OCTOBER, 1941.

Passenger traffic by air during October amounted to 17,288 revenue passengers carried and 1,720 non revenue passengers as against 18,612 revenue and 2,326 non revenue passengers carried in September.

Revenue freight carried increased from 1,365,784 lbs. in September to 2,547,037 lbs. which was by far the greatest quantity carried in any month this year. Mail also increased from 272,063 lbs. in September to 310,633 lbs.

Total time flown in all classes of service declined from 9,955 aircraft hours in September to 9,369 aircraft hours.

Revenues of licensed Canadian carriers increased from \$807,922 in September to \$855,703 and operating expenses from \$738,359 to \$772,024.

Gasoline consumed increased from 391,093 gallons in September to 405,252 gallons and the number of employees increased from 1,736 to 1,797.
