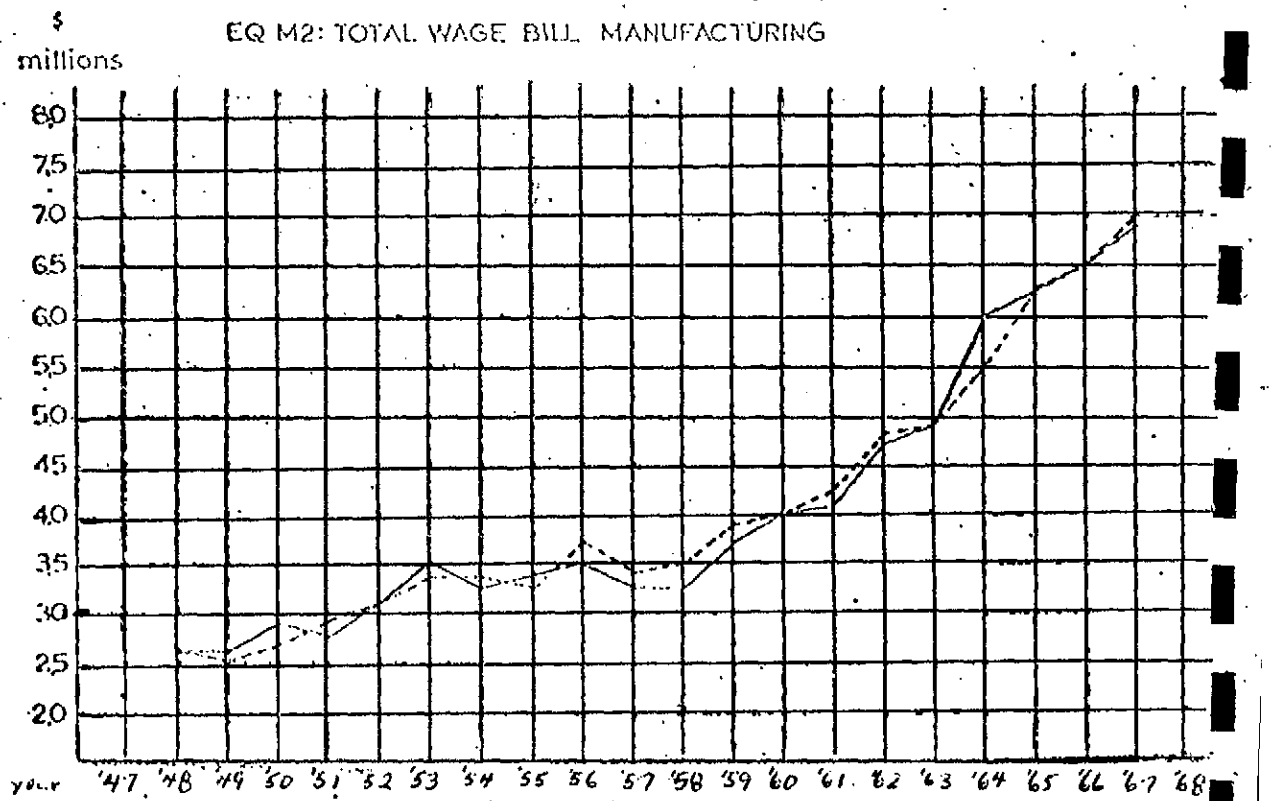

EQ M1 AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGES, MANUFACTURING

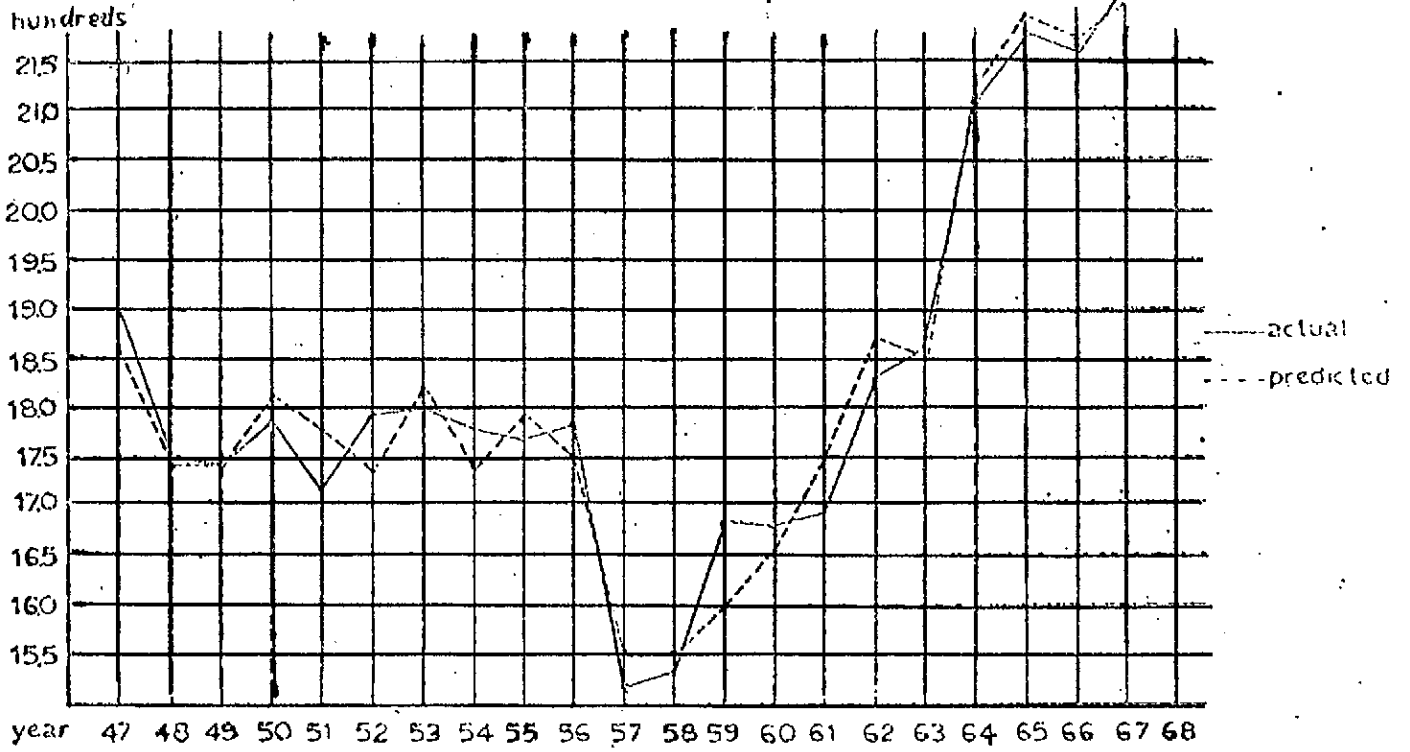


EQ M2: TOTAL WAGE BILL, MANUFACTURING

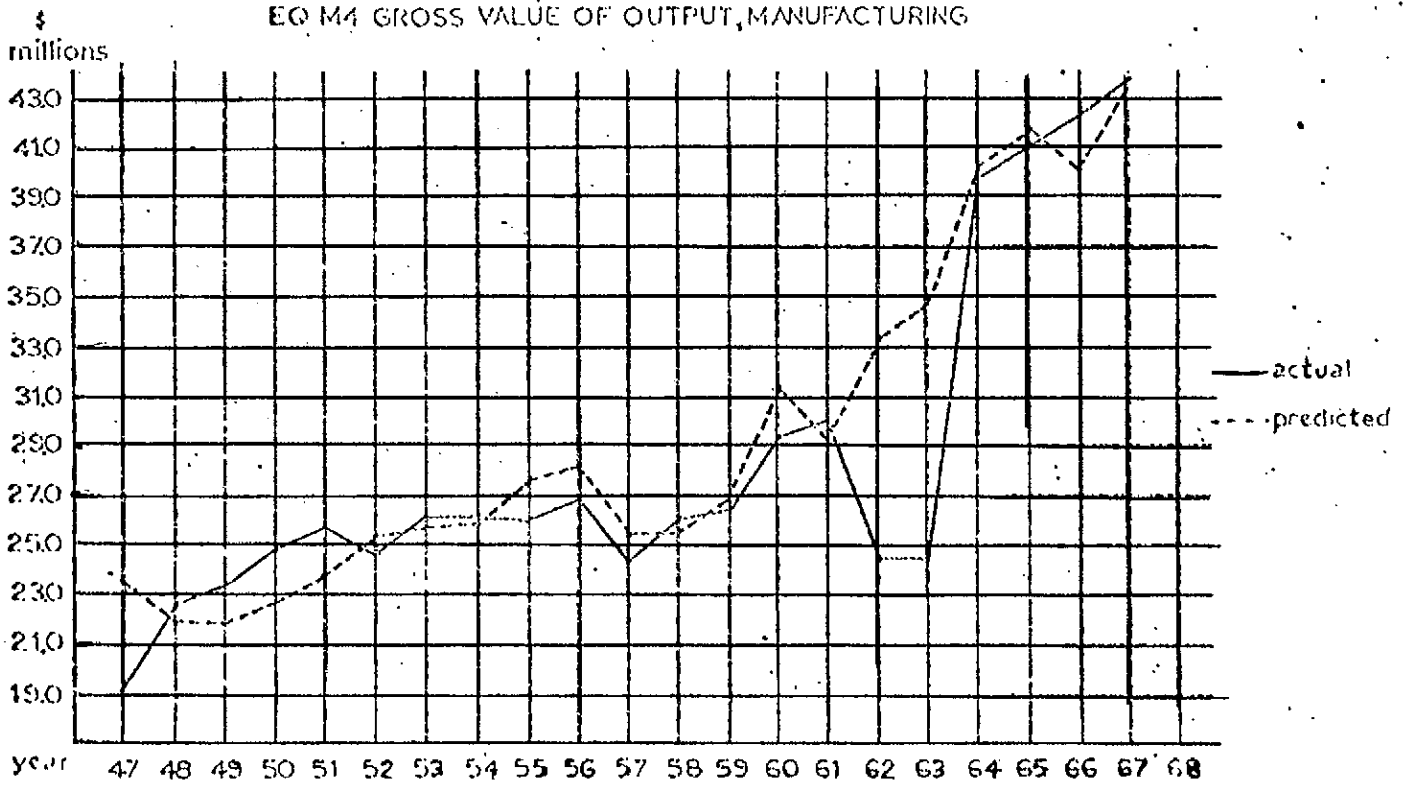

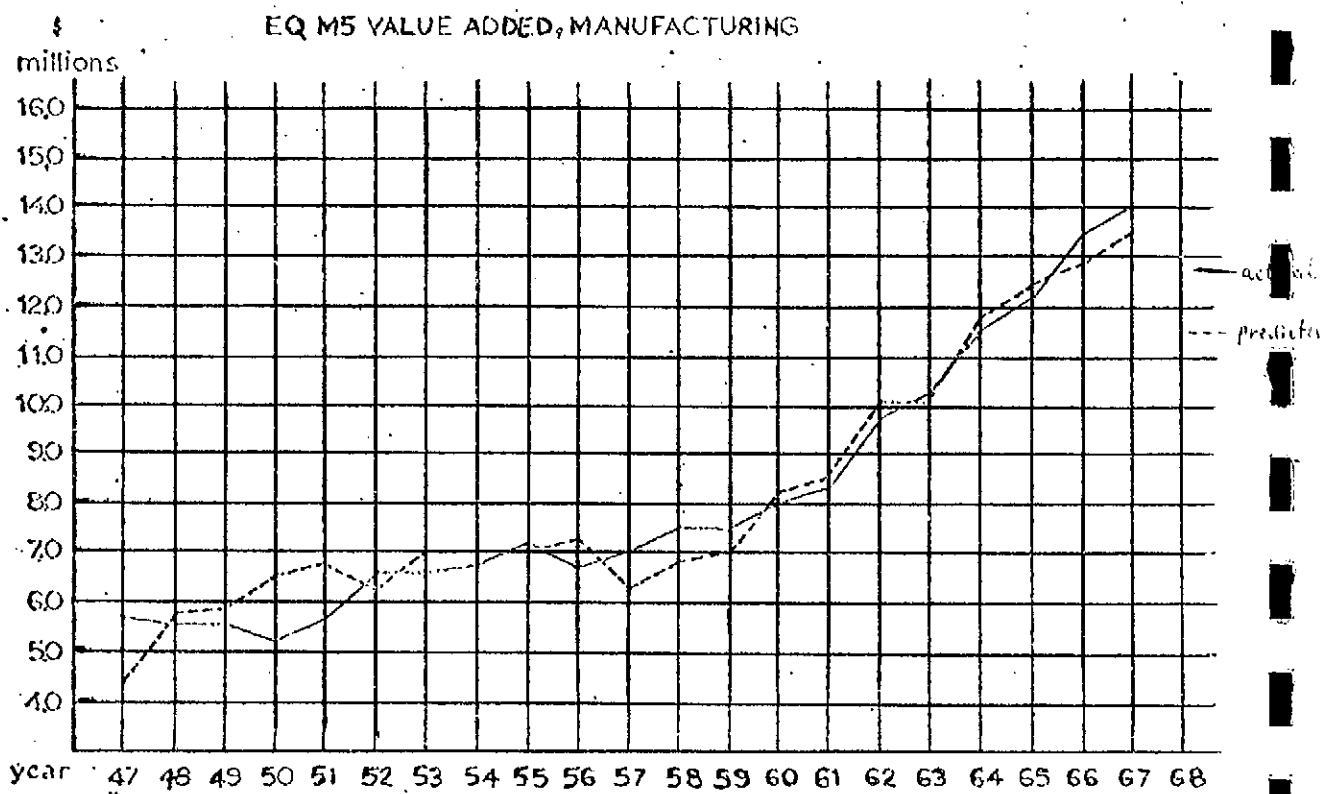
EQ M3 EMPLOYMENT, MANUFACTURING



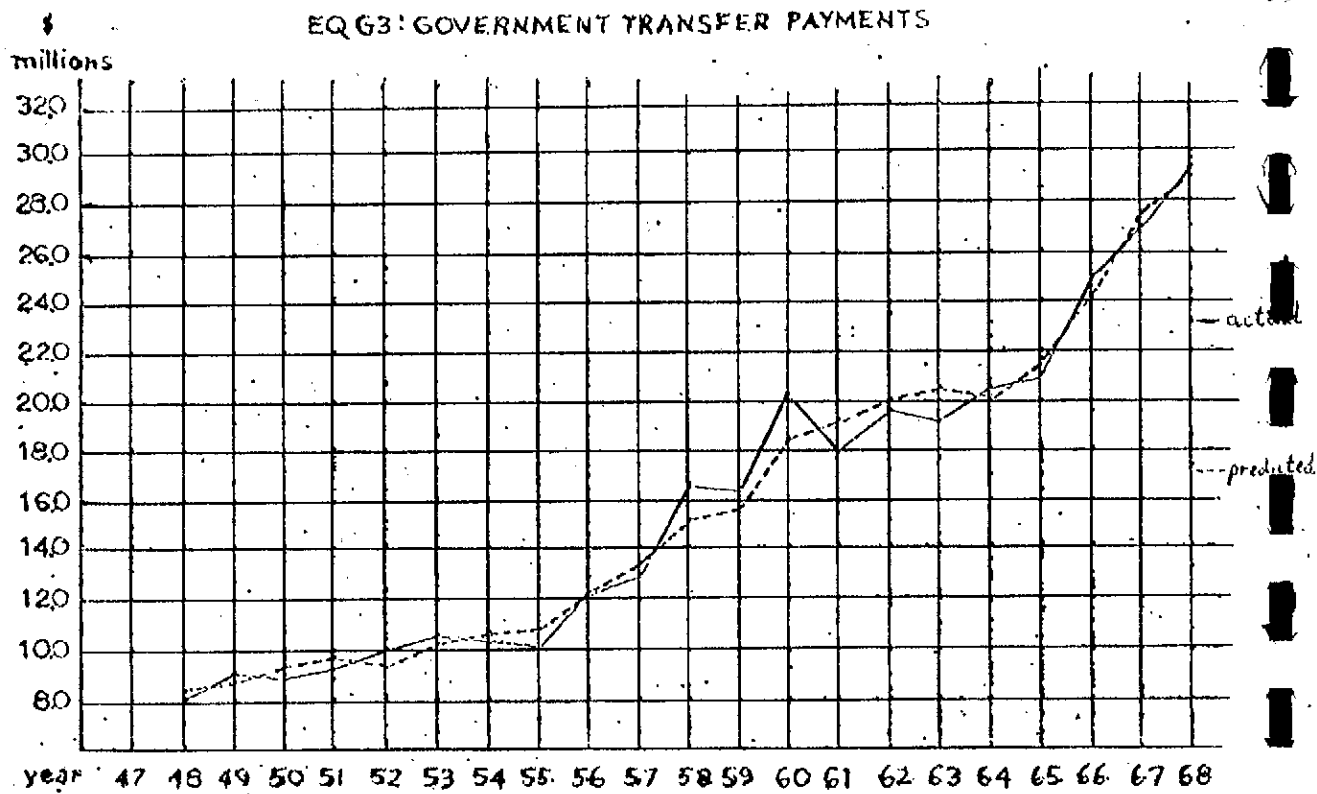
EQ M4 GROSS VALUE OF OUTPUT, MANUFACTURING



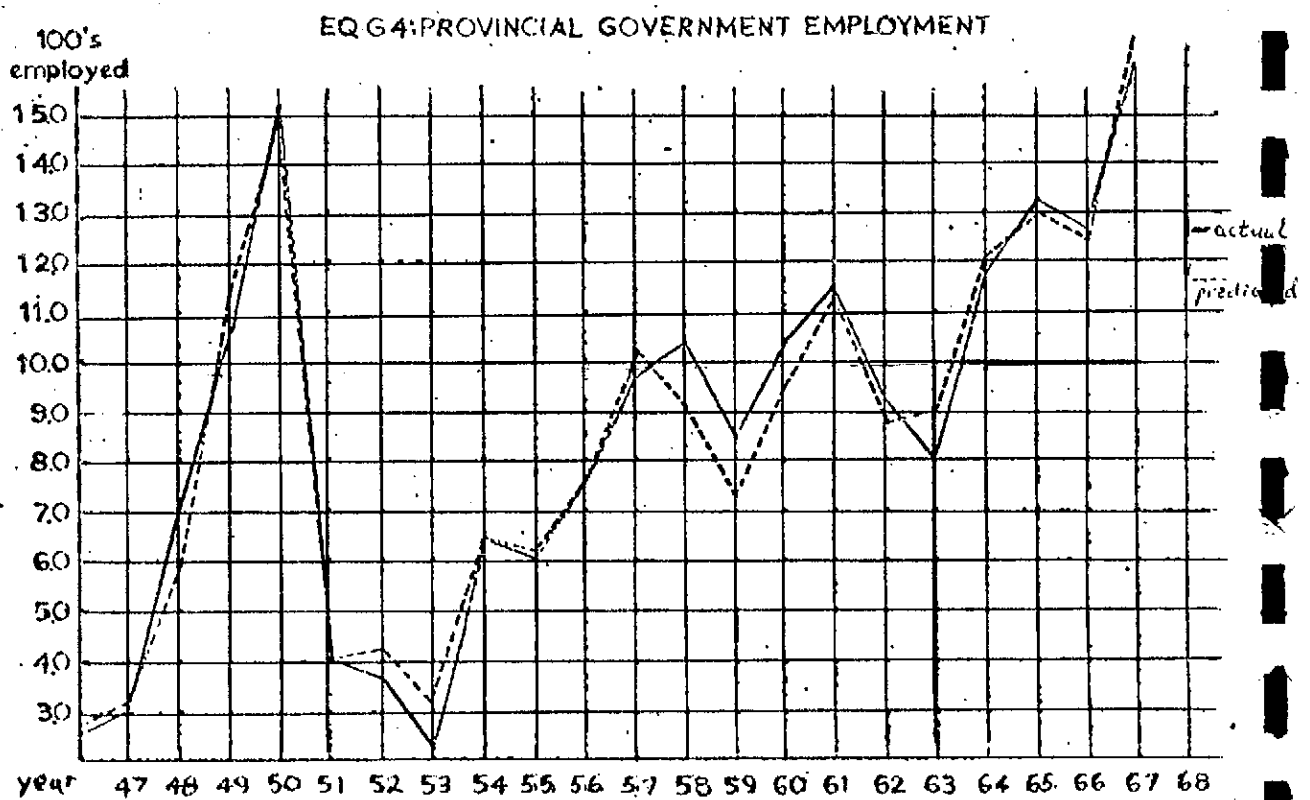

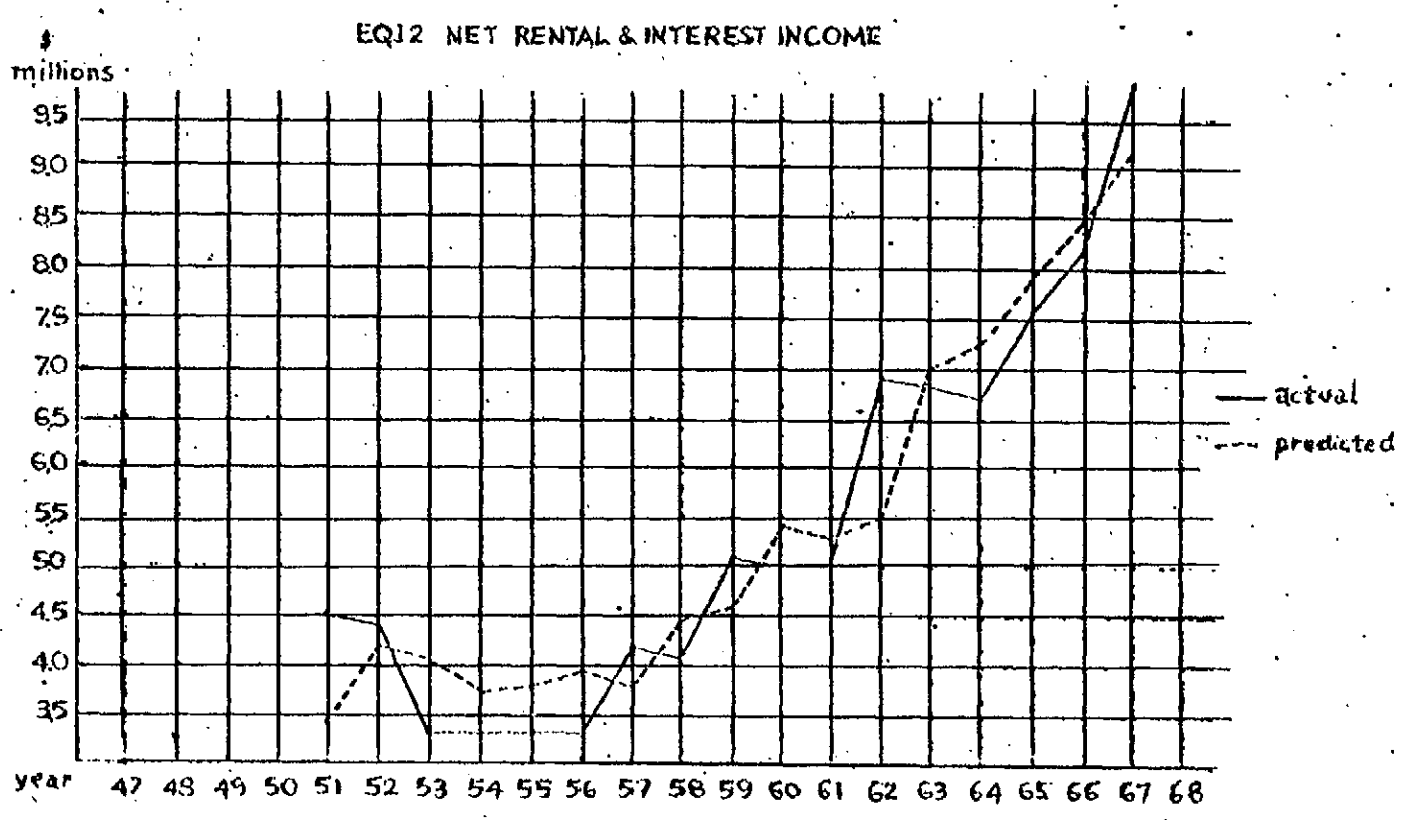

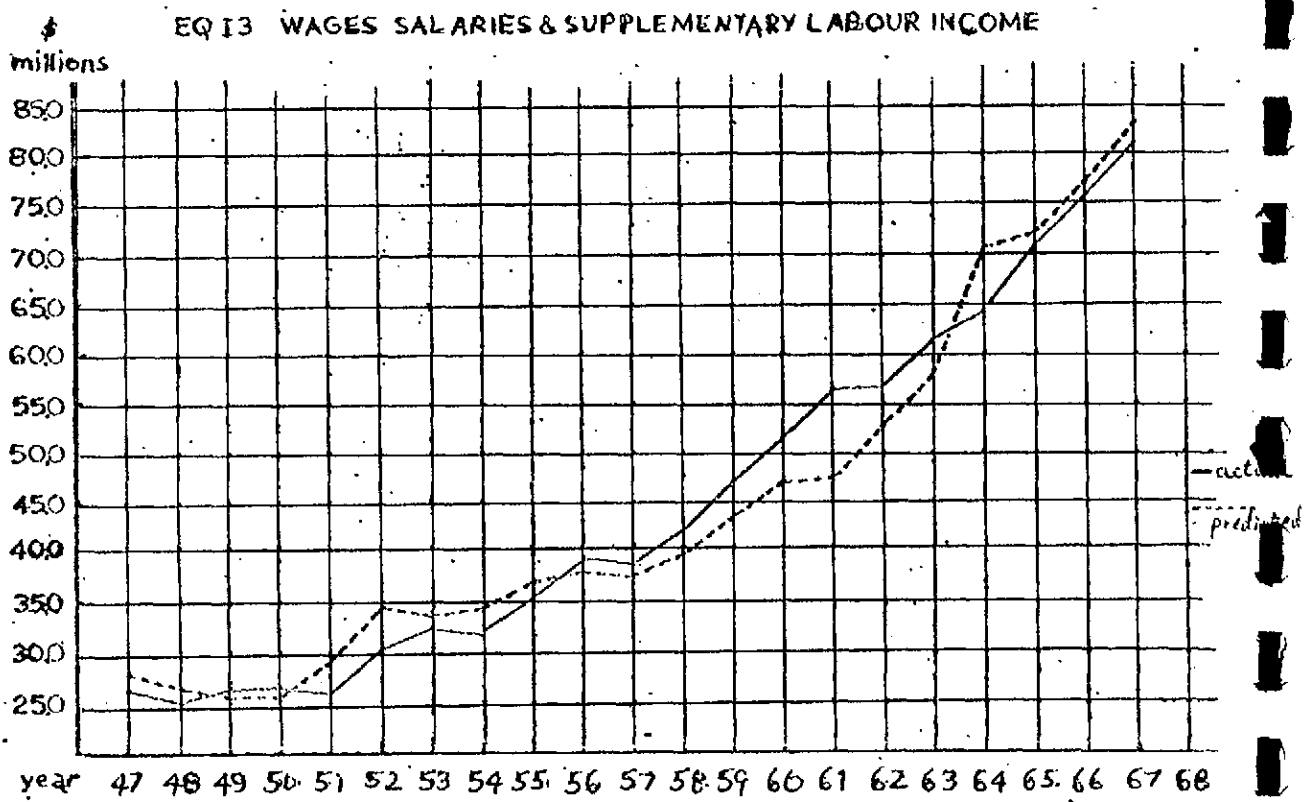

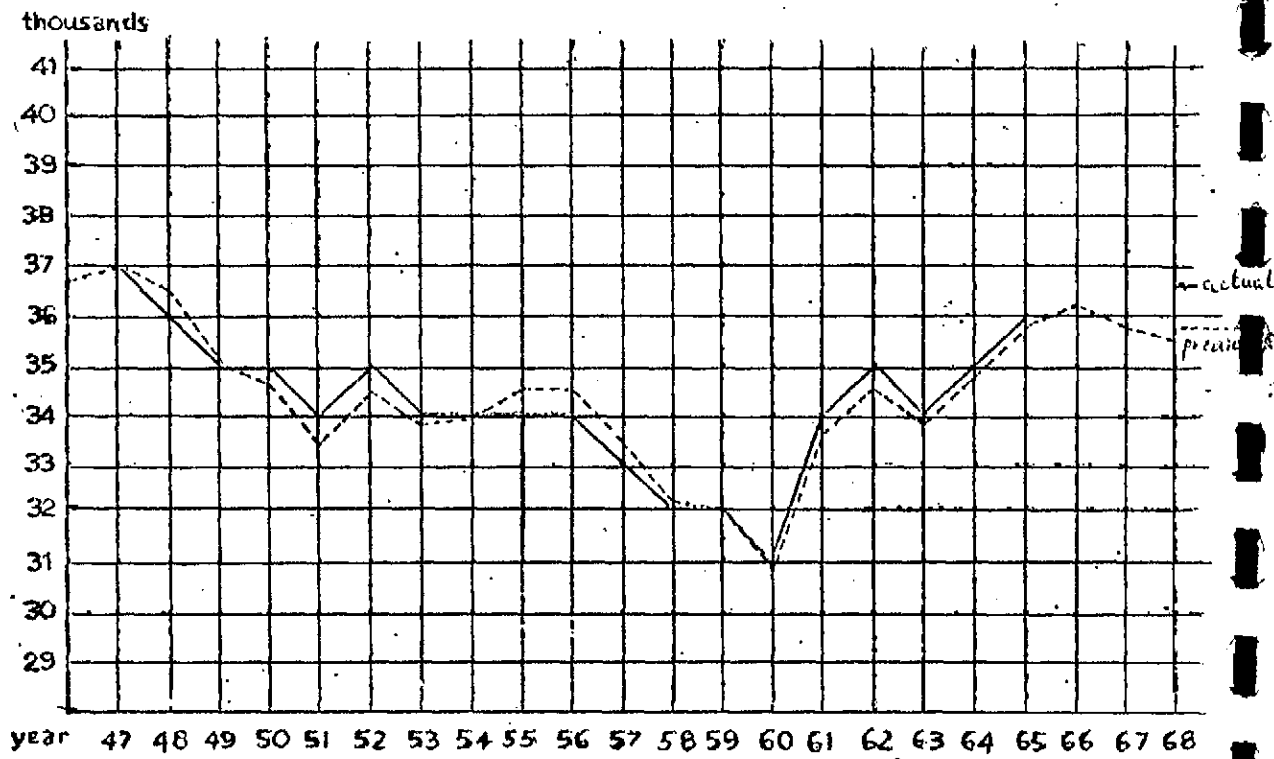

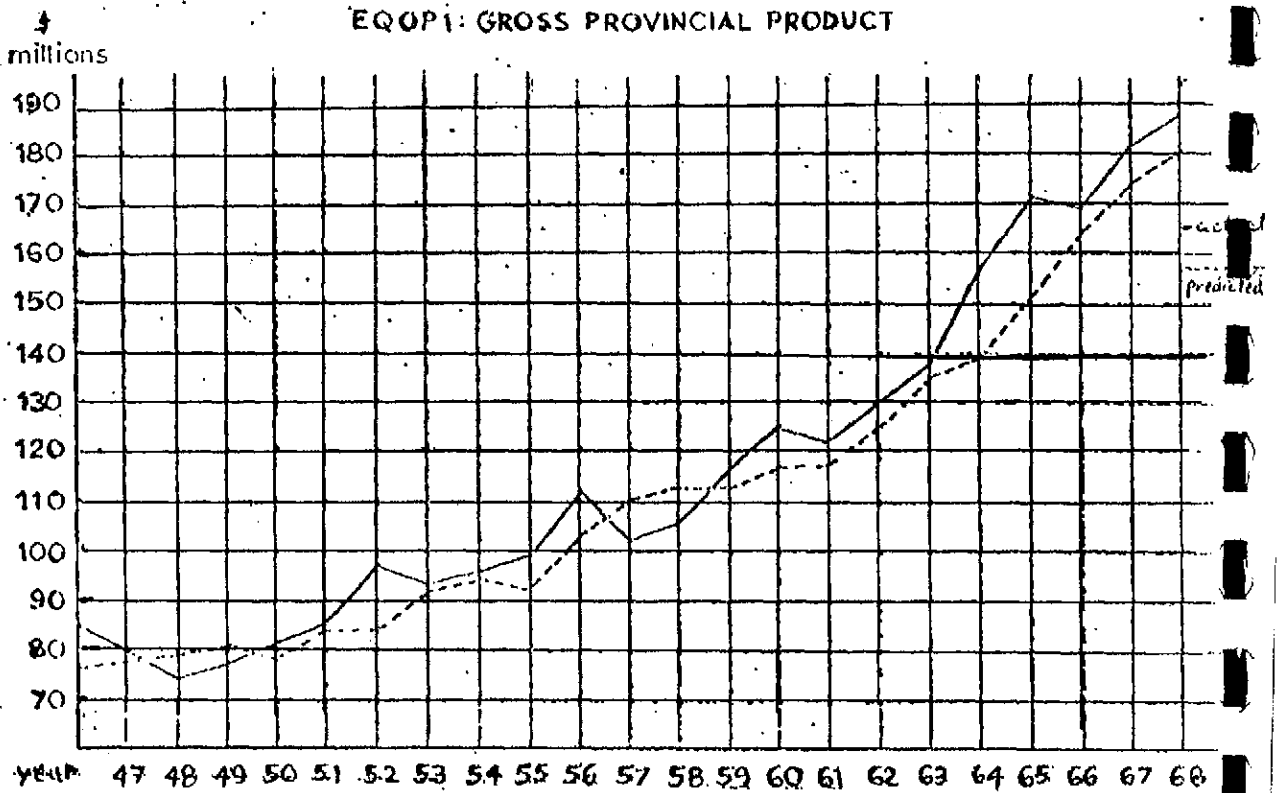

EQPOP1: LABOUR FORCE

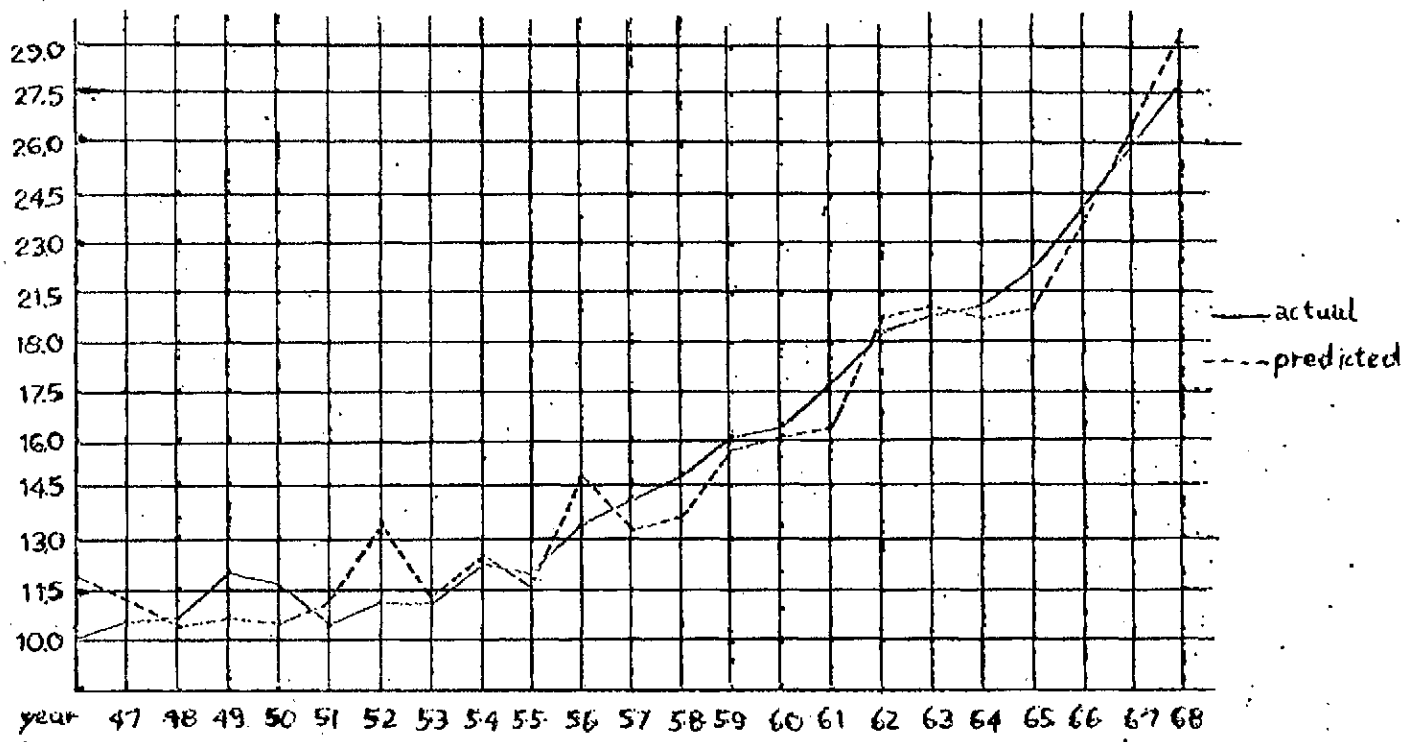


EQPOP1: GROSS PROVINCIAL PRODUCT

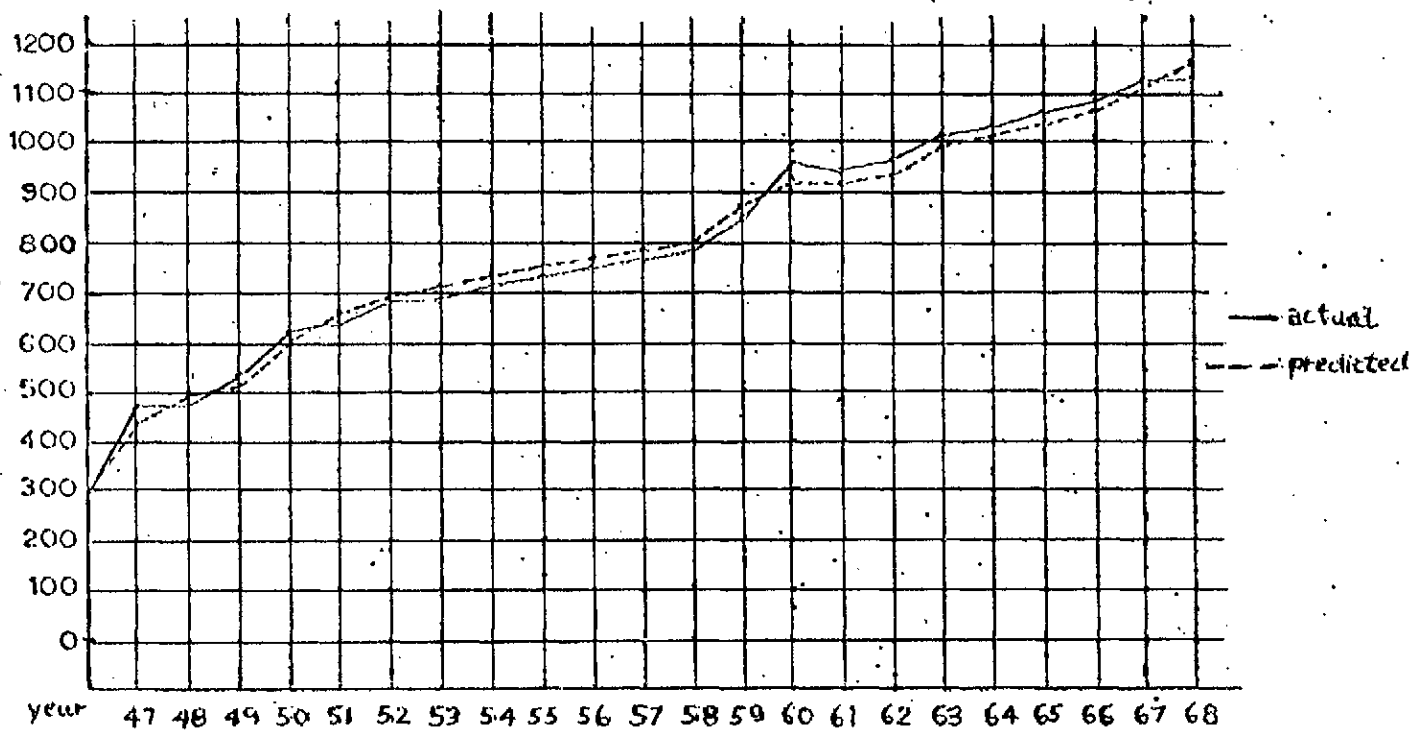

EQ W1 EDUCATION INDEX

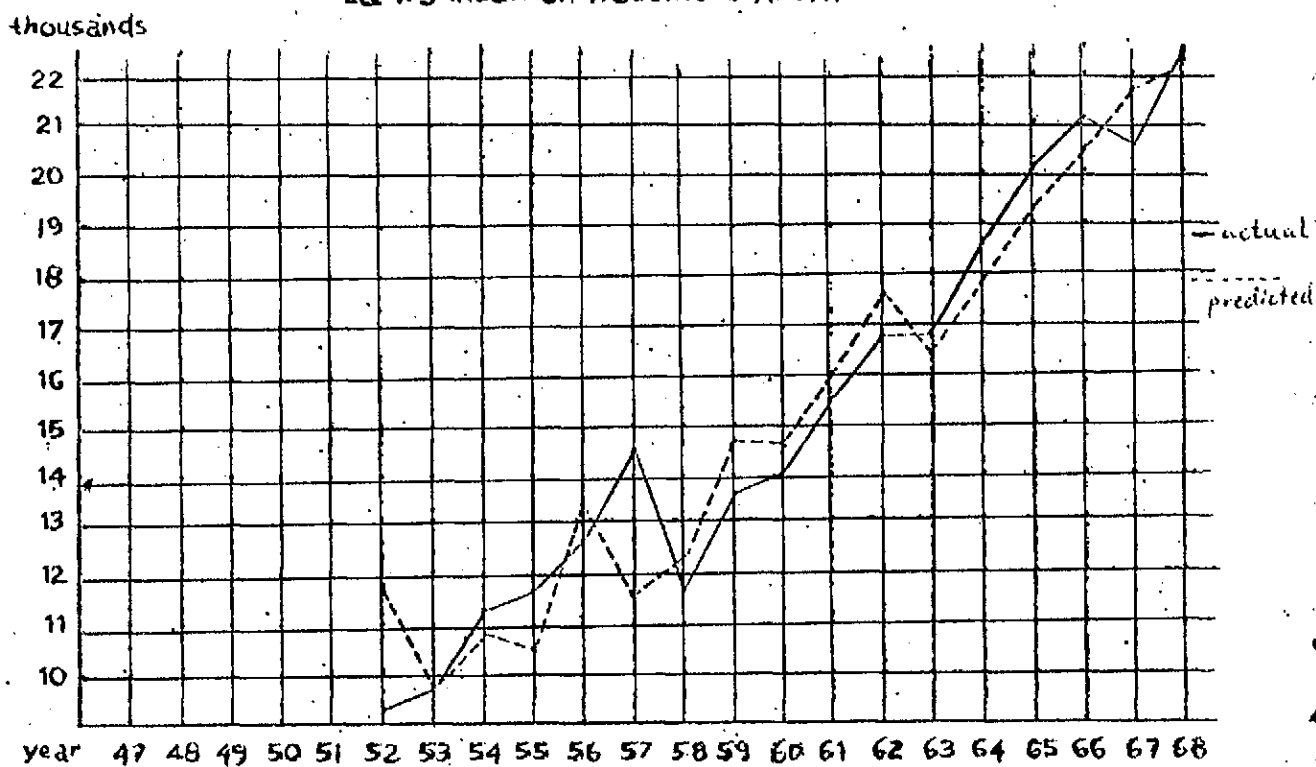


EQ W2 INDEX OF HEALTH SERVICES

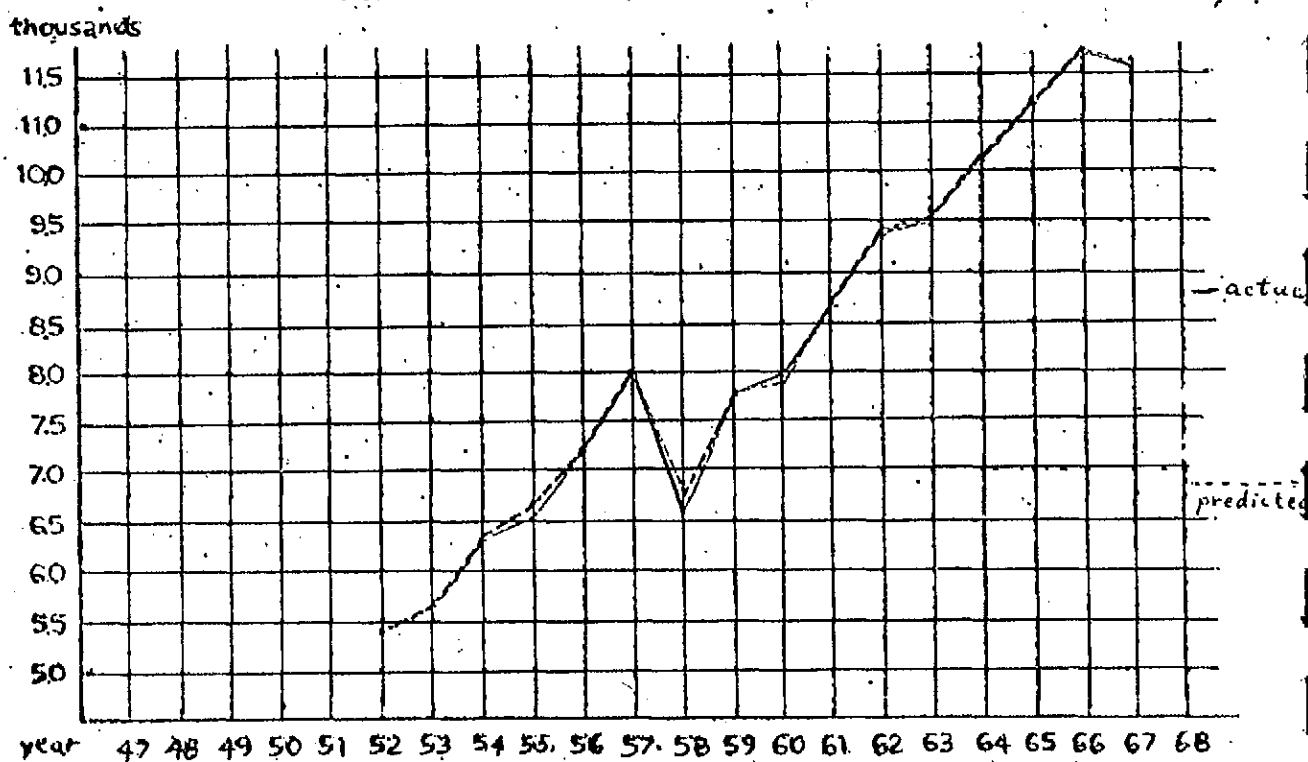

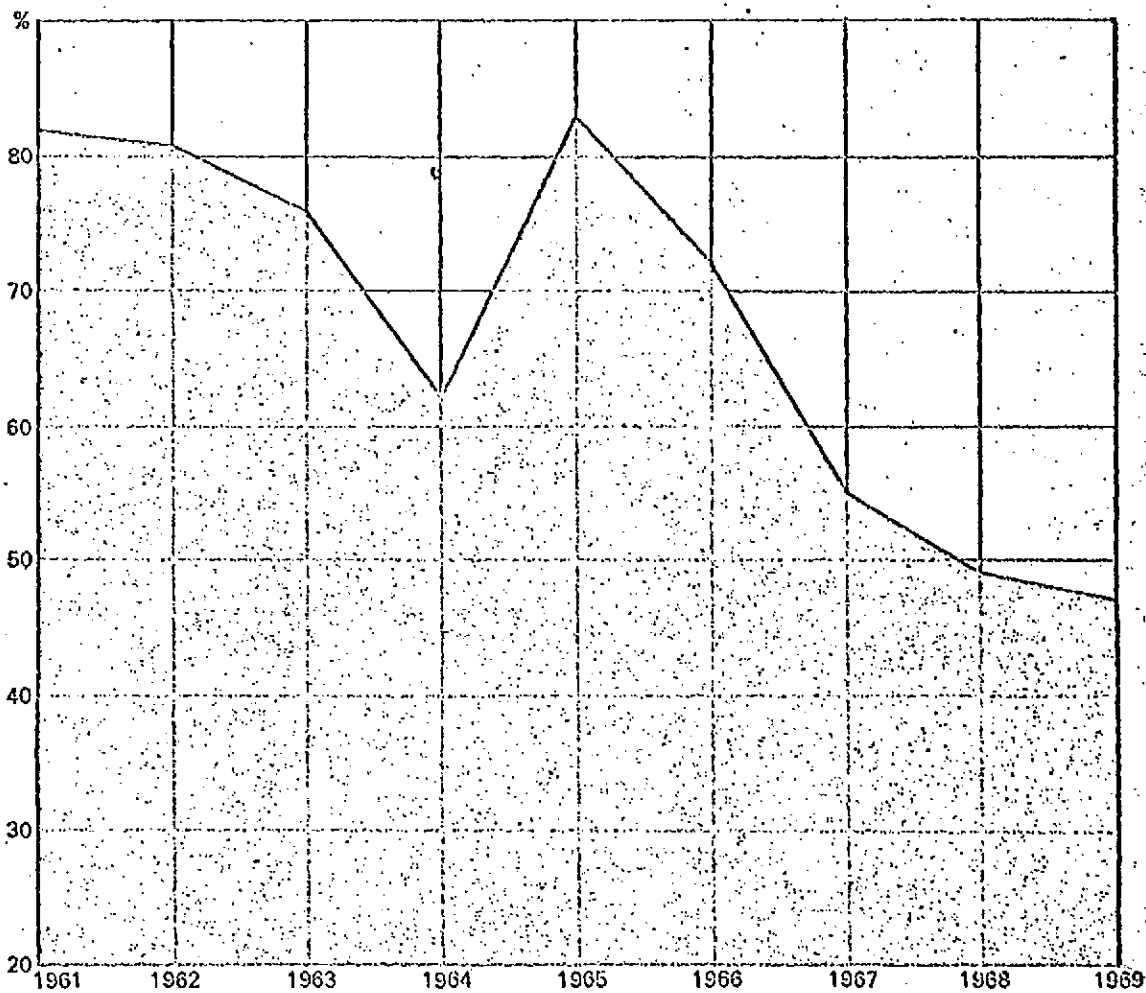

Of major significance to the growth of the economy are the additions being made to the capital stock. Investment, a flow concept, is perhaps the best indicator of the growth and direction of economic activity in the province.

Prince Edward Island's rate of investment has been growing at a much slower rate than for either the Atlantic Provinces or Canada. As a percent of Canada's investment per capita, it has decreased from 83% in 1961 to 47% in 1969. Table 17 shows the breakdown of investment for the period 1961-69 with the percentage increases in current dollars.
