# Changes to the registration of captan pesticides



Captan is a fungicide used on field, greenhouse and orchard crops, greenhouse and outdoor ornamentals, and turf (golf courses and sod farms). Highlights of the re-evaluation decision of the active ingredient **captan**, published on May 10, 2018, are summarized below.

## **Cancelled products**

## As of March 31, 2019

Stop using domestic-class products.

The sale of these products is prohibited as of March 31, 2018.

## As of May 10, 2021

**Stop using** products in the form of wettable powder or wettable granules:

• From now on, these formulations must be offered in water-soluble packaging.

## Label changes for captan pesticides, as of May 10, 2020

## **Cancelled uses**

#### Stop the following uses:

- Ornamental stem dip
- Application on greenhouse cut flowers
- Flower bulbs dip by hand
- Application to tobacco seedlings

## Other risk reduction measures

- Maximum spray volume of 150 L/ha on rhubarb in forcing sheds
- Reduction of maximum application rates on fruit trees, grapes and strawberries
- Limit of three applications per season on grapes

- On-farm dry treatment (hand mixing) of bean seeds
- Seed treatment for small-grain vegetables: broccoli, cabbage, Brussels sprouts, cauliflower and sugar beet
- Closed transfer systems (mixing, loading, calibration) and treatment equipment required when treating seeds in commercial facilities, including mobile units





## Other risk reduction measures (cont'd)

- Closed cab equipped with a filter preventing contact between the occupant and pesticides required for boom spray applications, except for seed treatment, when handling daily:
  - ✓ More than 42 kg of liquid formulated products
  - More than 57 kg of active ingredient in the form of wettable powder or watersoluble sachets (wettable granules).

- Updated buffer zones
- Updated personal protective equipment (PPE) requirements
- Updated restricted-entry intervals (REI)

Users must follow the instructions on the updated labels.

Using a pesticide contrary to the label directions is a violation of the *Pest Control Products Act.* 

## Read the label

All pesticides registered in Canada have a Health Canada-approved label with a registration number. Read the pesticide label carefully, as it contains specific information on how to use it. To find the most up-to-date label, use our online <u>label search tool</u>, or search for "Health Canada pesticide labels" using your favourite search engine.
