INTRODUCTION

This annotated listing of selected reports and surveys concerning Highly Qualified Manpower (HQM) should provide officers of the Ministry with a ready access to investigations in this field undertaken during the last five years. The compilation represents the results of the work (project 220-88) carried out in succession by Dr. V. Sonnenfeld, Mr. C. Lakaski, and Miss B. Cardillo during the summers of 1972 and 1973. The listed material is available in the Ministry's Library.

PROCEDURE.

A mailing list of all departments or agencies concerned with HQM was drawn from the McGraw Hill Directory and Almanac of Canada, 1971.

During the last two weeks in June and the first two weeks in July, 1972, letters were sent to approximately 232 addresses which included government departments, professional associations and societies, and educational institutions. These agencies were asked to forward to the Ministry the results of HQM surveys or reports carried out by their staff within the last five years. In addition, personal appointments were made with agencies that were located in the Ottawa area. These meetings were used to gather information directly and clarify the purpose of the compendium.

The material that was received was coded by type of manpower concerned, according to the Canadian Classification and Dictionary of Occupations (CCDO). Studies that could not be coded using the CCDO classifications were grouped into three residual categories; Government, University, and Community College Related Studies.

RESULTS

Of the material which was gathered and could be coded using the CCDO, 33 publications were classified under major occupational group 21 (Natural Sciences, Engineering and Mathematics), 3 under major occupational group 23 (Social Sciences and Related Fields), 2 under major occupational group 27 (Teaching and Related Occupations), and 28 under major occupational group 31 (Occupations in Medicine and Health).

Tabulation of these studies are shown in Section I of this report and are classified under the following headings: group or association which conducted or sponsored the study, CCDO number, title of report or survey; period covered (where applicable), frequency (where applicable), number of respondents (where applicable), and a brief description of contents.

Forty (40) studies were grouped under the heading of University Related Studies. These reports or surveys are outlined in Section II and are classified under the following headings: the group or association which conducted or sponsored the report, title, period covered (where applicable), frequency (where applicable), number of respondents (where applicable), and a brief description of contents.

With respect to the Community College Related Studies, twenty-three (23) reports were received. In Section III these surveys or studies are grouped under the following headings: group or association which conducted or sponsored the report, title, period covered (where applicable), frequency (where applicable), number of respondents (where applicable), and a brief description of contents.

Twelve (12) reports were classified as <u>Government Related Studies</u>. Section IV outlines these studies under the following headings: government department or agency which conducted or sponsored the report, title, period covered (where applicable), frequency (where applicable), number of respondents (where applicable), and a brief description of contents.
