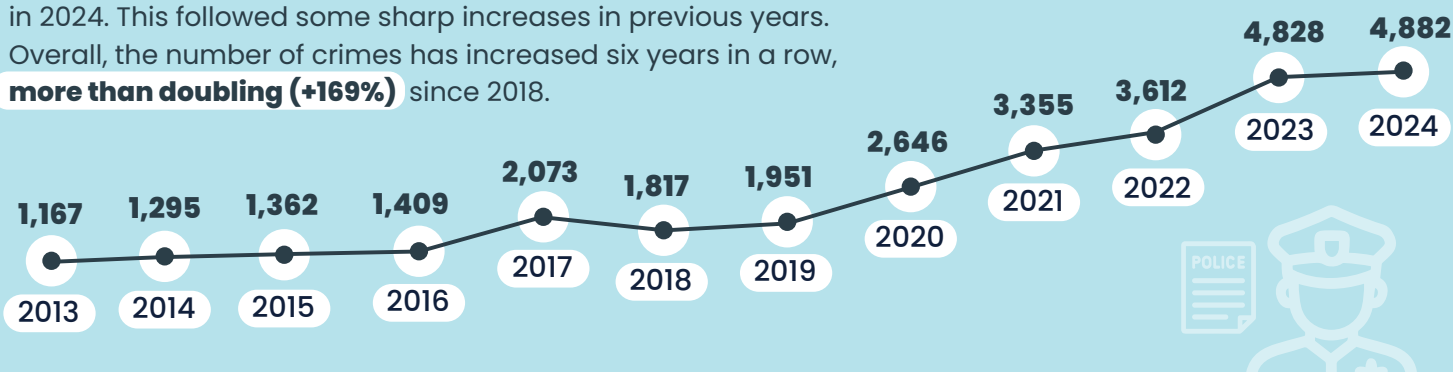


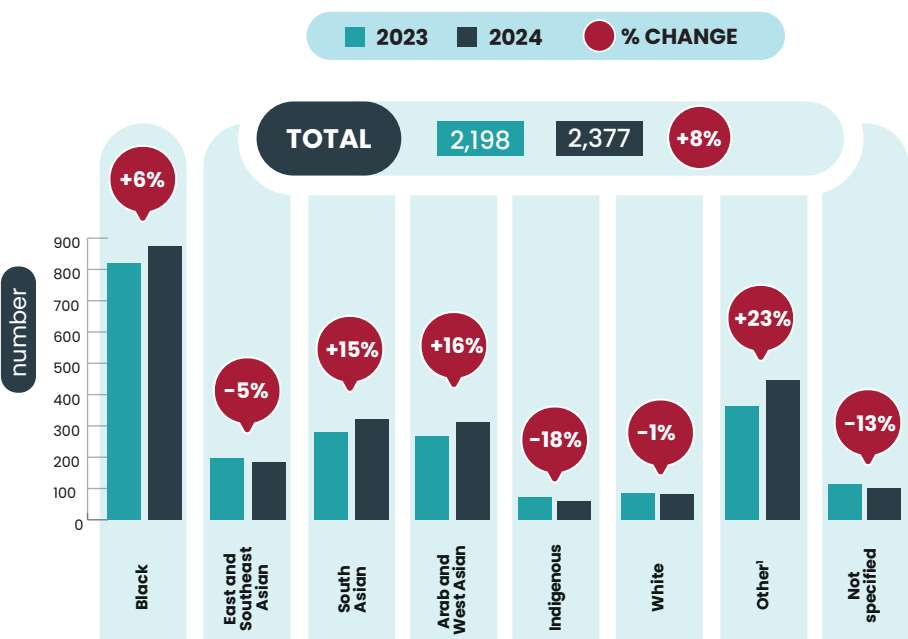


POLICE-REPORTED HATE CRIME IN CANADA, 2024

The number of police-reported hate crimes **posted a slight increase of 1%** in 2024. This followed some sharp increases in previous years. Overall, the number of crimes has increased six years in a row, **more than doubling (+169%)** since 2018.

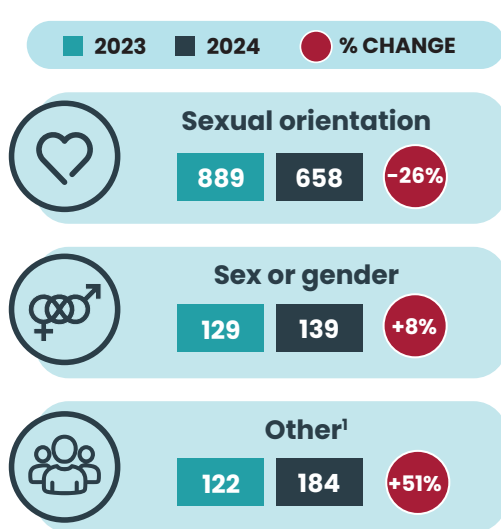


Police-reported hate crimes motivated by **race or ethnicity increased 8% in 2024**, rising for the sixth year in a row.



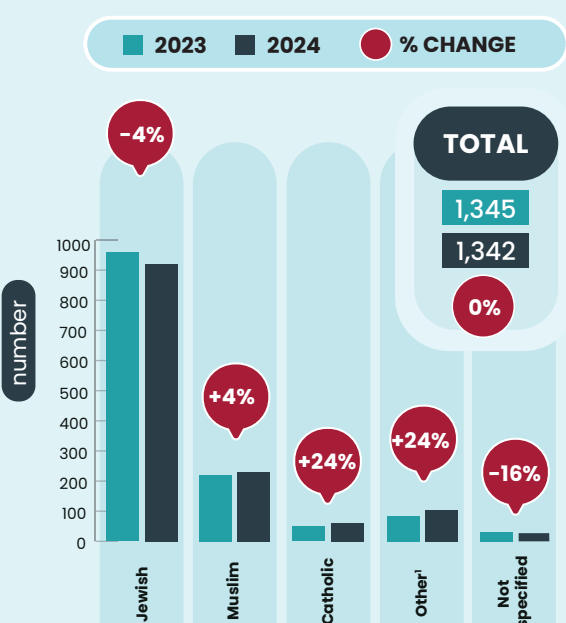
¹ Motivations based on race or ethnicity not otherwise stated and those that target more than one group.

Hate crimes motivated by **sexual orientation declined 26% in 2024**, following three consecutive increases.



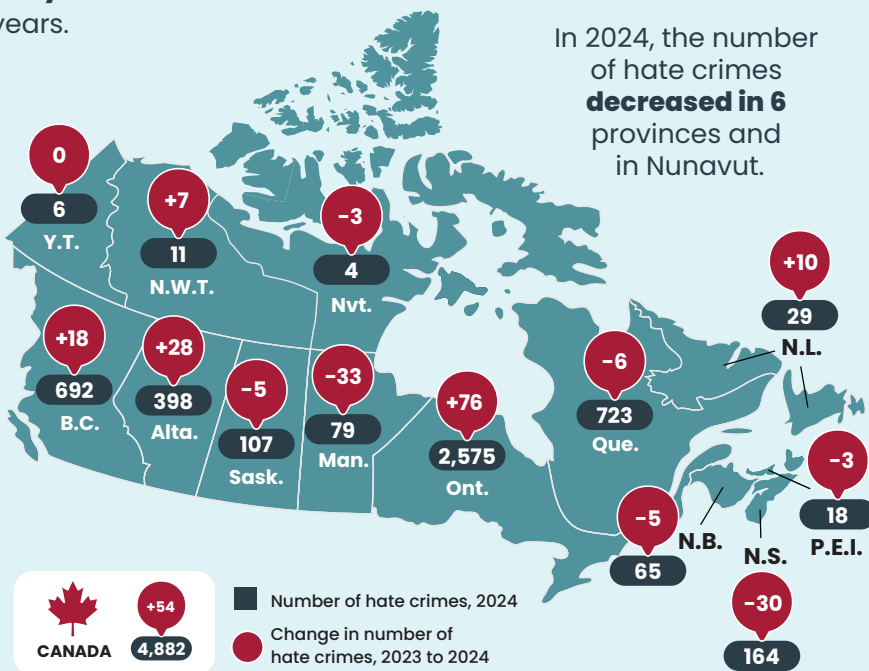
¹ Includes mental or physical disabilities, language, age and other similar factors.

Hate crimes motivated by **religion were essentially stable in 2024**, following two sharp increases in three years.

In 2024, the number of hate crimes **decreased in 6** provinces and in Nunavut.

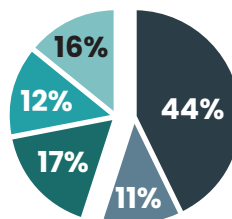


The **majority** of police-reported hate crimes remained **non-violent** in 2024.

Non-violent hate crimes rose 3%, while violent hate crimes were down 1%.

Notes: Hate crime counts include both confirmed and suspected hate crime incidents. The information in this infographic reflects data reported by police services covering over 99% of Canada's population. Under the authority of the Canadian Forces Provost Marshal (CFPM), the Canadian Forces Military Police Group began reporting incidents to the Uniform Crime Reporting Survey. Data from the Office of the CFPM are aggregated at the national level to account for small counts and to protect confidentiality. Therefore, provincial and territorial totals will not equal national totals.
