



Minister's message



On behalf of the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA), I am pleased to present the report on fees for 2023 to 2024.

Service fees support the important activities of the CFIA including delivering on its mandate to safeguard food, animals, and plants.

In 2023 to 2024, the CFIA delivered critical services and inspections to help prevent food safety risks and the introduction and spread of invasive species, plant pests and animal diseases. These activities helped to protect consumers and support market access opportunities in Canada and abroad. The CFIA also continued its important work to oversee food recalls and collaborate with partners on the ongoing highly pathogenic avian influenza outbreak.

This annual report provides details on each fee, such as the type of fee and rate of adjustment across all business lines. The CFIA continues to review its service fees and areas for continuous improvement as part of its responsibilities under the reporting regime of the *Service Fees Act*.

The CFIA is committed to serving Canadians and stakeholders with open and transparent fees management.

About this report

This report, which is tabled under section 20 of the [Service Fees Act](#), the [Low-Materiality Fees Regulations](#), and subsection 4.2.9 of the Treasury Board [Directive on Charging and Special Financial Authorities](#), contains information about the fees the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA or the Agency) had the authority to set in fiscal year 2023–24, including any that were collected by the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA).

The report covers fees that are subject to the [Service Fees Act](#) and exempted from the [Service Fees Act](#).

For reporting purposes, fees are categorized by fee-setting mechanism. There are three mechanisms:

1. Act, regulation or fees notice

The authority to set these fees is delegated to a department, minister, or Governor in Council pursuant to an act of Parliament.

2. Contract

Ministers have the inherent authority to enter into contracts, which are usually negotiated between the minister and an individual or organization, and which cover fees and other terms and conditions. In some cases, that authority may also be provided by an act of Parliament.

3. Market rate or auction

The authority to set these fees is pursuant to an act of Parliament or a regulation, and the minister, department, or Governor in Council has no control over the fee amount.

For fees set by act, regulation, or fees notice, the report provides totals for fee groupings as well as detailed information for each fee. For fees set by contract, the report provides totals only. The CFIA did not have fees set by market rate or auction.

Fees charged by the CFIA under the [Access to Information Act](#) are not subject to the [Service Fees Act](#) and are not included in this report. Information on the CFIA's access to information fees for 2023 to 2024 can be found in our annual report to Parliament on the administration of the [Access to Information Act: Annual Reports on the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act](#).

Remissions

In 2023 to 2024, the CFIA was subject to the requirements to issue remissions under section 7 of the [Service Fees Act](#) and subsection 4.2.4 of the Treasury Board [Directive on Charging and Special Financial Authorities](#) to remit a fee, in whole or in part, to a fee payer when a service standard was not met. The Agency is committed to modernizing its service fees and aligning to service standards, including the development of a remission policy and procedures for when service standards are not met, to be consistent with the [Service Fees Act](#).

In 2023 to 2024, the CFIA also issued remissions under its enabling legislation^{Footnote 1}. These remissions have been for reasons other than not meeting a service standard. Part 1 – Dairy Products Fees

Fee

Item 1 – Licence – For the issuance of a licence under section 20 of the Act or the renewal of a licence under section 22 of the Act – per licence, valid for 2 years

Item 2 – Inspection of establishments identified in a licence

(1) For the inspection under section 24 of the Act of an establishment in which a licence holder conducts the activities identified in a licence:

(a) in the case of an establishment that receives not more than 100,000 hectolitres of milk per year for processing or produces not more than 1,000,000 units [kilograms (net weight) or litres, or both] of dairy products per year

(c) in the case of an establishment that receives more than 500,000 hectolitres but not more than 1,000,000 hectolitres of milk per year for processing or produces more than 5,000,000 but not more than 10,000,000 units [kilograms (net weight) or litres, or both] of dairy products per year

- per year per establishment if the establishment is inspected in the year

(d) in the case of an establishment that receives more than 1,000,000 hectolitres of milk per year for processing or produces more than 10,000,000 units [kilograms (net weight) or litres, or both] of dairy products per year

- per year per establishment if the establishment is inspected in the year

Item 2 (2) – For the inspection of an establishment identified in a licence where the establishment operates for less than 24 months

- 1/12 of the applicable annual fee set out in subitem (1) multiplied by the number of complete months included in the period, for the inspection of an establishment

Item 2 (3) – An establishment that is subject to two fees under subitem 2(1) of the table [Footnote 16](#) of this part shall pay only the greater of the two fees

Item 3 – Export

(1) For services provided in respect of a dairy product for which a grade or standard is referred to in the Regulations, for the purpose of issuing a certificate or other document referred to in section 48 of the Act:

(a) for the grading of each vat or churn of dairy product

(b) for the issuance of each grade certificate, including a certificate for a dairy product that has been analysed by an accredited laboratory

(c) for the inspection of a dairy product before export

(d) for the issuance of each export certificate or other document referred to in section 48 of the Act, other than a grade certificate

(2) For services provided in respect of any other dairy product for the purpose of issuing a certificate or any other document referred to in section 48 of the Act:

(a) for the inspection of a dairy product before export

(b) for the issuance of each export certificate or other document referred to in section 48 of the Act

Item 4 – Purposes other than export

Subject to item 5, for services provided in respect of a dairy product, other than for the purpose of export:

(a) for the inspection under section 24 of the Act of a dairy product

- per quarter hour, with the time being rounded off to the nearest quarter hour

Subject to item 5, for services provided in respect of a dairy product, other than for the purpose of export:

(a) for the inspection under section 24 of the Act of a dairy product

- subject to a minimum fee

(b) for the grading in accordance with a grade or standard under the Regulations of each vat or churn of dairy product

(c) for the issuance of each grade certificate in accordance with a grade or standard under the Regulations, including a certificate issued for a dairy product that has been analysed by an accredited laboratory
