SECTION I

SCOPE OF ANALYSIS

This report is based on an analysis of radio paging equipment as listed in Section III during the three month period March, April and May 1980. These products are normally included in the following Statistics Canada Import Class 634-99-89 "Telecommunications equipment, n.e.s."

CANADIAN PRODUCTION

Statistics Canada does not provide separate data on Canadian production or shipments of radio paging equipment

SECTION III

ANALYSIS OF IMPORTS

Imports of radio paging equipment during the period March, April and May 1980 amounted to \$700,173. The analysis indicates that shipments originating from U.S.A. accounted for \$456,758 or 65 per cent of the total value. United Kingdom, Japan and the Netherlands accounted for the remaining \$243,415 or 35 per cent of the total value.

The primary area of entry into Canada was Ontario with the remaining imports entering into Western Canada and Quebec.
